Learn how you could have your new house built by Herkimer BOCES students

HERKIMER — You could have a new home built for you by local high-school students if you win a lottery from the Herkimer-Fulton-Hamilton-Otsego BOCES building construction program.

Every year since 1982, students in the Herkimer BOCES Building Construction program put together a house that is delivered to residents to live in. The homeowner pays the cost of materials and transportation of the house, but the labor is provided for free by highschool juniors and seniors under the supervision of Building Construction instructor John Martin.

If you're interested in receiving the house, attend an informational meeting at 6 p.m. on Tuesday, May 8, in the Building Construction classroom at the Herkimer BOCES William E. Busacker Complex, 352 Gros Blvd. in Herkimer.

At the meeting, information discussed will include procedures, house styles, the purchasing of materials, the construction date, criteria for applying, moving the house and other owners' responsibilities.

A lottery drawing will be scheduled for a couple of weeks after the meeting to determine who is selected as the recipient of the 37th house built by the program. If multiple people apply and attend the lottery, runners-up can be selected for subsequent years.

The house, which will be on about 1,500-square-foot, one-story ranch, could be delivered to many locations in and surrounding the Herkimer BOCES region. Previous houses have gone as far from Herkimer BOCES as the Thousand Islands, Lake George and south of Cooperstown.

The house will be constructed during the 2018-2019 school year — starting in September 2018 with completion by June 2019

After a client is selected, meetings will be scheduled with the future homeowner to discuss the floor plan and the basic design of the house. The design must meet approval of the Building Construction program curriculum. It must be a

single story and can have up to three bedrooms and two bathrooms. The dimensions are 26.5 feet by 58 feet.











Those old horse pistols

Occasionally fragments of uniforms still existed in local families however most had surrendered to moths. Note the cost of the "Regimental Suit" on





Drowsy driving

Almost everyone is aware of the dangers of drinking and driving. However, not everybody may be aware that driving while drowsy can be equally dangerous. Fortunately, by taking the proper steps, drowsy driving can easily be avoided.

Drowsy driving is classified as either falling asleep when driving or not paying attention to the road or traffic around you. Diane Ward of Herkimer County Public Health warns that drowsy driving can result from lack of sleep or severe fatigue. It can be just as dangerous as driving drunk, because falling asleep even for a few seconds can result in serious injury or death to you or someone else.

Although drowsy driving can lead to serious injuries or even death, there are ways to avoid it completely. Ms. Ward recommends either pulling over or taking a brief nap, or, if possible, switching to another licensed driver if you start experiencing signs of sleepiness. The warning signs of drowsy driving include, but are not limited to, inability to stop yawning, difficulty keeping your eyes open, inability to recall the last few miles driven, and daydreaming or disconnected thinking. Other signs can include sloppy driving, such as weaving between lanes, missing traffic signs or driving on the rumble strips on the shoulder of the road.

Many of us can become fatigued as the workday progresses. Those who fall into this category should consider other alternatives before attempting to drive home while fatigued. Carpool with someone who lives in your neighborhood, if possible. Or, use public transportation, if available. If these options are not viable, call a family member to pick you up. If you must

drive, take a short nap before starting out.

"Shift workers are at high risk for drowsy driving because they typically get less sleep and keep longer hours than traditional workers," Ms. Ward said. Also, our bodies are governed by internal clocks, making it harder for people who work at night to sleep during the day.

It is a common misperception that turning up the radio, singing, eating or opening up the window will prevent you from falling asleep behind the wheel. However, the reality is that none of these activities will keep you awake when driving.

"If you must drive while fatigued, try following up a cup of coffee or two with a short nap," Ms. Ward said. "Sleeping will allow the caffeine to take effect, making you more alert for your trip home. However, if you consume caffeine regularly, this strategy may not work out for you," she said.

Becoming a new parent can significantly increase the likelihood of drowsy driving. Getting enough sleep can often seem impossible when bringing a newborn home. However, not getting the rest you need can put you, your baby and other drivers in harm's way.

"If you consistently have problems falling asleep or staying asleep, you may be suffering from a sleep disorder. You should consult your health care provider if these symptoms continue. Also, talk to your health care provider about the side effects of any medications you are taking," Ms. Ward said.



Pathways Academy students honored for academics, attendance, behavior

ILION — Herkimer-Fulton-Hamilton-Otsego BOCES Pathways Academy at Remington students recently received third-quarter awards as part of a new series of ceremonies to promote positive behavior.

The Pathways Academy Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) team came up with the quarterly award ceremonies to go along with other PBIS methods used throughout the year, said Erica Haver, a Pathways Academy teacher and the PBIS team leader.

"The idea was to recognize students for their academic achievements, attendance and behavior, and we have seen it lead to improvements," Haver said.

Pathways Academy award ceremony for the third quarter took place on Friday, April 20, at the Remington Educational Complex in Ilion. About 30 parents attended to watch as students were called up to the front of the cafeteria to receive their awards.

PBIS activities start off the school year with a week-long orientation activity focused on teamwork and interaction among students, teachers and staff. Students also are awarded "BO-CES bucks" for positive behavior. Every other Friday is either a perk such as pizza or ice cream — or a plaza, which is a store for using "BOCES bucks" to purchase items or experiences such as running a fire drill or throwing pie

There also are larger, quarterly carnival events that students are able to participate in if they behave properly.

The other PBIS team members are Gina Cannistra, Hailee Schultz, Rachel Madison, Adam Spatto, Anthony Wronka, Corrie Clements and Carrie Doxtader.

The award ceremonies are a new part of PBIS this school year, and there have been three of them. There won't be one for the fourth quarter because students' grades won't be finalized until after their last day at Pathways.

Pathways Academy 11th-grader Jenna Perusse, 16, of Poland, received High Honor Roll, attendance and Hard Worker awards at the third-quarter ceremony.

"It feels good," she said.
"I didn't expect to get as many awards as I did. I enjoyed it though."

One thing that helped her receive the awards is that she had a child care unit in Haver's class, and that relates to her career plans of working with and teaching children.

"So I'm really interested in what we're doing," she

Jenna said she thinks the award ceremonies help motivate students.

"I feel like if someone else doesn't get an award, they'll want to do better and maybe get an award next time," she said.



Whatchamacallits



This week's Whatchamacallit is identifiable to those in the scientific community, but less so outside of it. This interesting device is a cork borer.

This item is made out of brass and is stored by nesting one into the other. The sizes of

the borers range from 10 to 14 mm. The only thing missing from this set is the item called the pusher, used to push out the item from inside the borer.

The use of this item was originally to punch holes out corks used in scientific experiments. The borer is hollow and the cy- foods without completely comlindrical end would be sharpened before being pushed through the cork. The pusher would then be placed though the hollow of the handled-end and it would push out the cut

This was, and still is, convenient for scientists. Since the mid-1800's, cork would be used to stop vials of chemicals in biology and chemical experiments. Boring a hold in the corks would allow tubes to be inserted into the vials.

Modern day scientists would use the borers for tree ring analysis, coring into fruits of vegetables, and to perform well diffusion assays.

Kovels: Antiques and Collecting

Many artists don't create just pictures or sculptures. They make furniture, jewelry, dinnerware or even kitchen tools and toys. In the 1920s and '30s. there was a new title for these multi-talented artists: industrial designer. They redesigned existing large machines like trains or trucks, and small household goods telephones like and clocks. The result was better-looking objects that were less expensive to make.

Collectors today may not have space in their homes for the largest industrial machines, but they can find examples of

smaller decorative items by these famous men. A few designers to look for are Russel Wright (dinnerware, furniture, aluminum); Henry Teague (Kodak camera); Henry Dreyfuss (telephone); Lurelle Guild (aluminumware, vacuum cleaner); Viktor Schreckengost (Cowan pottery, pedal cars, dinnerware); and Bjorn Wiinblad (posters, furniture, dinnerware and tapestries).

At a summer Rago auction in Lambertville, NJ, a 1970s Wiinblad table and six matching chairs sold for \$1,875. The black lacquered pieces had a different colorful modern design on each chair back and tabletop. They

are large examples of Wiinblad's talent. But his ashtrays and dishes, decorated with drawings of round-faced people in 19th-century pseudo clothes and often surrounded by vines, floral wreaths and trees, can be found online and in shops for less than \$50.

Q: I found four vintage baseball cards glued to the bottom of a dresser that I bought at an estate sale. The players are "Pete" Appleton, "Line Drive" Nelson, "Hank" Greenberg and "Red" Kress. I'm not a collector. Are they worth anything?

A: Your baseball cards are part of the 1940 set by Play Ball and issued by Gum, Inc., a Philadelphia company that made Blony bubble gum. It was the largest bubble-gum producer in the United States. Play Ball baseball cards were included with the gum from 1929 to 1941. The 1940 set included 240 different cards. In 1948 Gum, Inc. became Bowman, which was bought by Topps Chewing Gum in 1956. Your cards are of little

value because they were glued to the dresser and are in poor condition. Cards for Appleton, Kress and Nelson are worth about \$5, if in poor condition. Hank Greenberg's card is worth more because he's in the Hall of Fame. It's worth about \$30 in good condition and half that in poor con-

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: 4-year-old pug, Mv"Granby," is having surgery soon to correct a problem that makes it difficult for him to breathe. One of my friends said the procedure is nothing more than cosmetic surgery and that I ought to save my money. What do you think? — Mel in New York

DEAR MEL: For pugs and other short-nosed breeds, surgery is sometimes necessary in order for them to breathe better. If their nostrils are malformed or too narrow. they can be widened to improve airflow. Or, if the

soft palate (at the top of their mouth) is too long and causing breathing issues, surgery can be done to shorten the soft

While these may cause slight changes in Granby's appearance, they can drastically improve his quality of life and overall health.

Pets are increasingly receiving cosmetic surgery. A CBS report said that dog owners in the U.S. spent \$62 million in 2011 on such treatments. In James chapter 2, James admonishes believers to not respect one person more or less than others. While the wording of **verse one** is difficult to understand, James explains in the following verses. He explains that if we respect a person who is wearing fine clothing as more respectable than someone who appears to be poor, we are judging them and having evil thoughts (verse 4). Today we might say "You can't judge a book by its cover."

Every human being was created in the image and likeness of the Creator. God Himself (Genesis 1:26). Everybody's abilities and circumstances are different. The person who appears poor may be struggling with greater obstacles, or he or she may be ill. Don't try to judge the reason that they appear different than others. James writes in James 2:9 "if you respect one person more than another you commit sin.'

He continues to say (verse 10) whoever keeps all the law except one part of it is guilty of breaking it all. No one is perfect so we must trust the Lord Jesus to forgive our sins and cleanse us so we can have a close relationship with the holy God and enjoy His blessings.

Season spring with onions

Wild onions were among the first foods that mankind gathered and ate, and are one of the first signs of spring. Onions are in the allium family along with garlic and shallots. There's nothing like the intense flavor (or the smell) of an onion! Spring onions are my favorite type of onion, both as an ingredient

and as a vibrant, flavorful garnish. Spring onions also are called green onions, young onions, pencil onions and scallions.

Scallions aren't as fully ripened as a green onion and should not have a bulb. Spring onions are the milder, first stage of a mature onion. If left in the ground to grow, they'll form into an onion bulb.

Larger, older spring onions may have limp or faded stalks and a stronger flavor than the smaller ones. Spring onions should be small and thin, with a firm base at the root tip and crisp, bright green leaves. Select spring onions that are not fully developed, with a white bulb end and long, green stalks. The flavor of the leaves is milder than the root end. Spring onions will keep for five to seven days when wrapped in plastic and stored in the refrigerator.

Spring onions are a great source of vitamins A and C, iron, calcium and fiber. They also contain a substance that prevents the formation of blood clots. Eating onions helps to lower blood pressure and cholesterol levels.

To prepare the spring onions, cut off the roots and peel away the outer layer to remove any lingering dirt. Next, rinse the leaves, spreading them gently with your fingers to get at the dirt in the crevices. Both parts are edible. Although the white bulb is listed most often as part of recipes, the green leaves also should be incorporated into recipes and as a garnish.

Use the leaves to add a wonderful burst of green color, to tie up appetizers into a package or to use as a

> frilly, edible garnish. To curl the ends, cut off the roots and all but about 3 inches of the green tops. Slice the tops lengthwise down from the green end into the white section. Put the leaves in cold water and chill for several

hours to curl them.

While spring onions are best served raw, they're also delicious grilled or sautéed. They should be added during the final stages of a recipe for maximum flavor. This recipe is a showcase for two vegetables that will brighten up your dinner plate with the colors and flavors of spring!

Sauteed Spring Onions With Asparagus

2 pounds green asparagus with pencil-thin stalks

1 whole bunch of spring onions or green onions, root bottoms removed and discarded

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon dried Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1. Trim the woody bottoms from the asparagus and discard. Slice asparagus diagonally into thirds and set aside. Slice spring onions or green onions in 1/4-inch slices and set aside.
- 2. Add the olive oil and the butter to a medium pan over medium heat. When the butter begins to bubble, add the spring onions, garlic and Italian seasoning,

and sauté until the onions begin to soften, ■about 2-4 minutes.



by Keith Roach, M.D. Infection causes many Alzheimer's deaths

DEAR DR. ROACH: Our local newspaper just ran the obituary of a 59-year-old woman who died from Alzheimer's disease. I didn't know her, but I've known at least two other people with that illness. One has passed away; the other is in a memory-care unit. How does Alzheimer's cause or contribute to death? -- A.

ANSWER: Alzheimer's disease is a common degenerative disease of the brain. It's unfortunately very likely that in the years ahead, you will know many more people diagnosed, as the risk increases with age. Its exact cause is unknown. We often think of Alzheimer's as being a disease of memory; however, personality changes, loss of insight, impaired visual skills and language dvsfunction are other cardinal findings of the disease, though any of these may show more clearly as the disease progresses.

Alzheimer's can progress in individuals at very different rates, but the mean survival after diagnosis has been reported as three to eight vears. People with Alzheimer's disease usually become debilitated due to poor nutrition and hydration, which leads to increased risk for infection, one of the most

common causes of death in Alzheimer's.

I don't mean to suggest that debility is the fault of the caregivers of people with advanced dementia. Caring for a person with Alzheimer's disease is a difficult and demanding task — physically, mentally and emotionally. But no matter how devoted and skillful the care is, there is no preventing the physical decline that happens as the Alzheimer's progresses: we can only slow it down. It has been my experience that in patients with advanced dementia, the caregiver becomes the most important part of the team to

get information from and give guidance on care and provide support to.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm pushing 90 years old. I developed large, blue veins, similar to the varicose veins my mother had in her legs. What are these called on the hands? I read that Hollywood stars get their hand veins collapsed. I am embarrassed by the vein condition on my hands. — A.M.

ANSWER: "Varix" is the Latin word for a dilated vein, so we call them varicose veins no matter where they are on the body. They run very strongly in families, but it

isn't clear exactly what causes them.

Most varicose veins do not need to be treated, but if they are complicated by bleeding, blood clots or pain, they may require treatment. Varicose veins in the legs also can be a cause of restless leg syndrome. Treatment can be effected by surgery, injecting a medication to close the vein or with a laser. Having an experienced practitioner is important.

Some people do treat them for cosmetic reasons. You don't have to be a movie star to be concerned about your appearance. It is expensive, though.


