Dollars and sense

Homemade nontoxic
cleaning products

Winter finds us with our windows and doors tightly closed, and everything in the air stays inside — including the chemicals from cleaning products. Stores carry non-toxic products, but many consumers find that they either don't work as well or are cost prohibitive. For less than a quarter of the price, you can easily make many home-cleaning products without toxic ingredients.

washing soda, borax and bar soap. You can add a natural scent if you like. If you're short on time, opt for dry recipes as opposed to liquid, which are more complicated and harder to store.

Make your own furniture polish with distilled white vinegar, a few drops of olive oil and lemon oil or fresh lemon juice. Wipe off excess. If you live in an area with humid summer weather, go light on the oil, as it might turn rancid.

Not everyone has a self-cleaning oven, and



Many window-cleaner recipes call for varying amounts of the same three ingredients: dish soap, vinegar and water. Some add a bit of ammonia, but then you've got the chemical smell and toxicity in the house. Others swear by the addition of a little cornstarch for cleaning serious grime and getting a super shine.


Take a look at the ingredients on the package of whatever laundry detergent you use now. You're likely to see names like linear alkylbenzene sulfonate. ethoxylate and aminostilbene di-sulfonate, plus others you can't pronounce. Instead of paying high prices for products with ingredients you don't understand, try making your own. Go online to search for homemade laundry soap, and you'll find recipes that start with

one of the strongest, most noxious cleaning chemicals in the home is oven cleaner. A half cup of baking soda and a tablespoon or two of water made into a paste, applied and left overnight will go a long way to help with the first step of cleaning a super-dirty oven.

The second step is to spray with a vinegar solution. There are some recipes that combine the vinegar with the first step. Check online for recipes you'd like to try.

None of the ingredients for these homemade cleaners are toxic — or expensive. Chances are you have the ingredients on hand already. Don't add bleach to any of your concoctions. Mixing bleach with certain other ingredients can cause toxic fumes.

Guidance for persons who have traveled to an Ebola affected area

If you have traveled to an area affected by an Ebola outbreak, you will be screened to determine your exposure risk:

High risk - direct contact with Ebola or sick individual's body fluids

Some risk - direct contact within 3 feet of an Ebola /sick individual

Low, but not zero risk - travel to an area impacted by Ebola, but no direct contact.

A quarantine order will be issued for asymptomatic individuals according to exposure risk. High and Some Risk individuals will be quarantined in their home for 21 days and will be monitored in person for 21 days following the last contact with the sick indi-

Low, but not zero individuals will be monitored for 21 days by LHD. Individuals in all risk categories will check their own temperature twice daily and monitor themselves for symptoms.

Symptoms of Ebola include: Fever (greater than 38.6°C or 101.5°F) Severe headache Muscle pain

Weakness

Diarrhea

Vomiting

Abdominal (stomach) pain

Unexplained hemorrhage (bleeding or bruising) ***Symptoms may appear anywhere from 2 to 21

days after exposure to Ebola, but the average is 8 to

If symptoms develop during the 21-day quarantine/monitoring period:

- Stay where you are!
- Call 911 and provide complete and detailed information on travel history and signs and symptoms.
- Be patient after calling 911, since EMS providers need to take precautions to protect themselves before responding
- All household members that were within three feet of an Ebola/sick individual will be on a 21-day quarantine.

Cooperation is the key in protecting your family, neighbors, and your community from Ebola.



Whatchamacallit

This is an original Civil War naval artillery fuse box that would have been used by a Civil War Naval artilleryman to carry packs of paper time fuses. As you can see, this has the arsenal mark stamped into the leather.

"USNY BOSTON" stands for United States Naval Yard at Boston. The Boston Navy Yard, originally was called the Charlestown Navy Yard and was one of the oldest shipbuilding facilities in the United States Navy.

Established in 1801, it was officially closed as an active naval installation on July 1, 1974. The earliest naval shipbuilding activities in Charlestown, MA, began during the American Revolutionary War.

The land for the Charlestown Navy Yard was purchased in 1800 and the yard itself established shortlythereafter. The yard built the first U.S. ship of the line, USS Independence, but was primarily a repair and storage facility until the 1890s, when it started to build steel ships for the "New Navy." By then, it was called the Boston Navy Yard.

This leather fuse box is about 3.5 inches wide, 3.5 inches tall and 2 inches in depth. It's a fine example of an intact civil war era piece of history, it

has the original closure tab and brass finial on the bottom and on the back is the original belt loop.







Frozen pipes are no joke

Q: While we spend a couple of months in Florida, our grandson Ronnie will be house-sitting, making sure the place is taken care of. I asked him to make sure that he leaves a couple of taps dripping anytime the temperature dips below freezing. He just chuckled and said, "Won't that run up your water bill?" Now I'm worried he won't do it. What should I do to make sure he knows how important it is that the pipes don't freeze? — Carl H., via e-mail

A: At the risk of sounding flip, I'd tell Ronnie that while you handle the hopefully moderate water bill, he can cover the exorbitant cost of replacing burst pipes and repairing water damage. However, I have a feeling that he was just joking a bit. So, go easy on him, but make sure he knows you want him to keep the taps dripping.

Homes in the northern United States and Canada use higher-rated insulation than houses in the warmer southern states. That helps reduce frozen and burst pipes. But when a house isn't regularly lived in,

if the heat is kept to a minimum to save energy, and water isn't running through the pipes daily, the risk of frozen pipes goes up.

If Ronnie lives in the house while you're gone, the risk of frozen pipes may be minimal. But he still should check less-used areas each week, and daily when the temperature remains below freezing for several days. He should run his hand along exposed pipes in the basement or crawlspace to feel for cold spots that indicate freezing sections. And he should run water occasionally in sinks or tubs that don't see regular use while you're gone.

Make sure that Ronnie has contact information for repair contractors, plumbers and heating specialists so he can have any problems addressed immediately while you're away.

Home tip: To prevent damage to exterior water spigots during cold snaps, shut off water to the outdoor spigots and drain them completely so no water remains in the pipes.

Stay safe when sledding

One of the more popular wintertime activities, sledding attracts scores of participants every time a new coating of snow covers sloping hills. Although sledding can be fun, it also can be risky.

The United States Consumer Product Safety Commission says there are thousands of sledding-, snow tubing- and toboggan-related injuries each year. The majority of injuries occur to children age 14 and younger. Young children are vulnerable to injury because they have higher centers of gravity that can cause them to lose balance more readily. Youngsters' coordination is not fully developed as well, which makes it difficult for them to steer and avoid obstacles.

When sledding, winter revelers big and small need to put safety first before racing down those slopes.



Sledding is an enjoyable winter activity that can provide hours of fun and exercise. Sled safely so injuries do not ruin an otherwise festive afternoon.

- Avoid collisions. Check the sledding space carefully for any obstacles, including waiting children at the end of the run. The Center for Injury Research and Policy at Nationwide Children's Hospital says a vast number of sledding injuries are caused by collisions. These occur when a sledder bangs into something, like a fence, tree or another person. Bone fractures are twice as likely to occur from a collision than from falling off a sled. Making sure the coast is clear helps sledders avoid collisions.
- Dress children appropriately. Treat sledding as you would any activity that involves a moving device. That means making children wear helmets to prevent head injuries. Head and neck injuries are common among children six years old and younger. Helmets considerably reduce injuries when worn correctly.
- Choose the right sled. Sleds that can be steered with handles are generally safer than snow disks or flat sheets heading down a hill. Handles can prevent falls off of the sled, as they give a child something to hold onto.
- Sled feet-first. Children should be instructed to always go down a hill feet-first. This way, should they encounter any obstacles, their boots will hit it first and not their delicate heads and necks.
- Follow the sled safety guidelines. Read the instruc-

tions and safety guidelines for your sled. Heed the recommendation for the number of passengers on a sled at one time.

- Check the end of the slope. Do not sled on driveways, hills or slopes that end in a street, dropoff or pond.
- Only allow sledding under adult supervision. Children should have an adult with them at all times when sledding. Two adults is preferable because one can stay with a child should he or she become injured while the other goes for help.
- Use common sense. Never sled in the street or on a highway. Do not ride a sled being pulled by a motorized vehicle.
- Sled only during daylight hours. Unless sledding will occur in well-lit areas at night, it should be done during the day when visibility is best.
- Dress in layers. Sledding can be a demanding physical activity. Dress in layers that can be removed if you get too warm. Sweating while sledding increases your risk of hypothermia. Adjust clothing layers accordingly for comfort.







Can your car weather the storm?

While last year's brutal winter may seem like a distant memory, severe weather is on its way. The Car Care Council reminds drivers to ready their vehicles for the rough conditions ahead.

"Vehicle service is always more convenient when you do it on your own schedule. An investment of an hour or so to have your vehicle checked will help make sure it can weather the storm when arctic temperatures strike again," said Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council.

Because preventative maintenance helps avoid the hassle and cost of an emergency breakdown, the Car Care Council recommends the following steps to winterize your vehicle:

- Check the battery and charging system for optimum performance. Cold weather is hard on batteries.
- Check the antifreeze. As a general rule of thumb, clean, flush and put new antifreeze in the cooling system every two years.
- Check that heaters, defrosters and wipers work properly. Consider winter wiper blades and use cold weather washer fluid. As a general rule, wiper blades should be replaced every six months.
- Check the tire tread depth and tire pressure. If snow and ice are a problem in your area, consider special tires designed to grip slick roads. During winter, tire pressure should be checked weekly.
- Check the oil and filter and be diligent about changing them at recommended intervals. Dirty oil can spell trouble in winter. Consider changing to "winter weight" oil if you live in a cold climate. Have your technician check the fuel, air and transmission filters at the same time.
- Check engine performance before winter sets in. Winter magnifies existing problems such as hard starts, sluggish performance or rough idling.
 - Check the brakes. The braking system is the vehi-

cle's most important safety item.

- Check the exhaust system for carbon monoxide leaks, which can be especially dangerous during cold weather driving when windows are closed.
- Check to see that exterior and interior lights work and headlights are properly aimed.

During winter, drivers should keep their vehicle's gas tank at least half-full to decrease the chances of moisture forming in the gas lines and possibly freezing. Motorists should also check the tire pressure of the spare in the trunk and stock an emergency kit with an ice scraper and snowbrush, jumper cables, flashlight, blanket, extra clothes, bottled water, dry food snacks and needed medication.

Stay on the road this season with these winter car care tips

(BPT) — Preparing your car for harsh winter temperatures before they strike is a great way to ensure your vehicle will be able to handle the year's coldest months. weather air pressure and have them rotated. Inspect the condition of your tire's tread. This can be achieved by performing a simple test, place a penny on its edge in the tread groove with Abraham Lincoln upside down. If you see the top of Lincoln's head, your tire treads are worn down and you should replace your tires. This same test should be done in several tread grooves across the tire.

- Clean your fuel injector. When the temperature reaches its lowest, you want to know your engine will still operate efficiently.
- Check your fluid levels. Check your brake, coolant, power steering, transmission fluids and windshield washer fluid levels regularly during the winter months. Clear

visibility is imperative during the winter months, and windshield fluid can be heavily used. It is a good idea to have a bottle in your trunk to ensure safe driving conditions.

- Clean the air filter. The winter season sees the roadways littered with debris that can get caught in your vehicle's air filter. The air filter can be easily inspected and cleaned or replaced it if necessary. Doing so will help your car run more efficiently and may even prevent larger problems from occurring in the future.
- Prepare a winter survival kit. Even the best planning can't prevent a winter accident. If you find yourself stranded on the side of the road, a winter survival kit could be invaluable. Your kit should include an ice scraper, de-icing liquid, hand warmers, a granola bar or two, bottled water and cat litter, which can

provide traction for your tires if you get stuck. It is also a good idea to store your phone in the glove box or center console when driving. This way, if you do spin out, you'll be able to find your phone afterward.

• Take your vehicle in for a tune-up. Some winter car maintenance tasks may be outside of your expertise, so it is a good idea to bring your car in for a winter checkup. Your regularly scheduled oil change is the perfect opportunity for your mechanic to do a more detailed inspection of your vehicle. Tips for taking care of your holiday gift plants

If you were lucky enough to receive a gift plant or flower arrangement over the holidays, vou may be wondering how to help it last as long as possible.

The most critical factors, and this goes for all houseplants, is to water them properly and be sure the excess water can drain out. Some potting mixes are loose and drain quickly while others are more dense and hold water longer. It's essential to look closely and give your plants as much water as they need, when they need it, rather than setting a schedule of watering everything once a week.

The ideal way to water is to bring the pots to a sink so you can use plenty of water and let the excess drain away. If the pots are too heavy to move, check the saucers after watering and drain off any standing water. A turkey baster works well for this task.

Tips for caring for particular holiday plants

Poinsettias are the easiest and should hold their bright color well into winter. The best tip here is to remove the foil from around the pot and keep it in a saucer. The foil holds excess water out of sight so it is very easy to overwater. You don't want any plants to sit in standing water for more than a half hour. If you really like the decorative look of the foil then take the plant to the sink for watering, remove the foil and let the water drain out, then replace the foil around the pot.

Cyclamen are beautiful even after their flowers fade but with proper watering the flowers last should several weeks. The key to watering cyclamen is to keep water away from the large bulb, or corm, from which they grow. Lift up the leaves to find this corm then direct the water around it. Let the pot drain well before returning it to its location. Cyclamen like sunny, cool conditions so this is one houseplant that should thrive on a windowsill this time of year.

Christmas Cactus:

The important thing to know about Christmas cactus is that it's a jungle cactus, not a desert cactus. This means it does not want to dry out completely and it does not like direct sunlight. A new plant may drop its flower buds during the transition from the store to your home, but as long as its needs are met it should re-bloom again this winter and for years to come.

Amaryllis grow from a giant bulb. The first growth they push out is their flower bud, followed by long, strap-like leaves. They are pretty much fool-proof their first year. If you keep it to bloom a second year it may produce new leaves but no flowers. Once this happens you might as well start over with a new bulb. They need to grow

under ideal conditions in called Oasis® as the base, which is a dense sponge-like material. Make sure this block of foam is always sitting in at least an inch or two of water so it can remain saturated. Arranging into this foam is a breeze; you just shove the flower and

branch stems into it and they stay in place, allowing you to create a nice, full arrangement.







building muscle mass is not your goal, you can probably improve your flexibility by lifting less weight. Lifting less weight can be a great way to tone your muscles, and you won't be sacrificing the benefits associated with strength training.

- Drink water. Properly hydrated muscles are more capable of responding to flexibility training than poorly hydrated muscles. Make an effort to drink more water throughout the day, and bring your own water with you to the gym so you can stay hydrated during your workouts.
- Find ways to unwind. Your workout may not be the culprit behind your inflexibility. Stress can cause muscles to tighten, and it also increases your risk for a host of ailments, including heart disease and stroke. If

find time to alleviate that stress throughout the day, whether it's taking a relaxing walk during your lunch break or embracing yoga at the end of a long day.

Perform static stretches at the end of your workout. Static stretches may be ineffective and contribute to injury at the beginning of workout, but that does not mean they can't help you improve flexibility once your workout is complete. 

"Proper maintenance of a lawn mower before storage will prevent costly repairs, extend its life and ensure it works when needed again."

Here are the seven most important to dos before storing a lawn mower for

1. Replace damaged or worn parts and troubleshoot performance issues.

Inspect key components and replace as needed. Pay particular attention to the engine and blade. A damaged blade can be a safety risk. Consider replacing the fuel filter, spark plug and air filter. Foam air filters can be cleaned.

2. Thoroughly clean the undercarriage, deck and fuel cap.

Remove the spark plug wire and boot before performing any maintenance. Use a hose, putty knife and car wash detergent to remove debris buildup from the undercarriage and deck. Fuel caps have vent holes to allow air into the fuel tank. Use a paintbrush to brush away particles and buildup on the fuel cap. Before closing the fuel cap, inspect for blockage and replace it if there's blockage.

3. Degrease.

Spray degreaser on oil stains. Allow the degreaser to sit for 10-15 minutes before wiping with a clean cloth. Rinse with a hose.

- 4. Spray lubricant on any bare metal undercarriage parts to prevent rust-
- 5. Add fuel stabilizer to fresh fuel or empty the fuel tank, depending on the manufacturer's instructions for the particular mower model.
- 6. Check the mower owner's manual for the recommended way to handle oil replacement.

Most small engine repair shops and auto parts stores have a free recycling program for used oil.

7. Store in a dry place such as a garage or shed.

Physical Activity Intervention for the Elderly

The holidays are over, and the annual New Year's resolutions to get more exercise have begun. Now, as explained in this month's issue of Agricultural Research magazine, the elderly have more reasons than ever to join the ranks of those determined to get moving. U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) funded scientists in Boston and co-investigators have reported that elders with relatively little muscle mass can benefit from preventive exercise.

The study was headed by geriatrician Christine Liu and co-authored by physiologist Roger Fielding, both with the Jean Mayer USDA Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging (HNR-CA) at Tufts University in Boston. They are with HNRCA's Nutrition, Exercise Physiology, and Sarcopenia Laboratory, which Fielding directs.

By age 80, an estimated 40 percent of the muscle mass that was present at age 20 is lost. Age-related muscle loss — which excludes disease-related muscle loss — is called "sarcopenia." This condition can lead to costly surgeries and hospital stays due to fractures after falls caused by weak muscles.

The researchers looked at

data collected on 177 elders aged 70 to 89 years who were at risk of becoming disabled due to lack of mobility. The data was collected during the Lifestyle Interventions and Independence for Elders study. One group of

physical function, including balance, walking and strength, in response to physical activity. The study was published in January 2014 in the Journal of Nutrition, Health, and Aging.

The Agricultural Research



volunteers participated in a physical activity intervention that included aerobic, strength, balance, and flexibility training. The volunteers' body composition, including lean muscle and body fat, was measured — both before and after the intervention.

The results demonstrated that elders with sarcopenia are capable of improving their overall
