Donna's Day: Creative family fun

Every year about this time, I clip some spindly, crusty-looking brown branches from the forsythia bush in my yard. I shake off any snow, bring them indoors and let kids pound the lower end of the branches with a hammer for efficient uptake of water. I plop them in warm water in my favorite vase to stand tall as the centerpiece of the kitchen.

Before the dormant buds burst into greens and yellows, I descend into the recesses of my basement to hunt for the bin labeled "Easter," and gather our collection of decorated blown eggs to hang from the branches.

With each design lined up in old egg cartons, I recall the fun of poking holes on both ends of the shells and watching my preschool kids blow out the contents into bowls before each hollowed shell was painted, dyed or decorated. We laughed through each strong breath until they were empty. Omelets were on the dinner menu those nights.

Lurking between our stored family egg art is a "before kids" butterfly design painted by my artist friend Gudrun, a treasure from my Zambia days when I taught at the International School of Lusaka. Along with baskets and drums, the

fragile egg made it to America and has been part of our Easter decor every year. Like special ornaments on a Christmas tree, the simple design represents a friendship I cherish.

Make and keep egg-decorating memories with your kids during the coming days leading up to Easter Sunday. Whether you hang the hollow eggs from branches or display them in a pretty bowl, they'll be visual story starters for lively conversations around your table.

To preserve and store your evolving Easter egg art from year to year, blow the contents of eggs before you decorate.

Here's how:

Blowing out an egg

Poke a small hole with a large safety pin at each end of a washed raw egg. Carefully wiggle the pin or a toothpick in one of the holes to break the yolk. Place a drinking straw over the hole on top, and blow through the straw, collecting the contents of the egg in a small dish. Rinse out the empty shell and let dry completely before decorating.

Storage

While you might not be transporting the decorated eggs between continents like I did, clean egg cartons make good containers for neat

stacking in a storage bin in your home.

Standard or Itemized: Choose the Deduction Method That's Best for You

IRS Tax Tip 2015-39, March 16, 2015

Most people claim the standard deduction when they file their federal tax return. But did you know that you may lower your taxes if you itemize your deductions? Find out if you can save by doing your taxes using both methods. Usually, the bigger the deduction, the lower the tax you have to pay. You should file your tax return using the method that allows you to pay the least amount of tax. The IRS offers these six tips to help you choose:

Use IRS Free File. Most people qualify to use free, brand-name software to prepare and e-file their federal tax returns. IRS Free File is the easiest way to file. Free File software will help you determine if you should itemize and file the right tax forms. It will do the math and efile your return - all for free. Check your other efile options if you can't use Free File.

Figure your itemized deductions. Add up deductible expenses you paid during the year. These may include expenses such as:

- Home mortgage interest
- · State and local income taxes or sales taxes (but not both)
- Real estate and personal property taxes
 - Gifts to charities
- · Casualty or theft losses
- Unreimbursed medical expenses

- 1. Know your standard deduction. If you don't itemize, your basic standard deduction for 2014 depends on your filing status:
- Single \$6,200
- Married Filing Jointly \$12,400
- Head of Household \$9.100
- Married Filing Separately \$6,200
- Qualifying Widow(er) \$12,400

If you're 65 or older or blind, your standard deduction is higher than these amounts. If someone can claim you as a

dependent, your deduction may be limited.

Check the exceptions. There are some situations where the law does not allow a person to claim the standard deduction. This rule applies if you are married filing a separate return and your spouse itemizes. In this case, you can't claim a standard deduction. You usually will pay less tax if you itemize. See Pub. 17 for more on these rules.

Use the IRS ITA tool. Visit IRS.gov and use the Interactive Tax Assistant that takes you through a series of questions just like one of our customer service representatives would. The tool can help determine your standard deduction. It can also help you

figure several of your itemized deductions.

File the right forms. To itemize your deductions, use Form 1040 and Schedule A, Itemized Deductions. You can take the standard deduction on Forms 1040, 1040A or 1040EZ.



Top six tips about the home office deduction

IRS Tax Tip 2015-42, March 19, 2015

If you use your home for business, you may be able to deduct expenses for the business use of your home. If you qualify you can claim the deduction whether you rent or own your home. If you qualify for the deduction you may use either the simplified method or the regular method to claim your deduction. Here are six tips that you should know about the home office deduction.

Regular and Exclusive Use. As a general rule, you must use a part of

your home regularly and exclusively for business purposes. The part of your home used for business must also be:

- Your principal place of business, or
- A place where you meet clients or customers in the normal course of business, or
- A separate structure not attached to your home. Examples could include a garage or a stu-

Simplified Option. If you use the simplified option, you multiply the allowable square footage of your office by a rate of \$5. The maximum footage allowed is 300 square feet. This option will save you time because it simplifies how you figure and claim the deduction. It will also make it easier for you to keep records. This option does not change the criteria for who may claim a home office deduction.

Regular Method. If you use the regular method, the home office deduction includes certain costs that you paid for your home. For example, if you rent your home, part of the rent you paid may qualify. If you own your home, part of the mortgage interest, taxes and utilities you paid may qualify. The amount you can deduct usually depends on the percentage of your home used for business.

Deduction Limit. If your gross income from the business use of your home is less than your expenses, the deduction for some expenses may be limited.

Self-Employed. If you are self-employed and choose the regular method, use Form 8829, Expenses for Business Use of Your Home, to figure the amount you can deduct. You can claim your deduction using either method on Schedule C, Profit or Loss From Business. See the Schedule C instructions for how to report your deduction.

Employees. If you are an employee, you must meet additional rules to claim the deduction. For example, your business use must also be for the convenience of your employer. If you qualify, you claim the deduction on Schedule A, Itemized Deductions



Bring your old apple tree back to its former glory

A neglected, overgrown, old apple tree does have charm, its gnarled, elbowed branches seemingly reaching out for a hug. The fruits, unfortunately, are more often than not too small, too high and too pest-ridden.

But don't despair: Such a tree can be returned to its former glory by "renovation," as corrective pruning of an old tree is called.

Before picking up a pruning tool, ask yourself whether the effort involved in renovating a tree will be justified.

Is the tree of a particularly good variety? (Take into account that renovation would bring some improve-

ments in fruit size and flavor.)

Do you really want a tree where that tree stands?

Would one or more dwarf trees, which can be cared for while you stand securely on terra firma, be more practical? Dwarf trees also offer a greater bounty for the space they occupy — hence the move toward smaller trees among fruit farmers.

Cut drastically, but not too many limbs

If you want to keep the tree and go ahead with renovation, begin now, while it's dormant, by drastically cutting back one or two large limbs near their origin lower in the tree. Hold off making additional drastic cuts until next year, perhaps the year after also, to avoid shocking the tree. Those drastic cuts quickly lower the tree and open up what remains to light and air. Lowering the tree makes picking easier. Letting in more light provides nourishment for fruit buds and, along with better air circulation, reduces disease problems by hastening drying of leaves and fruits.

It may be wise to hire a professional to do these first cuts, depending on how drastic they are.

It's impossible to prescribe exactly how far back to cut these large limbs. It depends on the tree's present and desired form. Just remember that new fruiting wood will begin above whatever height you cut a limb back to.

Sprouts make new limbs

Ideally, make your cuts back to well-placed side branches. But don't worry if no side branch is growing off near your cut because new sprouts, the tree's future limbs, will grow from dormant buds.

Actually, too many new sprouts will grow. Remove most of them. It's easiest to visit your tree every few weeks through spring and summer, firmly grabbing any excess sprouts with your hand and removing them with a sharp downward jerk. Save sprouts that are well-placed as far as spacing and height of origin to make new limbs.

Any wayward sprouts that you miss during the summer could also be pruned back this time next year, but re-sprouting from their bases is then more likely. Be ruthless with sprout removal because too many new branches crowding each other will put the tree back where it started, with shaded, dank branches.

On to detailed pruning, and a hug

After making those large cuts, proceed to more detailed pruning with a small pruning saw and a lopping shear. Cut back dead, broken or diseased branches to sound wood. Also remove stems that are overcrowded or weak. Such stems typically grew in shaded parts of the tree and droop downwards. Either cut them off completely or shorten them to the point where they start their downward arc.

The final and most detailed cuts are of the spurs, those short, stubby branches — only an inch or two long — on which fruits are born. Old apple trees commonly have too many spurs, which spreads a tree's resources among so many fruits that those that do ripen are small and poor-quality. Use hand-held pruning shears to completely remove some spurs, and to remove just a side branch or two from others.

For the finishing touch, tidy up the bark. Loose, old bark provides refuge for pests such as codling moth larvae. Scrape the bark clean with a short-handled hoe or some balled-up chicken wire. Be gentle, though — remove only the loose surface bark.

Now stand back and admire your work. Cleaned up, an old apple tree looks even more charming than it did when it was overgrown. Now give your tree a hug.







Whatchamacallit

Trench art is any decorative item made by soldiers, prisoners of war or civilians, where the manufacture is directly linked to armed conflict or its consequences. Common articles that this includes are decorated shell and bullet casings and items carved from wood and bone. There is much evidence to prove that some trench art was made in the trenches, by soldiers, during the war. Some soldiers would press their regimental buttons into the clay on the floor of the trench, then pouring molten lead from shrapnel balls into this

impression to make lead replicas. Not limited to the World Wars, the history of trench art spans conflicts from the Napoleonic Wars to the present day. Although the practice flourished during World War I, the term 'trench art' is also used to describe souvenirs manufactured by service personnel during World War II.

The German army that fought in World War I was not in fact a single, unitary army. All the monarchies as a part of the German empire had its own armies. Since the unification of Germany in January 1871 most of them were under Prussian command, however, wear its own style of uniforms and insignias. The four German kingdoms that existed since the Napoleonic era - Bavaria, Prussia, Saxony and Württemberg - of course had its own armies until the end of WW I. The commander in chief in peacetime of each of these armies was the King. Prussia had the largest army of the four. After the unification and the formation of the German Empire, the Prussian army became the nucleus


of the Armies of the German Empire (Deutsches Reichsheer). After the declaration of war, the emperor became the commander-in-chief of all the armed forces. By 1914 the German army fielded 50 active divisions and 48 Reserve-Divisions - until 1918 251 divisions had been created.

This is a Hammer ~ **Mitigating Water Leaks**

by Samantha Mazzotta

Q: I've read that ice dams and roof damage can lead to water leaks, but how can I find them? And what can I do if I find a leak? — Janice L., Portsmouth, NH.

A: If you've noticed ice buildup along your eaves outside, it's a good idea to check inside in those same areas for water leaks. Take a flashlight and go to the part of the house that's as close as possible to the suspect area. Using the flashlight, check the wall and ceiling for light-brown water spots or streaks. If you see them, a leak likely has been occurring for a few days.

Run your hand along the wall and ceiling around the area, whether you see water spots or not (stand on a stepladder, not a chair or furniture). If the drywall or ceiling plaster feels damp, cold or a bit spongy in one spot, a leak may be forming. If you smell mildew or mold in an area, dampness is a problem and may be caused by a leak. Mark this and other potential problem areas with a pencil or blue painter's tape.

A leak needs to be addressed as soon as possible. Contact a roofing professional to schedule an inspection and get a quote to remove the ice dams and repair the roof, as well as seal up leaks.

Before the contractor arrives, start minimizing the water damage indoors. Open up the wall or ceiling a bit to let water flow through freely. In the ceiling, punch a small hole in the center of the damp or water-stained area with a nail, and place a bucket underneath to catch drips.

Leaks behind a wall are more complicated: Often a section of drywall needs to be cut away, as close to the leak source as possible, and a bucket or pan placed beneath the drip. If you have no experience repairing or replacing drywall, enlist an experienced friend or call a contractor to quickly stop further damage until the roof can be repaired. You also may need to contact an electrician to make sure any wiring in a leak-affected area is



Creating an island paradise: Tips for adding an island in your kitchen renovation

Plumbing solved

While you could add an island without plumbing, having a sink in an island can improve the workflow in a kitchen and open up counter space elsewhere. Plumbing an island can be

problematic, however, if your home is built on a slab or a crawl space. The cost of cutting through concrete and adding piping can be prohibitive.

Above-floor plumbing can solve the problem. Manufacturers like Saniflo make a variety of pumping systems that can eliminate the need to cut concrete and reduce the cost of installing plumbing in a new island. For example, the SANISWIFT gray water pumping system is about the size of a small wastebasket (so it fits easily in an island cabinet space), and comes out of the box fully assembled, reducing installation time and costs.

"Cutting through concrete to install plumbing can easily account for 50 percent of a renovation budget," says Chris Peterson of Saniflo. "Homeowners may decide to abandon the idea of an island altogether when they face that kind of cost. Above-floor plumbing allows them to add an island, hide a single drain pipe in a decorative column, and achieve the kitchen of their dreams at a fraction of the cost of traditional plumbing options.'

Top island trends

Islands are increasingly becoming the focal point of kitchen renovations, serving both practical purposes and as design statements.

More homeowners are replacing traditional dining tables and breakfast nooks with spacious islands that feature seating. "Islands are replacing tables," said Audrey Macdonald of Creative Interiors By Audrey in Mississauga, Ontario, in the National Kitchen & Bath Association's 2015 Kitchen & Bath Style Report.

In addition to seating, homeowners are incorporating restaurant-quality fittings into islands, adding charging stations for the family's personal digital de-

A major kitchen remodel costing about \$56,000 can recoup nearly 68 percent of its cost when you sell your home, while a minor remodel in the range of \$19,000 can yield a 79 percent ROI upon resale, according to Remodeling Magazine's Cost vs. Value Report.
