Corsage dos and dont's

Flowers and formal events go hand in hand. Both women and men may wear flowers at weddings, graduations and dances.

A corsage is a small bundle of flowers that is pinned to the lapel area of a woman's clothing or tied around her wrist. Some people get creative and wear corsages in their hair or on their ankles.

Corsages get their name

from the French bouquet de corsage, meaning a grouping of flowers for the bodice. Initially, corsages were attached to the bodice of a dress and wearers believed the corsages helped to ward off evil spirits.

While corsage fashion may have changed, they remain incredibly popular today. Male promgoers typically give their dates corsages before heading off for the festivities, and promgoers or others wearing corsages to formal events may want to consider the following corsage dos and don'ts.

DO order corsages at least two weeks to a month in advance so that the florist will have time to order the necessary dress, as corsages often are matched to the gown. Florists can customize the corsage based on the length, style and color of what a date is wearing.

DO ask if the gown has straps. This will help you decide whether or not to purchase a corsage that pins near the bodice or one with a wrist strap.

DON'T feel the need to match the corsage and boutonniere exactly. While they may feature the same flowers, it is not necessary for them to have the same ribbon or bloom.

DON'T be embarrassed to discuss budget with a florist. If you have a certain price in mind, mention your budget as you look for the right corsage. Then choose an arrangement that falls in your price range.

DO experiment with handmade corsages if you are handy. Amateur florists can try their hand at making corsages for their dates, who may be especially impressed and moved by homemade corsages. Make a corsage from fresh or silk flowers or create a "bloom" from ribbon. There are plenty of tutorials and tips for corsage tricks. Visit a craft center for more inspiration and materials.

DON'T be shy about exploring the modern and trendy ideas in corsages. Corsages can be a method of self-expression, and there's no limit to their style, size and placement. Tiny blooms can be grouped together to make a corsage bracelet or a corsage ring.

DO keep corsages cool until they are used. Store them in a refrigerator to prevent the flowers from drying out prematurely. Afterward, consider drying the corsage to save as a memento.



U.S. senator says it's time to put a woman on the \$20 bill

CONCORD, NH (AP) -The first woman to serve as both governor and U.S. senator is backing a campaign to put a female face on the \$20 bill.

Senator Jeanne Shaheen filed legislation recently that would create a citizens panel to recommend an appropriate choice to the treasury secretary. She is hoping to build on the work of Women on 20s, a national campaign pushing for new \$20 bills by 2020, the 100th anniversary of the constitutional amendment guaranteeing women the right to vote.

"I think there are a lot of opportunities that we sometimes don't think about to point out the sigcontributions women have made in U.S. history," Shaheen said. "And this is one of those opportunities."

The current portrait of former President Andrew Jackson has stared out from the face of the \$20 since 1928. But paper currency is redesigned every seven to 10 years to thwart counterfeiters, and the latest \$20 notes entered circulation in 2003. Changes

can be ordered by the treasury secretary or president. without an act of Congress. and Shaheen's bill wouldn't compel either to do so. Still, she and campaign supporters hope it will boost public support for redesigning the currency and spur broader conversation about the achievements of American women.

Barbara Ortiz Howard founded Women on 20s last year to honor historic women by making them visible in everyday lives. With help from experts in women's history, the group compiled a list of 15 candidates that was narrowed to four finalists after a month of online voting: former first lady Eleanor Roosevelt, escaped slave and leading abolitionist Harriet Tubman, civil rights icon Rosa Parks and former Cherokee Nation Chief Wilma Mankiller. More than 230,000 people voted in the first week after the finalists were announced April 6, said the group's executive director, Susan Ades Stone.

Stone said voting will continue as long as interest remains high, though the group may approach the White House in the next few weeks.

is not what this is about. What it's about is showing that there's wide support for a woman on our paper currency," she said. "We are not under any illusions that the person who comes out of our polling will be the person who ends up on a bill because there is a process and that process usually involves empaneling a group of experts to make certain design choices.'

In a speech in Missouri last vear. President Barack Obama described getting a letter from a young girl suggesting a long list of women to put on currency, and he said he thought that was "a pretty good idea." Although others have started online petitions urging the change, none has reached the 100,000-signature threshold required for an official White House response, Stone said.

Shaheen, a Democrat, became the first woman elected governor of New Hampshire in 1996 and the first woman in the nation to serve as both governor and U.S. senator when she was elected to Congress in 2008. She contrasted the current socialmedia-driven campaign to the effort that led to the release of the Susan B. Anthony dollar coins in 1979.

"That was really before we had the social media we have today, but I remember a lot of people weighing in on that," she said. "But paper currency is still really the currency of choice ... so I think this is an important way to recognize women's contributions just as we recognize men's contributions."

According to the Department of the Treasury, Martha Washington is the only woman whose portrait has appeared on a U.S. currency note. It appeared on \$1 silver certificates in 1886, 1891 and 1896. Given that the \$20 is overdue for an update, the cost of redesigning it to include a female portrait would be

nominal, Shaheen said. Although she declined to pick one woman. Shaheen said some of her top choices include Tubman, Roosevelt, former first lady Abigail Adams Frances Perkins, the first woman appointed to the U.S. Cabinet.

U.S. Rep. Annie Kuster, a New Hampshire Democrat, said she is proud to support the legislation.

"Although half of America's population are women, we have vet to see a face on paper currency that exemplifies the women leaders in our society," Kuster said. "It's far past time to honor the important women who helped shape our nation's history."







Technology can help extend the life of your lights

Drivers who suspect their vision might be making it harder for them to see when behind the wheel should schedule an ophthalmic exam immediately.
- Take steps to improve your reaction time and that of your fellow motorists. Personal reaction time also can influence how drivers see the road and how quickly they react to potentially negative driving conditions. Making sure you get enough sleep and exercise can increase alertness and improve your reaction time. In addition, the choices you make when upgrading your vehicle can improve the reaction time of your fellow drivers.
- Prioritize complete vehicle maintenance. No vehicle maintenance routine is complete unless it includes regular cleaning of headlight lenses, sideview mirrors

and interior glass and mirrors. Dirty mirrors and glass compromises driver vision, so be sure to periodically remove any debris or film buildup on such surfaces.





How to eat after 50

As people age, their dietary needs begin to change. Foods that were once staples of your diet as a youth may be restricted once you hit a certain age, while other foods you may have always avoided may now be necessary to fuel and support a healthy body.

Eating healthy foods and exercising may not be enough to sustain health. as hormonal changes and other health effects as a person reaches age 50 can have a profound impact on his or her nutritional requirements. The following are a few things men and women over 50 may want to consider as they look to eat a healthy diet for years to come.

Vitamin D

Both men and women age 50 and up have a reduced ability to produce vitamin D through exposure to the sun. Extra vitamin D will be needed from foods and supplements. Everyone over the age of 50 should take a daily vitamin D supplement of 400 IU (10 µg), according to Canada's Food Guide. Without adequate vitamin D, bone strength and health can deteriorate because vitamin D promotes calcium absorption. Vitamin D also has other roles, including helping neuromuscular and immune function and reducing inflammation.

Friendly fats

People over age should increase their intake of unsaturated fats and reduce consumption of saturated fats. Nutrientrich unsaturated fats can guard against heart conditions, protect against stroke, keep skin supple, and even help men and women maintain good neurological health. Omega-3 fatty acids can be found in nuts, olives. seeds, and fatty fishes.

Increase protein

According to Christine Gerbstadt, MD, RD, a spokesperson for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, as they age, men and women need more protein in their diets to maintain their muscle mass. The amount of protein needed at a younger age no longer may be adequate. Look for lean sources of protein from fish and poultry. Beans are also a low-fat source of protein that can help fulfill daily protein requirements.

Eating more fiber can help with digestive and intestinal problems, such as

constipation. Constipation can occur when fiber intake is not enough, coupled with a more sedentary

lifestyle. The best way to get fiber is through diet. Leave the skins on fruit and vegetables and choose

whole fruits over juices. Whole-grain breads and cereals also are good sources of fiber. Dry beans

and lentils can add a fiber boost. Always increase fiber slowly to determine your tolerance.

Fewer calories

The National Institute on Aging says women over the age of 50 need between 1,600 and 2,000 calories, depending on how physically active they are. Men need between 2,000 and 2,400 calories per day. With each passing year there is a decrease in the energy required to maintain body weight, so caloric intake should be adjusted accordingly.

More water

As a person ages, his or her body may not signal it is thirsty as well as it once did, so it's possible that you may not recognize when you are thirsty or dehydrated. The Mayo Clinic recommends around nine to 10 cups of beverages per day to remain hydrated.

Eating healthy and changing one's diet is important as a person ages, as dietary needs at age 50 may be quite different from what they were at age 30.

Sea lion pup waddles away from water, gets ride back to sea

FORT BRAGG, CA (AP)

— A healthy sea lion pup
that was returned to the
sea by deputies after
waddling a quarter-mile
onshore seemed to be

staying in the waves — at least for now, officers said.

"There's no reports of him running down the street or anything," Men-

docino County Sheriff's Captain Greg Van Patten said.

Deputies patrolling Highway 1, just south of Fort Bragg, spotted an animal moving slowly in dark, dense fog on Sunday. They discovered it was a sea lion pup, measuring 2 1/2 feet long and weighing about 20 pounds with a tag attached to its front flipper.

The animal — believed to have met humans previously through a stay in a marine-animal rehabilitation project — seemed happy to have come across the deputies.

"He kept coming up to them," like a pet dog, "rubbing against their legs," Van Patten said.

Officials contacted the Marine Mammal Center in the San Francisco Bay Area, and officials there identified the pup from its orange tag as having been released from a marine mammal rehabilitation center in Southern California.

It climbed into the back of the patrol car, and deputies took some pictures with their new friend, including one of the sea lion wearing a seat belt, before driving it back to the ocean. Center spokeswoman Laura Sherr said it's likely the

pup previously had been emaciated, rehabilitated and released

She warned that the public should never touch or try to rescue a stranded sea lion. The animals can be aggressive and if threatened will bite, she said.

A record number of stranded sea lions and seals have been rescued along the Northern and Central California coast this year. Scientists say warmer coastal waters are forcing nursing mothers in the Channel Islands or Mexico to head out farther for food, leaving behind their young for too long.

The animals included many emaciated and dehydrated pups along with a young sea lion that was spotted in March hopping through an almond orchard a mile from the San Joaquin River in Central California.

Van Patten said the seal pup found inland on April 19 was the first such discovery in his 17 years on the job.

As of April 22, 873 sea lions had been rescued from the coastline so far this year, Sherr said. That number is up from 59 of the same species at this time last year, she

Woman eats three steak dinners in 20 minutes

AMARILLO, TEXAS (AP) — A competitive eater has conquered three 72-ounce steak dinners in about 20 minutes during a food challenge held at an Amarillo restaurant.

Several dozens of people gathered outside The Big Texan Steak Ranch on April 19 to watch Molly Schuyler eat the steaks, plus three baked potatoes, three shrimp cocktails, three salads and three rolls.

Schuyler finished her first steak dinner in 4 minutes and 18 seconds, which beats the restaurant's record of 4 minutes and 58 seconds, which she set last May.

She told the Amarillo Globe-News that she had to turn down a fourth steak, because she was sick of the taste and not because she was full.

Some shrubs best pruned after flowering

Although late winter is generally the ideal time for pruning chores, many of our springblooming shrubs are best pruned immediately after flowers have faded.

Trees and shrubs that bloom in early spring, such as forsythia, lilac, honeysuckle, quince and spirea, set their flower buds the previous fall. referred to as "flowering

on old wood." If you prune in late winter, some or all of the bloom potential for spring is sacrificed. By waiting until after flowering, you can enjoy the blossoms first, then attend to pruning chores.

As with any other pruning job, have a goal in mind before you begin cutting. First, any dead, diseased or damaged stems should be completely removed. Young plants and those that have benefited from pruning in recent years pruning to maintain the desired size or shape. Vigorous shrubs often grow so many stems that the interior leaves of the plant drop due to shading. Removal of excessive growth and crossed

branches is a good strategy to remedy such crowding.

Older, overcrowded plants that have been may only need light neglected for a number of years may also produce fewer flowers and fruits. Some plants can be cut completely back to the ground to force new branches all at once, including forsythia, rose-of-Sharon, priv-
