





Hello Again,

Memories are made of this. I believe there was a 1940's song with that title.

While relaxing with a hot cup of Irish tea, my mind was drifting back to people in the village where I was born, and raised. Actually the stork visited my mom in a farmhouse about a mile out in the country. The stork knew that mom and I wanted to be near each other so that's how it happened.

While the doctor was there waiting for the stork he asked my father to walk over to Dick and Dan O'Connel's farmhouse to telephone his wife in Cherry Valley who was a doctor also. The doctor felt he might need assistance so he wanted his wife to come out. Must be the doctors had a telephone and two cars. About 10 minutes after Dad left the O'Connel's the doctors' wife called back to ask if some medical equipment or medicine was needed.



So Dick O'Connel pulled on his overalls, shoes and walked over to our house. That's the way it used to be. Neighbors with telephones were willing to share – even if it meant leaving their beds in the middle of the night to deliver a message or to fetch someone to the phone.

In the late 1930's and half way into the 40's there were only two other telephones in the nearby village.

The most used phone was a wall hanger in Charlie Hearn's General Store. The other phone was installed in Matie North's home as Miss Camp, the grade school principal teacher, lived there during the school year.

The phone system was known as a party line. Several houses and business would share the same line. The party line allowed everyone on the same line to listen in. Sort of an email by voice. To use the phone you had to lift the earpiece off the hanger, then turn the hand crank with one turn of the crank you were connected to central or three cranks and one of your neighbors would answer and on a larger party line the ring would alert everyone and they would all listen in.

If a strong snowstorm blew up during the night the town road Superintendent would phone Miss Camp. If she decided to close the school she would phone WGY radio station.

Years prior to automobiles, country schools seldom closed. Students could either walk, ride a horse, or dad would take them to school with a horse and sleigh or bobs. It was nearly impossible to stick a single horse or team in heavy snow. Henry Ford's Model T cars were also tough to stick. Year's later drivers with their new cars and trucks demanded that even the country dirt roads be free of snow and sanded. Even later salt came along and ate up the cars. Reminds me of the story about the old New York farmer, "No doubt you have seen many changes in your long life. Yep, I have," said the old timer, and I've been against every one of them."

School seemed to be important except for some of the time. During harvest time boys didn't skip school they merely stayed home to work on the farm. Guess their dads thought it was more important to eat throughout the year than to win an award for attendance. Deer season? well — the schoolhouse couldn't hope to compete with deer hunting. Some boys would brag about perfect attendance except for harvest time and deer season.

# Helping plants prepare for winter

by Dr. Leonard Perry, Horticulture Professor, University of Vermont

Outdoors, a major change is taking place. Your trees and shrubs are preparing for winter. By January most of them will be able to withstand temperatures of 20 to 30 degrees (F) below zero. Some could tolerate even colder temperatures. Knowing how plants prepare for winter, you can manage plant choices and their culture for better overwintering success.

When a plant becomes dormant, cellular components change and processes slow, allowing them to withstand lower temperatures. Since freezing water can burst cells, some water leaves cells during acclimation. Sugars and other protective chemicals, similar to antifreeze, with lower freezing points are increased. So it makes sense that you don't want plants to enter winter waterlogged. On the other hand, you want them to not be stressed from prolonged drought periods. Ideal is to make sure that plants have sufficient water in the fall, but keep them on the dry side if possible.

Plants have a maximum level of cold they'll tolerate, this varying genetically by species and even cultivar. Even within a species, the amount of cold tolerated may be determined by location or "provenance". A rhododendron from the south may be much less hardy than the same species from the north.

Plants parts can vary as well in the amount of cold they'll tolerate. This is the reason some years vou may have leaves but not flowers on forsythia, flowers buds generally being less hardy than leaf

Once a plant is dormant, it tracks the winter progress through "chilling units", the number of hours not below freezing but that are at a certain level above freezing — often 40 to 50 degrees (F), ranging between 500 and 2000 hours depending on the plant. After this chilling, they enter a lighter stage of dormancy or "eco dormancy" just as they experience during fall acclimation. In this "standby mode" they can respond to specific periods and degrees of warming (varying by plant), as with the warming in spring or a prolonged "winter thaw" period. In this spring period of "deacclimation" buds are much less hardy, so may be damaged by subsequent severe cold.

To help plants prepare for best winter survival, you should avoid practices that stimulate late summer growth of trees and shrubs. For example, nitrogen fertilization in August or early September may encourage a late flush of stems that can't turn off their growth before frosts. Herbaceous perennials are the opposite - good fertility right into fall, stimulating vigor and storage of more food for winter, often helps them survive better and regrow more vigorous next spring.

Fertilizer and lime applied (according to soil test results) in October or November, when temperatures are cooler and days are shorter, will not stimulate top growth until spring. Roots take up the nutrients and store them in the roots and stems. While it is best to lime in the fall - most lime takes some months to change the soil acidity - it is best to wait until growth resumes in spring to fertilize if not done by mid fall.

For shade trees and shrubs, a surface broadcast application of readily-soluble or slow release. high nitrogen fertilizer over the whole root zone is probably the most effective and easiest means of applying fertilizer. Other methods are liquid injection feeding, the poke and pour method or placing fertilizer pills, packets or spikes in the root zone.

If the soil already contains adequate phosphorus and potassium (as in a well-fertilized lawn), nitrogen is often the only element needed to enhance growth. Follow recommendations from your soil test. You should use a fertilizer with water insoluble nitrogen. A rule of thumb is to apply three pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet, as from 30 pounds of 10-0-10 fertilizer.

Do not use lawn fertilizers containing herbicides within the spread of trees. Otherwise, the herbicide will be taken up by the tree and kill it, just as kills broad-leaved weeds. For established plants, most professionals recommend to mulch late, just before snow fall. This allows the soil to cool, and plants to harden off sooner. The exceptions to late mulching are bulb beds, including those for garlic, and newly planted perennials. Mulching these sooner will keep the soil warmer longer, allowing for more root growth in fall. You want them well-rooted so they don't "heave" out of the ground in spring, a phenomenon known as "frost heaving". Roots will

continue to grow until the soil temperature drops below about 40 degrees





**Test-taking tips** 

According to the Anxiety and Depression Association of America, test anxiety is a form of performance anxiety that can affect even the most prepared students. The ADAA notes that several factors, including fear of failure and a poor test history, can contribute to test anxiety, the presence of which can make it difficult for students to concentrate and may even

like headache and nausea. Parents of students who are anxious about upcoming tests can share the following test-taking tips with their children, courtesy of the ADAA.

• Prioritize preparation. Test preparation should begin well in advance of the test, as cramming the night before may make students feel unprepared and less

confident in their knowledge of the material. In addition, studying at least a week or two in advance of the test date affords students the opportunity to take practice tests in conditions similar to those in real testing situations. That familiarity can calm any nerves they may typically experience when taking exams.

- Develop an effective test-taking strategy. The ADAA recommends students answer the questions they know first before returning to more difficult questions. Doing so may contribute to students' confidence and calm their nerves as they approach the rest of the test. When tests include essay portions, students can outline their essays before they begin to write so they have a clearer idea of what they want to say and how they want to say it.
- Employ relaxation techniques. Deep, slow breaths and systematic relaxation of muscles can

and make it easier for them to focus. Students can apply such techniques before exams to curb any pre-test jitters they might have and, if necessary, revisit these relaxation exercises during the test if feelings of nervousness return.

- Get enough sleep and eat healthy before the exam. Stress and anxiety are more difficult to cope with when the body is tired, so parents should encourage their children to get adequate sleep the night before an exam. In addition, provide healthy foods for kids to eat prior to the exam so they are not lethargic or hungry once the test begins.
- Don't be afraid to seek help. Plenty of students experience test anxiety, and many schools offer programs designed to help students overcome their test-taking fears. Making use of these programs is a great way for kids to improve their testing perform-





# Choosing deer-resistant landscape plants

by Dr. Leonard Perry, Horticulture Professor, University of Vermont

As deer have become one of the major problems in many gardens, gardeners have begun learning what plants their neighborhood deer prefer or don't like. Deer

preference for your landscape plants will vary with several factors, but there are some plants generally more resistant to deer feeding.

Deer seek plants rich in protein, especially in spring and summer as young grow and deer recover from our long northern winters. Wellfertilized garden plants provide this — energy from carbohydrates, and minerals and salts. Since deer only can store protein nitrogen in small amounts, they need a steady supply during peak periods.

Deer also get about one third of their water from moisture in plants, hence the reason they prefer moist and tender plant parts. This is why they often go for new growth, usually on the outer parts of plants, such as

new leaves and buds, or immature stems

Certain smells of plants also attract deer, just as humans have certain generally attractive smells, be it popcorn or apple pie. Other times deer just may want to sample the newest additions to your landscape.

On the flip side, deer seem to know which plants are poisonous and to avoid, be they certain mushrooms, foxglove, or daffodils. Deer will avoid a plant they may have tried and didn't like, or which made them sick. But, hungry enough from lack of preferred food or too many deer in an area for the food available, and they will eat most any plant rather than starve.

Deer generally avoid plants with a strong aroma that hurts their delicate sense of smell, with fuzzy leaves such as lamb's ears, prickly leaves such as evergreen hollies or barberries, or with a bitter or alkaloid taste such as yarrows. Deer rely on their fine sense of smell as an early warning system of approaching danger. Some such fragrant plants that generally deter deer include catmint, chives, lavender, mind, sage, and thyme. Some gardeners interplant these among more favored deer plants to keep them away from such plants and gardens.

Lists of resistant plants are a good way to start thinking about your landscape, and to help to varying degrees, just don't rely on such plants as foolproof all the time and in all places. That is why there are almost no plants that are "deerproof", but merely resistant. Keep in mind with lists of resistant plants that they will vary with expert, region, deer pressure and food source, deer preferences, and may even be contradicto-

Which plants are resistant also will vary with year, and season. When deer are hungry in early spring after a long hard winter, most anything green (such as your tulips) is a treat. Later in the summer they may get more selective, in late summer try out some new plants so far left untouched, and in fall start serious grazing (as in spring) to store up for winter.

Some woody plants that deer generally prefer, so you might avoid if you have many deer in your area, include yews, euonymus (burning bush), hybrid tea roses, and saucer magnolia. There are some roses less palatable (generally with more thorns), such as the rugosa hybrids, some shrub roses such as Harison's Yellow, and some Moss roses. Herbaceous plants deer generally eat include crocus, dahlias, daylilies, hostas, impatiens, phlox, and trillium. Some refer to the flowers of lilies and tulips as deer bon-bon candies.

Some trees generally resistant to deer include spruce, pines, honey locust, river birch, and buckeyes. Some shrubs that are generally deer resistant include bush cinquefoil, barberries (considered invasive, and so not planted, in many areas), blue mist shrub, forsythia, junipers, lilacs, evergreen hollies, many spireas, and many viburnum.

Some herbaceous plants to consider as resistant include astilbe, barrenwort, bee balm, blanket flower, bleeding heart, columbine, dead nettle, false indigo, ferns, globe thistle, hellebore, hollyhock, lungwort, lupine, meadowsweet, monkshood, mugwort, peony, primrose, purple coneflower, Russian sage, Siberian bugloss, speedwell, sunflower, and yarrow. Most ornamental grasses are considered deer resistant, including such ones as blue fescue, little bluestem, blue oat grass, maiden grass, reed grass, and panic grass.

Many bulbs generally are deer resistant, and include daffodils, fritillaries, Dutch iris, grape hyacinths. hvacinths. squill, and alliums. Some gardeners with deer problems interplant daffodils with tulips to train deer early (as daffodils bloom before most tulips) to stay



#### Why Cats Won't Use Litter Box

Dear Paw's Corner: I read your column responding to the reader whose cats will not use the litter box. I have three cats and two litter boxes, and they're doing just fine. Here's what I use: I put a litter called "Feline Pine" in the boxes. It comes in pellets, which don't weigh much, and you don't have to use much, just cover the bottom of the pan. When the cats pee, the pellets turn into something like sawdust.

Also, if the reader scoops the boxes every day, or even twice a day, no one will even know he has cats! Trust me! - Jean H., via email

Dear Jean: Thanks for the tip!

Trying a completely different type of cat litter can help in the case of litter box avoidance. Some cats are turned off by scented litter, while others have an aversion to a litter's texture. And of course, diligent litter box cleaning makes every one in the household humans and cats — much happier.

As I said in the previous article, owners whose cats are avoiding the box have to experiment a bit to find a solution. Using boxes with lids, or boxes without lids; replacing heavily soiled carpet and backing and treating with a "keep away" spray; increasing the number of litter boxes available; and observing the cats' behavior for potential conflict or health issues.

## Want to keep bird feeders from becoming squirrel buffet?

Many homeowners enjoy feeding birds in their yards until squirrels start nibbling at the feed - or the feeders.

Squirrels climb on bird feeders and eat the food, often chewing and clawing through wood and plastic to get to it.

"While squirrels are nice to have in the backyard and are a part of wildlife, they can be a big nuisance," said Chris Mullins, a Virginia Cooperative Extension specialist at Virginia State University. "There are several things you can try to keep squirrels away from bird feeders if you want to feed birds — not squirrels in your yard."

The best way to keep a squirrel away is to make bird feeders less accessible, Mullins said.

"Place feeders well away from trees, wires and porches to make it more difficult for squirrels to get on the feeder," he said. Ideally, mount birdfeeders on a smooth metal pole at least 6 feet high, and prune any branches or bushes with-

in a 12-foot radius. Placing a wire bird cage around a feeder or smooth plastic or metal baffles above and below it also can restrict a squirrel's access.

If feeders are hanging from a horizontal wire, adding spinners can keep squirrels from climbing across the wire. The spinners can be thread spools, short lengths of pipe or hose or empty plastic soda bottles.

Also consider cleaning and removing debris and spilled seed from the ground that could be attracting squirrels.

Replace destroyed feeders with those that have doors that will be trigweight to close and restrict access to seed. Alternatively, choose metal feeders to discourage chewing.

Feed birds nyger or safflower seed, which are less attractive to squirrels. Also try adding cayenne pepper or similar spices to birdseed to deter squirrels; squirrels are sensitive to the perceived heat of peppers, while birds are not.

"If all else fails, consider putting food out for the squirrels. Squirrels love to eat dried corn," Mullins said. "Perhaps they'll consider snacking on the corn and leave the bird feed alone.
