The glass and tile that she buys comes in large chunks and she uses wheeled nippers to cut them into smaller pieces to fit into the mosaic. She also buys the glue to keep the pieces in place. Some of the good advice she gave to us was to find a piece that fits the best. If you couldn't find one, you would have to cut the piece. Mrs. Biggers has been interested in art since she was in Amsterdam high school. She would even eat her lunch in the art room. She has been working on mosaic for the last 20 years and says that her work "Autumn Birches" (made from eggshells) is her favorites of ar.

Kitchen Diva

Cook by the Book

If you're determined to eat healthier this year, but you're feeling a little baffled about what to cook, I've got the remedy. I've fallen in love with several new cookbooks that will introduce you to new cuisines and ingenious cooking methods to make life easier and healthier in 2016!

When exploring your cookbook, save time and money by selecting recipes that use similar ingredients. You'll be able to stick with a healthy eating plan if you map out recipes to prepare for one or two weeks at a time, and stock up on the ingredients. Here are two of my favorite cookbooks:

"The Perfect Egg: A Fresh Take on Recipes for Morning, Noon and Night" by Teri Lynn Fisher and Jenny Park.

Eggs are the perfect protein if you're trying to eat healthy on a budget. The authors have compiled a fresh take on classic recipes and comfort foods that are "egg-cellent" choices for any meal.

"The Perfect Egg" recipes are a far cry from using hard-boiled eggs as diet food. The book explores every aspect of eggs in the chapter Egg Basics 101. The authors also provide in-depth insight on the history of egg cultivation and consumption, crack open the story about egg anatomy and types, and unscramble the mystery of the grading system. There also are several tips and techniques for baking, boiling, coddling, frying, poaching, scrambling, steaming, preserving and pickling eggs. I chose to share the recipe for famous Greek Avgolemono Soup, which is simple to make and could be a lunch or dinner dish.

Avgolemono Soup

4 cups chicken stock

1/4 cup whole wheatorzo pasta

1 egg

2 egg yolks

Grated zest and juice of 1 lemon, plus more for garnish

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1. Bring the stock to a boil in a saucepan over medium-high heat. Add

Shelf orzo and cook 6 to 8 minutes or until tender but not mushy. Meanwhile, whisk together the egg and yolks, 1 teaspoon of the lemon zest and juice, the salt and the pepper in a bowl until foamy and pale yellow.

> 2. While stirring constantly, carefully pour 1/2 cup of the hot stock into the egg mixture to temper the eggs and keep them from curdling. Lower heat to medium-low. While stirring constantly, pour the egg mixture back into the saucepan containing the orzo.

> 3. Simmer, stirring frequently, for 8-10 minutes or until thick enough to coat the back of a spoon. Taste, adjust seasoning and serve in warm bowls sprinkled with lemon zest, if desired. Serves 2

Chicken Thighs with Lemon

1 1/2 tablespoons olive

8 (bone-in, skin-on) chicken thighs

1 tablespoon poultry seasoning

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

1 1/2 teaspoons fresh lemon zest

1 garlic clove, finely minced

Lemon wedges for serving

1. Rinse thighs and pat dry with paper towels. Season with the poultry seasoning, salt and pepper. Place olive oil in a large, heavy skillet over medium heat. Place chicken in the skillet skin-side down Cook chicken, without moving the pieces, for 15 to 30 minutes or until the fat has rendered out and the skin is golden brown and crisp. Adjust the heat to

too fast to prevent burning.

2. Turn the thighs over and continue to cook for another 7 minutes. Stir the lemon zest and the garlic into the fat and cook for another 7 or 8 minutes or until meat next to the bone is cooked through. Serve with lemon wedges.



damaged property without restitution or calls for service never returned.

There are several A+ accredited snow removal businesses and BBB urges everyone to keep these important tips in mind when hiring snow removal services:

Look for experience. Each home or business is different and experience does matter. You need to



make sure everyone who works for a company you hire has relevant experience, not just the owner. Price factors include: property layout, the size of the service area and whether customers request removal of snow from other areas such as sidewalks or walkways.

Ask how jobs are scheduled. Some contractors do snow plowing as a part-time job, and this may affect their availability to clear a driveway when needed. Always check to see if there is a schedule for snow removal.

Get more than one estimate. There can be a lot of factors to be considered with snow removal. BBB recommends you get at least three estimates before making a decision. Ask for all the costs upfront to avoid any surprises. Keep in mind the lowest price doesn't always mean the best serv-

Ask about insurance. Who is responsible if your home or grounds are damaged during the winter season? Find out what type of insurance

coverage potential contractors provide, as well as homeowner's insurance. Does a municipality require the contractor to have a permit or license? Before you hire anyone, make some calls to find out and then check to make sure the contractor is appropriately covered.

Review contract. Never settle for a verbal agreement. Contractors should always provide a written contract. A representative should come out to look at the property and make notes about services requested and potential obstacles. Find out how to terminate the agreement if necessary. Get all of these details in writing and always read before you sign. Know all the terms and conditions of the contract. Understand cancellation fees and any extra charges that may apply.

Split the payments. Find out how the company expects payment. Most snow plow contracts take two forms: pay per plowing or pay per season. If you choose a pay per season contract in a

light snow season, the contractor is not obligated to refund any money. If you're expected to pay all fees upfront - consider it a red flag. Most contractors will split fees into two or three payments one at the beginning, middle and end of the season. Never pay cash.


Get contact information. Make sure to get the contact information for the company in the case of a snow emergency, and know the policies about who to reach, standard contact phone numbers and any special number for urgent needs.

Beware of scams. Remember even if a business appears to be reliable, it does not mean it is. When a company is reluctant to answer questions, won't supply proper information or unwilling to offer references there could be cause for concern.

Check with us! BBB provides background information, complaint history and resolution to complaints in our Business Reviews. Check out snow removal services at bbb.org and if you can't find a Business Review. ask the BBB to start one.

Report a scam. If you spot a business or offer that sounds like an illegal scheme or fraud, tell us about it through BBB's Scam Tracker. We will investigate and warn others by reporting your experiences.

Get a head start on tax season







Whatchamacallits

This week's Whatchamacallit is the Clereline Dust Remover, produced in Weedsport, NY. As you can see, this device was attached to the handle of your handsaw. According to *Directions for Installation*, it was fastened to the bottom of the saw handle with the slotted end toward the saw blade. After it was installed you could adjust the unit so the 'hole in the end of the cylinder is about even with the saw teeth.' This adjust-





ment was to direct the stream of air either forward or backward depending on the width of the saw blade. With each stroke of the blade through the board, the cylinder was supposed to shoot a puff of air to blow away the saw dust so you could see the cut line. As stated on the bottom of the instruction sheet: "Clerline Dust Remover is made of finest materials and will give years of service if properly cared for. Caution — Do Not Oil"


