



### by Matilda Charles Strong legs boost brainpower

A 10-year British study out of Kings College found an interesting correlation between leg strength and brainpower. In the first-of-its-kind study, strong legs equated to cognitive strength down the road.

Female twins between the ages of 43 and 73 (average age 55) were recruited for baseline testing, with adjustments made for various parameters such as socioeconomic status, alcohol drinking, blood pressure, level of exercise and more. Memory and learning were measured at the start of the study, as were the strength of leg muscles of both twins. Brain scans also were taken.

Ten years later the tests were repeated. Those who'd started and ended with more muscular legs showed the best results in memory and cognitive tests and more brain volume.

The researchers still don't know for certain why they saw these results. More studies need to be done, they said, to understand how aerobics, brain function and leg muscle power all come together, and whether muscle-building chemicals somehow make their way to the brain.

While scientists didn't predict the outcome, it was not surprising because they've long known that general exercise can help with cognitive function.

Until they figure out the specifics, one thing is clear: adding more walking or doing exercises designed to increase leg strength can help with memory and thinking. We can run, take dance classes, lengthen our daily walk and spend time on a treadmill or rowing machine at the gym. Even yoga can help strengthen

leg muscles.

For those who aren't mobile, seated rowing exercises with a resistance band can help, as can a recumbent bicycle.

Consider asking your doctor for an exercise plan that concentrates on the leg muscles.



# Ways to prevent falls during the winter months and throughout the year

Falls are the leading cause of injury deaths, hospitalizations emergency department visits among adults 65 and older in New York State. Each year, approximately 1,892 New Yorkers over the age of 65 die as a result of falls an additional 68,566 fall-related injuries were hospitalized due to injuries. Montgomery County has the highest rate of fall injuries resulting in hospitalizations in New York State.

Falls can result in lasting, serious injuries, affecting mobility, independence and mental health. Some people think that falls are a normal part of aging and are not preventable. By making changes lifestyle and following some precautions you can greatly lower your chances of falling.

Prevention Strategies:

• Have your health care provider review all your medications, including over the counter medicines. As you get older, the way medicines work in your body can change. Some medicines, or combinations of medicines, can make you sleepy or dizzy and can cause you to fall.

- Have your eyes checked by an eye doctor at least once a year. You may be wearing the wrong glasses or have a condition like glaucoma or cataracts that limits your vision. Poor vision can increase your risk of falling.
- Make your home safer by removing things you can trip over (like wires, throw rugs, papers, books, clothes and shoes) from stairs and places where you walk. Using double-sided tape to keep rugs from slipping. Keep items you use often in cabinets that you can reach easily without using a step stool. Have grab bars installed next to your toilet and in the tub or shower. Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on shower
  - Improving the light-

ing in your home. As you get older, you need brighter lights to see well. Hang lightweight curtains or shades to reglare. Have duce handrails and lights put in all staircases. It's safer to wear shoes inside and outside the house. Avoid going barefoot or wearing slippers.

• Begin a regular exercise program. Physical activity makes you stronger and helps you feel better. Exercises that improve balance and coordination are the most helpful. New programs within senior centers throughout New York State have implemented the use of Tai Chi as a way to improve balance, strength and coordination. Tai Chi is an ancient Chinese exercise with movements that originate in martial arts practice. While used as a type of self-defense in its most advanced form, Tai Chi is practiced widely for its health and relaxation benefits. It has also been called

"Chinese shadow boxing." Ask your doctor or health care provider about the best type of exercise program for you.



# Whatchamacallits -

Our Whatchamacallit this week is actually a grouping of several different corn husking (or shucking) tools from different eras. The glove — from near the turn of the last century — was one of a pair and only one glove (usually the right) had the peg (or hook) permanently affixed to the palm. The other items are all husking pegs from different manufacturers spanning several generaltions. All were used prior to mechanized harvesting and some Amish farmers or natural homesteaders still use the pegs today.

The one pictured above left is the most modern in this



collection. If you were using the peg or hook, it would be strapped over a glove or mitten (or a bare hand) and adjusted to fit either adult or child. With smooth, swift movements the ear was cut from the stalk, the husk was removed and the ear was tossed into the wagon that was either behind the picker or in the next row — usually being pulled by a team of

A brief description of how to use a modern peg is as follows: "slip over the first three fingers, push peg under husk, grab with thumb and pull."

Traditionalists who want to commemorate Valentine's Day in the most romantic way possible may want to harken back to the days when poetry was the primary way lovers expressed their affection for each other.

Poets have been putting pen to paper for centuries, and many great works evoke the themes of love and romance. Those with little experience writing their own poetry can always borrow heartfelt words from some of history's greatest bards.

#### John Keats

Keats was an English Romantic poet who lost both of his parents at a very young age. As Keats grew older, he was introduced to a circle of literary men, including Percy Bysshe Shelly William Wordsworth. Keats decided to try his hand at poetry as well and went on to publish many poems now considered among the greatest ever written. Tragically, Keats died from tuberculosis at the age of 25. But thy eternal summer shall not fade,


Nor lose possession of that fair thou ow'st,

# Who can represent you before the IRS?

Many people use a tax professional to prepare their taxes. Tax professionals with an IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN) can prepare a return for a fee. If you choose a tax pro, you should know who could represent you before the IRS. There are new rules this year, so the IRS wants you to know who can represent you and when they can represent you. Choose a tax return preparer wisely.

Representation rights, also known as practice rights, fall into two categories:

- Unlimited Representation
- Limited Representation

Unlimited representation rights allow a credentialed tax practitioner to represent you before the IRS on any tax matter. This is true no matter who prepared your return. Credentialed tax professionals who have unlimited representation rights include:

- Enrolled agents
- Certified Public Accountants
- Attornevs

Limited representation rights authorize the tax professional to represent you if, and only if; they prepared and signed the return. They can do this only before IRS revenue agents, customer service representatives and similar IRS employees. They cannot represent clients whose returns they did not prepare. They cannot represent clients regarding appeals or collection issues even if they did prepare the return in question. For returns filed after Dec. 31, 2015, the only tax return preparers with limited representation rights are Annual Filing Season Program Participants.

The Annual Filing Season Program is a voluntary program. Non-credentialed tax return preparers who aim for a higher level of professionalism are encouraged to participate.

Other tax return preparers have limited representation rights, but only for returns filed before Jan. 1, 2016. Keep these changes in mind and choose wisely when you select a tax return preparer.

Each and every taxpayer has a set of fundamental rights they should be aware of when dealing with the IRS. These are your Taxpayer Bill of Rights. Explore your rights and our obligations to protect them on IRS.gov.



If you have a gain from the sale of your main home, you may be able exclude up \$250,000 of the gain from your income (\$500,000 on a joint return in most cases).

If you can exclude all of the gain, you do not need to report the sale on your tax return

If you have gain that cannot be excluded, it is taxable. Report it on Schedule D (Form 1040)

#### Loss

You cannot deduct a loss from the sale of your main home.

Worksheets are included in Publication 523, Selling Your Home, to help you figure the:

#### Reporting the Sale

Do not report the sale of your main home on your tax return unless:

- You have a gain and do not qualify to exclude all of it.
- · You have a gain and choose not to exclude it.
- You have a loss and received a Form 1099-S. More Than One Home

If you have more than one home, you can exclude gain only from the sale of your main home. You must pay tax on the gain from selling any other home. If you have two homes and live in both of them, your main

home is ordinarily the one you live in most of the time.

Example One:

You own and live in a house in the city. You also own a beach house, which you use during the summer months. The house in the city is your main home; the beach house is not.

Example Two:

You own a house, but vou live in another house that you rent. The rented house is your main home.

#### **Business Use or Rental** of Home

You may be able to exclude your gain from the sale of a home that you have used for business or to produce rental income. But you must meet the ownership and use tests.




