





#### VOTERS OF OESJ SCHOOL DISTRICT..READ CAREFULLY

# VOTERS IN THE OPPENHEIM, EPHRATAH, SAINT JOHNSVILLE SCHOOL DISTRICT MUST: STOP....LOOK...AND... LISTEN.

Don't be fooled again. The Superintendent and certain school board members can SPIN the spending of OUR TAX DOLLARS until the "cows come home" but don't be fooled by their "slick" words. If you believe them again, what is your future?

This school district is violating the New York State Education law which states that no school district is allowed to hold in fund balances (tax dollars) more than 4% of their annual budget. Before the fund balance (tax money) transfers which occurred in June 2015, this district was hoarding more than 17% excess tax money in fund balances.

This is YOUR money. You have paid it every year in your school taxes.

These excess dollars could have been refunded to the taxpayers, but were not. At the June 4, 2015 school board meeting, this school board passed a resolution to transfer \$900,000 of this excess money to four (4) fund balances which decreased the excess money being held to 11.7%. But this is still over the 4% mark allowed according to NY State Law.

When you were given the detailed information about the merger of two school districts into one new school district, it was presented to you that "no school would be closed". This is the main reason that the merger vote was passed.

Before the vote count could hardly fall into place and the merger completed, there was a direct movement by a select number of school board members along with the superintendent to close the elementary school in Saint Johnsville. This was done in a surprise vote at the school board meeting of May 7, 2015. The motion was brought to the floor during the Building and Grounds Committee report by board member Lee Quackenbush. He asked for a vote on closing the David H. Robbins Elementary School at that time. This motion was passed 6 to 1 by the school board that night. Jason Romeyn voted NO. Closing the elementary school was not on the agenda of that particular school board meeting. At that time, the school board began the process of completing the agendas of certain school board members to close the elementary school in Saint Johnsville.

Just as soon as the merger vote was completed and possibly before, the school board has been working with their architect firm of March and Associates. They were basing their decision on the recommendations of this firm whether to build a new facility or remodel the buildings already here. The school board has hired many, many "consulting" firms during this time. All of these many, many "consulting" firms have been very costly and these firms must be paid out of the taxpayer's money.

The student's education was not and never has been the first and foremost priority of the school board. Their motive is to build a "world class" facility, which in their minds would equal a "world class" education. But, ask yourself, does the curriculum and instruction of the students even count? Does a new or remodeled building make any difference in the student's education? VERY LITTLE TAX MONEY IS SPENT ON THE STUDENT'S EDUCATION.

The excessive fund balances and the state incentives that were ear marked for this district due to the merger is "burning a hole" in the pockets of certain school board members and a new or remodeled elementary school facility in Oppenheim and building a new elementary auditorium in Oppenheim is their answer for a "world class" education.

Ask yourself: How can a newly remodeled building and building a new auditorium at the elementary school in Oppenheim help any student get a "world class" education? Wouldn't great teachers and better curriculum and instruction be the answer to a "world class" education?

It seems that the personal agendas of certain school board members and superintendent is to use the remodeled school buildings and new elementary school auditorium in Oppenheim as a monument to themselves. VOTERS, THIS IS AT YOUR EXPENSE.

In the well spoken words of Superintendent Halloran in the Currier-Standard-Enterprise newspaper issue dated February 12-16, 2016, the OESJ News, Spring 2016 edition that was distributed to the local residents on Tuesday, March 15, 2016, and now the Original Pennysaver issue dated March 26, 2016, please don't be fooled again. Just DON'T FALL FOR THEIR MOTIVES AGAIN.

How can you believe that your school taxes will not go up again, and soon?

How can you believe that any of their "smooth words" will be true when all through the article is "POSSIBLE, POSSIBILITIES" which is very vague and these words will "cover" any of their promises in the future if their "possible and possibilities" do not materialize?

How do you know if the next motive of this school board and the superintendent will be to close the high school now located in Saint Johnsville? This school board closed DHR elementary school after you were PROMISED IT WOULD NOT BE CLOSED. Do they again have a HIDDEN AGENDA now?

We must stand together and do what is the best for our district as a whole, and what is best for each and every one of you.

Remember: There have been many, many promises which have not come true. How do you know if there will even be state or federal aid to help pay for this "Capital Project". Folks, our state and country is in a terrible situation. There have already been rumors that much of the state and federal aid is not available and will not be available until our state and country can come to grips with the gigantic debt they both face.

How can the state or federal government give something they do not have?

On May 17th there will be a school board election. We must REPLACE the school board members on this board whose terms run out this year. We must replace as many of those board members that have personal agendas and have little or no respect for the voters in this district. The greater of these two building projects is the remodeling of the elementary school in Oppenheim and the building of a new auditorium at the elementary school there. WE URGE YOU TO VOTE NO.

In Superintendent Halloran's article, he stated that the capital reserve is to "keep it until we are ready to use it to offset future tax increases". Is this the REAL reason, or is the reason really to use our tax dollars for the remodeling of the elementary school in Oppenheim, building of an auditorium at the elementary school in Oppenheim, and to remodel the high school building in Saint Johnsville?

HOW CAN WE TRUST THIS SCHOOL BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT?

Proposition #2 is to set aside money to purchase new school busses or to use as an emergency fund in case of a bus breakdown. But, again, how can we really know?

There has been a board member, who was elected by the people, that was forced to resign by this board and superintendent. 



for both you and the dog. Right now our family has a lovable Golden Retriever puppy named Buddy. Here's some interesting and educational experiences we had at a dog training class run by a local nonprofit organization.

On the night of the first class, we loaded Buddy into the van (Buddy fears the van and hates to get in to go somewhere). "Hmm," said my mom, "I think we should train him to get into the van himself." Then we drove to dog training class. As we walked in the door the dog trainer's Golden Retriever began letting off woofs and barks that literally bounced off the ceiling. I almost had to hold my ears. Buddy cringed in fear. Somehow, we got to the other side of the gym. With Buddy's arrival training class got under way.

The first thing we learned was attention! Your dog can't be trained unless he pays attention. We made Buddy sit in front of us and then we waited until he looked at us. Buddy didn't do so well at that. All he wanted to look at was the other interesting dogs and that person with the fascinating squeaky ball on the other side of the gym. When we finally got him to look at us he was rewarded with a treat yum, yum, smack, slobber, drool.

The next thing was the "sit." The way you make your dog to sit is to point your finger at him and say "Sit." He probably won't at first, so you help him by putting your hand on his back above his hind legs, and pushing down gently. This should make him sit. Buddy did pretty well on this because we had practiced it with him at home.

The next part was "leave it." The trainer held a treat in front of Buddy in her right hand while hiding a better treat in her closed left hand. When Buddy left the right hand treat alone the trainer gave him the better treat. This is very useful because sometimes when the neighbor's cat is in your yard, you may want to tell him to "leave

Then the trainer taught "sit stay." I made Buddy sit beside me on my left side. Then I took two steps in front of him starting with my right



foot, and faced him. After waiting a few seconds I returned to him and praised him. One thing that is even harder is to tell your dog to sit, and then to walk the whole way around the dog. Well-trained dogs will stay sitting when you do this.

After that was the "down" command. Please understand that we did not learn all these things in one night. Dogs are like toddlers and can only learn a little bit at one time. To train "down," we made Buddy sit, and put a treat close to his mouth. Then we moved the treat down from his twitching mouth to the floor and moved it along the floor in a straight line away from him. To follow the treat he had to go down on the floor.

After that we tried training Buddy to heel. This did not go so well. Instead of heeling, being a timid dog, he went down on the floor and lay there. Efforts to get him up were fruitless. To heel you must walk around keeping the dog beside you.

Then we did the "come." The trainer held the leash while the owners went a little distance away. Then the trainer dropped the leash and each owner called the dog's name and "come" loudly. Most of the dogs ran to their owners, but Buddy ran straight to a plump cheerful lady sitting in the sidelines. Another dog ran straight past his owner who tried to grab him as he went past.

Training your dog is a must if you want a polite well-mannered dog. I suggest that if you have a dog that you want to train, you should take him to a dog training class like we did with Buddy. The trainer said "We don't train your dog for you, we teach you to train your dog." Buddy didn't do so well at first but after a few times he got used to it and is coming along fine. You need to have patience when you train your dog. Then you and the dog can have hilarious fun. Buddy is a great pet full of love and...dog slobber.

# Whatchamacallits





I've recently been loaned a box of very interesting tools that will comprise the next few Whatchamacallit columns. The common factor for all of them is that they were once in common use in many villages. The craft they were used in has been making a recent comeback due to the popularity of craft beverages.

If you haven't guessed by now, this week's Whatchamacallit is a pair of tools used by the cooper or barrel maker.

The long tool — flat on one end and pronged on the other — is a Flagging Iron, AKA Stave Wrench and Rushing Lever among other things and was used mainly when fitting a new stave into the barrel or for flagging (inserting a flag or 'shim' to aid a tight fitting head).

It was held horizontally with one prong inside the cask and one outside, then the cooper would push sideways on the flat part of the iron with his hip forcing the top of the stave outward allowing him use of both hands to make the necessary adjustments.

The shorter tools with the key-like handle are Cooper's Vices. Very simply, the tool was twisted (or screwed) into the head of the barrel — but not all the way through — in order to lift it into place to seal it. It was then unscrewed and removed.

## Distracted driving a real threat

Dating back to the days of the first automobiles. drivers have always taken on a degree of risk when getting behind the wheel and hitting the open road. While technology has done much to mitigate that risk, it's also contributed to the growing number of distractions drivers face on the road.

Distracted driving is a significant threat. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2012 more than 3,300 people were killed in crashes involving a distracted driver. Just a year earlier, 17 percent of crashes in which someone was injured involved distracted driving.

Those figures are even more disturbing when one considers the problem of underreporting with regard to distracted driving. The National Safety Council notes that underreporting of mobile phone use leading to car

crashes makes the issue of distracted driving appear less substantial than it likely is. Perhaps because they fear potential citations or even possible incarceration, many drivers involved in crashes do not admit to using mobile phones while driv-


But a 2011 CDC study found that distracted driving is a genuine threat. In the study, survey participants were asked how often they had read or sent a text message or email while driving in the previous 30 days. Nearly one-third of study participants in the United States admitted that they had, and those figures were similar in Portugal and Belgium. In addition, 69 percent of U.S. drivers between the ages of 18 and 64 reported that they had talked on their mobile phones while driving in the past 30 days.

Combatting distracted

driving is not easy. As the use of mobile devices grows, many people are finding it increasingly difficult to put those devices down, even when they are behind the wheel of their automobiles. But there are some steps drivers can take to improve their awareness on the road.

One such step is to reduce reliance on handsfree devices. Though it might seem as though hands-free devices are the ultimate weapons against distracted driving, the NSC reports that more than 30 studies have shown that such devices do not make drivers any safer. That's because drivers remain distracted by the conservations they have while using handsfree devices. Reports from the NSC, Texas Transportation Institute and AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety indicate that drivers talking on handheld or hands-free

# Four reasons for a check engine light

Vehicles rely on many components working harmoniously to function at optimal capacity. Any number of systems can go wrong, and oftentimes the first indication that something has gone awry is an illuminated dashboard signal.

One such signal is the "check engine" light. Many drivers have little idea what to do when this indicator lights up, and this light can cause some anxiety. According to Consumer Reports, a check engine light turning on does not usually require immediate action. However, it does mean that you should make an

appointment to have the vehicle inspected for potential problems.

Check engine lights are part of a car's onboard diagnostics. The light turning on may indicate something minor, such as a loose fuel cap, or something more serious like a misfiring engine. When the light turns on, drivers wondering why may want to see if the answer is related to one of the following issues.

1. Loose gas cap: Fuel vapors can leak out and air can get in when the fuel cap isn't secured correctly. This can compromise the fuel system and make the check engine

light come on. Take off the cap and then reseal it to see if that alleviates the problem. Cracked caps will need to be replaced.

2. Dirty oxygen sensor: A faulty or clogged sensor may not provide the right information about unburned oxygen from the vehicle's exhaust. This sensor monitors how much fuel is burned. Compromised data can cause a decrease in fuel

efficiency. Some do-ityourselfers can replace an oxygen sensor on their own, but those who can't should have the issue addressed immediately by a professional.

3. Too much speed or load: Towing a trailer or another heavy item may put strain on the vehicle and cause the light to come on because of loss of power. Lightening the load and reducing speed

can help fix the problem. Always consult with the owner's manual to determine the towing capacity of your vehicle.

4. Short or faulty code: Computers aren't always fool-proof, and sometimes an electrical short or another similar problem can cause a light to come on. Bring the vehicle to an automotive supply store. Such stores typically have diagnostics tools that can be hooked into the car's computer and provide a more detailed understanding of what is triggering the check engine indicator.

In many cases, a steady check engine light is not a serious concern. However, when such a light comes on, drivers should try to find out why as soon as possible.

devices can fail to see as much as 50 percent of their surroundings. When driving, stick to driving so you can focus all of your attention on the road, where it belongs.

Another step drivers can take to improve their awareness on the road is to educate themselves and their teenaged drivers about the dangers of distracted driving. A University of Utah study found that drivers using mobile phones had slower reaction times than drivers with a .08 blood alcohol content, which is the legal intoxication limit in many states. If more drivers realized that speaking on their mobile phones impairs their reaction time even more than driving drunk, then perhaps more people would put down their phones and continue their conversations once they reach their destinations.

Finally, drivers who recognize their habits can take steps to prevent those habits from putting them in harm's way. If you are never too far away from your mobile phone and unable to resist the urge to read and/or answer a text message or email, turn your phone off and put it in the glove compartment before you hit the road. Doing so might just save your life and the lives of your passengers and fellow motorists.
