SOUTH MINDEN, NY - Living in a rural farming community definitely has its advantages. Fresh air, friendly people, and room to stretch your legs to name a few perks. However, with farming and working with heavy machinery, there is always the possibility of something going wrong. And when it goes wrong, it can go very wrong. This forethought is exactly why the South Minden Volunteer Fire Department decided to take a preventative

strike against farm accidents, mainly tractor rollovers. They enrolled in a Farmedic class taught by Erik Merrell, an instructor working with McNeil & Co., a specialized risk management insurance company from Cortland, to learn how to properly handle a real life catastrophe.

Merrell taught a 16hour class over the course of two days that covered topics ranging from silo emergencies to treating farm injuries to chemical hazards. Mike





Smith, 1st Assistant Chief, said that they chose to take this class to, "expand training in order to better serve the community."

After the instruction portion of the class was finished, the South Minden Firefighters were ready to test some of their newly learned extrication skills. They staged a tractor rollover at the Smith Dairy Farm in South Minden, with an International tractor donated by MacFadden and Sons Inc., of Sharon Springs.

After tipping the tractor over onto a strawstuffed dummy, the crew set to work going over what they would do in an actual situation. They started off by stabilizing the patient. This is done first in order to make the

patient more comfortable as well as ensuring that moving the tractor will not cause more injury. Once the patient was stable, the next step was to determine how to best lift the tractor off him without causing more harm. After a few minutes discussing the tipping and leverage points of the tractor the crew sprang into action.

Using a series of high jacks and "air bags" (flat bags that when filled with air can hold almost 55 tons) the crew began raising the tractor. Placing the bags and jacks was no easy feat however, because a tractor on its side doesn't have the same lift points or strength that an upright tractor would.

Hello Again,

A big important question: Does the Mohawk Valley and the entire United States suffer from the same malady? What title or name should we give to the malady? How about, "We know how to get into trouble and don't know how to fix it or get out".

Let's start with the 1st World War (1917), commonly referred as World War I. Woodrow Wilson was President. The U.S. entered the war at a low point for the allies. The allies, our friends in Britain and Europe, were being slaughtered by a series of German offenses.

History claims at that stage over two million U.S. troops were engaged in the war. By 1918, due to the giant infusion of American men, President Wilson received credit for being one of the most important fathers of victory.

I wonder what would history have to say if we stayed a while longer and all of Korea had been re-united as one democratic nation.

Due to lack of space we will skip over the Vietnam conflict. How can we express Vietnam as a war word, other than to say millions of Americans felt we should not have sent our troops there – period.

As time goes by it seems that the anti-war protesters may have been right. The unanswered question remains – what did the U.S. gain from entering and staying in the Vietnam conflict?

Now we are still suffering, that is the entire world is suffering from the Iraq conflict. Being there may have been a mistake but the way our President Barack Obama prematurely pulled U.S. troops out, creating a gigantic mess, helped create ISIS. Only time will tell if ISIS will become the most powerful enemy the entire world including the United States will ever face.





Safe driving techniques have changed

Driving today is different than it might have been when many motorists first earned their drivers' licenses. As a result, safe driving techniques have changed. Learning these changes and adjusting driving habits can keep motorists and their passengers safe.

- Watch the clock. Older guidelines indicated keeping hands on the steering wheel at the positions of 10 and 2 if you were imagining it as a clock. New information indicates this can be dangerous to the arms and hands should the air bag deploy in a crash. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and AAA now say you should grip the wheel at the 9 and 3 positions, which safely allows drivers to maintain control of their vehicles.
- Change your turns. Air bag safety also comes into play when making turns. Rather than the formerly taught way of hand-over-hand turning, drivers should push with one hand and pull with the other to steer the wheel safely keeping their hands away from the plastic casing and the possible release of heat and pressure from an exploding air

bag.

- Use hazard lights only when real hazards are encountered. Some people are very generous in their use of hazard lights, turning them on when double-parking, in bad weather or when they are carrying a heavy load. Various states and areas have specific laws governing the use of hazard lights, including when and when not to use them. Hazard lights may inadvertently put drivers in danger because they can override turning signals. Some other drivers have become so accustomed to seeing hazard lights that they may not take them seriously. Esurance suggests checking local laws to determine which situations warrant using hazard lights.
- Don't block the "fast lane." The far-left lane has long been considered the passing lane. Although some police departments have become more lenient in allowing drivers to actually stay in the left lane, it's still courteous to use it as infrequently as possible. When you do find yourself in the left lane, recognize that you should maintain highway speed or accelerate slightly to get around the car you

- need to pass. Driving slowly in the left lane can compromise your own safety and that of your passengers and fellow drivers.
- · Anticipate road conditions. There are differences between driving on rural roads, paved roads and heavily trafficked highways, especially during inclement weather or when encountering adverse conditions. There's no magic speed or technique that is ideal all of the time. Drivers need to learn to adapt to the conditions to facilitate safe passage. Keep in mind that it can be difficult to stop on gravel, wet roadways or those covered with leaves.
- Avoid the big rush. Always try to leave extra time to reach a destination. This way you will not have to speed or make tricky maneuvers to get to an appointment on time. Rushing around can lead to distractions or unsafe practices. Reduce your accident risk by building extra time into your trip.

roadways, and many of them could likely be prevented by the right set of tires.

As El Niño looms in the West, and the inevitable showers approach elsewhere, drivers across the United States should turn their attention to the rubber that meets the proverbial - and also very literal - wet road.

Nearly a quarter of all car crashes are caused by weather, according to the U.S. Department of Transportation. Of those, nearly three quarters can be attributed to wet pavement. When roadways are slick, dangers such as skidding and hydroplaning quickly become concerns. Tires can be the best defense against such hazards, as a healthy, reliable set of tires will give your vehicle the traction it needs to safely stop and corner on slick roadways. Before the tires can do their job, drivers will need to take a few steps of their own.

Before you hit the road, know what to look

for on your tires.

Tire tread helps to channel rainwater safely between your tires and the road - but only if there's enough tread available to do so. When new, tire tread runs 9/32 of an inch deep. Tires are legally worn out with just 2/32 of an inch of tread remaining, but this doesn't leave enough depth in wet conditions.

Tire Rack, America's largest independent tire tester and consumer-direct source for tires, makes an even safer recommendation. "When rain is a concern, as it will be for much of the U.S. throughout the spring, drivers should replace their tires when they reach 4/32 of an inch of remaining tread depth," says Woody Rogers, product information specialist at Tire Rack. "By the time you reach 2/32 of an inch, your tires won't have enough tread to avoid hydroplaning."

To make sure that your tread is deep

enough to keep your tires firmly rooted on the surface of the road. Tire Rack recommends a simple quarter test. Place a quarter upside down into the grooves on your tires. If some part of George Washington's head is covered by tread, then you have at least 4/32 of an inch left. "The difference between 2/32 of an inch and 4/32 is admittedly very small," Rogers says, "but the impact on safety is quite large."

If hydroplaning occurs, coast carefully.

Hydroplaning happens when water on a road-way and vehicle speed combine to cause one or more of your tires to lift from the surface of the road. When this happens, the vehicle's steering wheel will likely jerk, and the vehicle could pull abruptly toward the puddle.

"Slowing down in rainy conditions is always a good idea, but it may not be enough for the surprise waiting up ahead. Having the appropriate

tread depth is a must for preventing hydroplaning," Rogers says. "If you do hydroplane, grasp the steering wheel firmly and avoid slamming on the brakes. Braking could end up worsening the skid, causing you to lose even more control of the vehicle." Driving in the rain is never fun, but with the right tires, it can at least be safer. Whatchamacallits -




This week's Whatchamacallit features two tools that would have been used in tandem as part of a construction job. They were used to make the male and female ends of wooden utility piping (or pump logs).

The earliest mass water distribution systems were made of wood.

In the U.S. some of these date back to the late 18th into the 19th centuries. According to sewerhistory.org some cities in the UK used wooden piping 500 years ago. The earliest ones were individual logs, bored out by hand and laid end to end.

Our tools were used to finish either end of the log into male or female joints in order to secure two pump logs together or to the pump head. The fittings were hand-bored and needed no gasket.



didn't stop the crew though as they found several secure lift points and began lifting the tractor up. While speed is important in extricating a patient, it is more important to take the necessary time to ensure that the tractor is stable, thereby avoiding more injury to the patient or injury to those on the scene.

In order to stabilize the tractor they lifted it in increments and after each lift they placed supporting blocks underneath the tractor to ensure that the tractor would not go any lower than it already was or shift from side to side.

After a few lifts and a lot of cribbage, they were able to safely pull the patient out. From there they would be able to stabilize the patient again for transportation to the nearest hospital for further treatment.

Spending two days taking classes and performing a hands on rescue are good ways to broaden the capabilities of these volunteer firefighters. It does the heart good to see volunteers taking

such initiative to better help those they protect. Hopefully more local volunteer firefighters will have opportunities like this in the future.
