

Alzheimer's workshop at Canajoharie Library encourages participants to "Know the Signs"

"Early detection matters!" emphasized Mea-DeMento, Alzheimer's Association Program Manager for Fulton, Montgomery and Schoharie Counties.

DeMento was speaking to a group assembled at the Canajoharie Library for the workshop aimed at identifying early detection of the disease.

DeMento said she always begins the workshop by asking attendees to close their eyes and imagine they are on a train, not knowing where they are going or who the other passengers are. When you imagine that you are trying to question the other passengers, you discover they speak a different language. When you become frightened and try to get off of the train you are restrained and forced to stay on, even forced to

is what she said it is like to have Alzheimer's dis-

The frustration of both the patient and the caregiver is immense. "What they're going through may be worse than what the caregiver is going through," acknowledged DeMento.

Several testimonies were shown in a power point presentation, where highly educated professionals that have been struck with the disease, talked about their symptoms and how it has affected their lives.

Fifty percent of people living with Alzheimer's are undiagnosed," De-Mento reported.

Six out of 10 will wander. Many will get lost while driving. Most will not dress properly for the weather; wearing sleeveless shirts or shorts in the winter. Personal hygiene change dramatically.

"Age is the biggest risk factor," DeMento said. "The incidence is higher in women."

The condition may be linked to hormonal change.

Symptoms include loss of short term memory and repeatedly asking the same question, chal-



Wait for the correct weight oil

(BPT) - Most vehicle owners know it is important to regularly have their motor oil changed. Many owners may not know that choosing any oil weight other than the one specified in their owner's manual could damage their engine.

"My dad taught me to switch oil weight depending on the season and the driving conditions. I used 10W-40 or straight 30 weight oil in summer and switched to 10W-30 in the winter," says Rock-Auto.com Vice President, Tom Taylor. Conventional wisdom for old cars said oils with higher weight numbers had a thicker viscosity that would make them better for hot weather and hard driving while lighter weight oils were better for cold weather.

The newest engines are often designed to use only one specific oil with a weight number that may be unfamiliar, such as 0W-20 or 0W-40. Do-

ing something like substituting "heavy duty" 20W-50 for 0W-20 in the summer could quickly result in big repair bills.

Oil does much more these days than simply lubricate and cool the engine. Engine oil may act like a hydraulic fluid in engines with variable valve timing, cylinder deactivation or other new systems that are pressure sensitive and route oil through tiny orifices. "We see variable valve timing solenoids that are clogged by dirty oil, but they also get clogged by clean oil that is just the wrong viscosity," says Taylor.

Using the right weight oil is made more difficult by all the gas stations and convenience stores that still sell 10W-30 for old cars but do not have the shelf space to stock the many different oil types for newer cars. Do not top off your engine with the incorrect oil because that is all a store carries.

Also, do not choose 10W-30 simply because it is less expensive. Newer engines may take seven or 10 quarts of oil. When buying that much oil, it can be tempting to buy a cheaper weight.

Putting the wrong oil in your engine could cost you much more money down the road. "Imagine an engine oil pump designed to circulate seven quarts of low viscosity 0W-20 oil rapidly around

a motor now struggling to move some witch's brew of various weights," savs Taylor.

If you hire a shop to change your oil, then make sure they use the correct oil for your engine. Always wait until you can get the oil weight specified in the owners' manual.

Safe driving tips: how to get the most out of your tires

(BPT) - A tire's tread depth significantly affects driving safety. In fact, to ensure a vehicle drives safely, the National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration recommends a tire be replaced once its tread depth reaches 2/32nds of an inch. Winter tires should be replaced even sooner.

Worn tires cause more than just headaches for drivers. Less tread means longer braking distances and more difficulty handling a car. This is especially true in slippery conditions because the tires are not able to effectively clear water from underneath causing the vehicle to hydroplane.

The contact area between the tire and the road is dramatically reduced when tires wear out and when driving speed increases. While driving 50 mph in 1/8 inch of water, the contact patch between the tire and road is only 16 percent compared to the contact patch of a stationary vehicle.

"Unfortunately, many drivers don't regularly check the depth of tread on their tires. People check tread depths when fitting the tires, but then blissfully forget about them for the entire season," says Matti Morri, technical customer service manager, Nokian

Monitoring the condition of tires throughout their lives helps drivers maintain safety on the road. So, what steps should you take to ensure you get the most out of your tires?

1. Monitor and rotate your tires.

Tires wear unevenly, especially on front wheel drive vehicles where the front tires wear down much quicker than the rear tires. For this reason, you should monitor

the tread depth throughout the season and rotate tires from front to back, providing the tire size is the same on both axles.

If a set of tires are installed in the spring and used heavily until the start of autumn without being rotated, it is completely possible for the front tires to be worn down while the rear tires still have up to 70 percent of tread left.

Rotating helps to minimize the performance and grip differences between the front and rear of the car for more predictable handling.

2. How to measure tread depth.

A U.S. penny is a handy tool for measuring the main grooves in the center of a tire's tread. Insert the penny into the main groove so that the edge of the coin touches the tread and Lincoln's head is upside down. If the top of Lincoln's head remains visible from the groove, the tires are fully worn.

Some new tires on the market have innovative tread wear indicators to alert drivers when their tires need replacing. In fact, all new models from Nokian Tyres come fitted with a Driving Safety Indicator (DSI) that indicates how much tread is remaining, as well as a raindrop or snowflake symbol that appears once the tire has worn down to the point where the vehicle could handle unsafely on wet roads.

3. Minimize tread wear through proper inflation.

To help extend tread life, maximize fuel economy and optimize a vehicle's performance, it's important to check a tire's air pressure once per month in the summer and twice per month in the spring and fall when there are large fluctuations in temperature. Tire over-and under-inflation cause tread to wear quicker than normal and can potentially result in a dangerous blowout. Additionally, under-inflation will cause your vehicle to use more fuel (or reduce range in an electric vehicle) and diminish the performance of your vehicle as it requires more effort to for the car to move.

For the most accurate pressure reading, check the tires while they are still cold. Driving heats up the tires causing the air inside to expand resulting with an inaccurate reading. The correct tire pressure for the vehicle and tire size combination can be found on a placard in the driver's door jamb, on the inside of the gas cap, or in the vehicle's owner's manual. Remember also to check the pressure of the vehicle's spare tire (if equipped).

Drivers should keep these simple tips in mind throughout the spring and summer to help ensure a safe driving vehicle and to get the most out of their tires.

Kitchen Diva: Freeze a little summer

The key to enjoying the best summer berries all year long is hidden inside your freezer. A little prep time and cold temperatures are the secret to enjoying fresh summer flavors even in the depths of winter. Not only are berries a tasty treat, they're a healthy one, too. The June 2013 issue of Tufts University Health and Nutrition Letter reports on results published in the journal Circulation that "women who ate the most strawberries and blueberries — three or more servings per week — were 34 percent less likely to suffer such an early heart attack."

Researchers followed about 93,600 women aged 25 to 42 for 18 years, checking in periodically to see what they were eating and how it was affecting their health. The heart health benefits were likely due partly to the presence of anthocyanin, an antioxidant compound found naturally in bright red fruits like strawberries.

Tufts University researchers also have studied older rats that would approximate 65 year old humans. After various berries were added to the rats' diets, they were put through a series of tests to evaluate memory (comparable to remembering where you parked your car) and balance (comparable to us walking on a slippery, ice covered sidewalk).

Pretty much every berry studied — blueberries, strawberries, blackberries, cranberries — improved learning, memory and balance in aging rats. Early results have led researchers to move forward with studying these potential benefits using human subjects.

Berries offer other health benefits as well. One cup of strawberries provides 140 percent of the recommended daily allowance of vitamin C, more than a medium orange. They also provide 16 percent of recommended dietary fiber. This fiber content makes strawberries low on the glycemic index, meaning they help slow the body's process of turning the berries into blood sugar, despite their sweetness. Strawberries also contain potassium, folate and more than 25 percent of recommended manganese, which helps process cholesterol.

Likewise, a cup of red raspberries has nearly 50 percent of the recom-

mended daily allowance of vitamin C and 30 percent of recommended fiber, as well as some potassium, magnesium, calcium and vitamin A.

For a nutritious, tasty treat that also may help memory and balance, consider eating fresh berries in the summer and follow the recipes below to preserve summer berries for the winter. Eating berries, whether fresh, preserved or frozen, all year long is a delicious way to improve your health.

Preserving Berries and suggested

Just before freezing, gently wash berries in cool water and pat them dry with paper towels. Remove and discard stems, leaves and any under-ripe or damaged fruit. Any of the suggested preservation methods below are a good way to store berries. Freezing berries with sugar helps retain their color and texture. Use berries frozen without adding sugar as an addition to quick breads or cakes.

- 1. Flash Freezing: Place berries in a single layer on a jelly roll pan; freeze until firm. Pack into zip top plastic freezer bags, leaving 1-inch headspace. Squeeze out excess air; seal and freeze up to eight months. Quick Tip: Add frozen berries to muffin, cake or quick bread batter; spoon over oatmeal or cereal.
- 2. Sliced, Crushed or Pureed: Add 1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar per quart of berries; gently stir until sugar dissolves. Spoon into plastic freezer jars, leaving 1/2-inch headspace. Wipe jar rims clean; secure lids. Freeze up to 12 months. Quick Tip: Use to top off shortcakes, stir into yogurt or layer in an ice cream parfait.
- 3. Dry Sugar Pack: Pat one quart of berries just until damp. Gently toss with 1/2 to 3/4 cup sugar. Place in a single layer on a jelly roll pan; freeze until firm. Pack into plastic freezer containers; cover and seal. Freeze up to 12 months. Quick Tip: Add frozen berries to cobblers or pies, stir into pancake batter.
- 4. Packing Berries in Syrup: Stir together one quart cold water and 2-1/2 cups sugar until sugar dissolves. Pack berries in wide mouth canning jars; cover with syrup, leaving 1/2-inch headspace. Wipe jar rims clean; secure lids. Freeze up to 12 months. Quick Tip: Thaw in fridge and use like fresh berries. Remember to drain and reserve the syrup to use as a topping for desserts or to sweeten and flavor drinks

Get fit the smart way

Exercise is an important component of a healthy lifestyle. Many people establish bold fitness goals with a mind toward getting in shape. • Don't eat heavy meals before exercising. Avoid large meals before engaging in strenuous physical activity. A light, healthy snack gives you a little fuel without affecting your ability to exercise. After eating, the body diverts blood flow to the gastrointestinal tract to aid with digestion. Exercising while this blood flow is centralized in the gastrointestinal tract may cause

muscle cramps or generalized weakness. Nutrition experts at the University of California, Los Angeles, say that people who exercise strenuously on a full stomach also may experience reflux, hiccups, nausea, and vomiting. Wait at least an hour after eating full meals to exercise.

- Warm up. It's important to warm up muscles before beginning a workout. Stretches, light movements and range of motion exercises can improve flexibility and prepare the body for more to come. If muscles aren't fully stretched and warm, injuries like strains and tendon tears may occur. Take the time to warm up; otherwise, you may find yourself on the sidelines.
- Wear the appropriate equipment. Invest in

quality athletic shoes and other equipment made for the activity you will be performing. The right equipment can help prevent injury. Athletic shoes that fail to provide adequate support can increase your risk of injury. Good shoes do not have to cost a fortune, as there are plenty of brands that will work quite well. If you need suggestions, discuss your exercise regimen and goals with a podiatrist or orthopedist. Orthotic inserts can be used to modify footwear and provide additional support. You also may need equipment specific to a given activity. For example, wrist supports and quality gloves are essential for kickboxing classes. Speak with a trainer or gym employee if you need assistance.

• Take weather into consideration. Ice, snow, rain, and wind can make jogging or other outdoor activities more challenging, if not dangerous. Always exercise caution when your workout regimen involves exercising outdoors. Stay indoors if you see thunder and lightning.

- Stay hydrated. The Better Health Channel of the Victoria State Government says a person can lose around one and a half liters of fluid for every hour of exercise. Drink water before, during and after each exercise session. If you need water while exercising, take small sips.
