

Honoring those impacted by September 11



September 11, 2001 is a day permanently etched in history. 9-11 carries profound meaning for many people and stands in infamy along with events like Pearl Harbor and the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King, Jr. The attacks on 9-11 resulted in a total of 2,996 fatalities. Among those were the victims on the four planes, civilians working in the towers and on the ground, military personnel and civilians in the Pentagon, and first-responders to the scenes. It is believed that at least 200 people in the World Trade Center fell or jumped to their deaths from the burning towers because rescue was improbable at or above points of impact on the towers. Along with the World Trade Center primary towers, many other buildings in the area were destroyed or badly damaged from the attack. Many buildings were condemned. The Pentagon suffered serious damage as well.

Thousands of first responders and civilians entered the affected buildings to search for or help people exit the carnage. As of 2010, it is believed that more than 800 of these responders have also died, some say from illnesses related to their heroic efforts.

While the world is quick to focus on the extensive damage and loss of life that ensued as a result of this terrible day, it also is important to focus on the survivors and those who risked their own lives to save people from burning and collapsing buildings. There are a number of ways to honor the legacy of these brave people.

Establish a memorial at your home, in a neighborhood park or at a place of worship. While many memorials exist, there is certainly room for more memorials devoted to the heroes of September 11.
Host a family get-together on or around

September 11. Celebrate the life of those people who were lost on that day and focus on the positive memories.

• Initiate a scholarship fund in memory of a lost relative or friend. Many businesses or even the place of employment of the deceased may be willing to contribute money to the effort. This way the individual's name will live on and be associated with something positive for years to come. • Volunteer time at a firehouse in the area or with an EMT unit. Volunteer EMTs and fire fighters are in short supply. Becoming a part of one of these units enables people to help others.

• Survivors can share their stories with school children or others, imparting knowledge about the events as they unfolded. This is a strong lesson in American history and bravery.

• Make a donation to a charity that offers financial support to those impacted by the events of 9-11. Be sure to check out the charity to ensure that funds are appropriated properly.

• Plan a visit to downtown New York Cityto see the progress that has been made in rebuilding the area, and visit the memorial that has opened to honor those who losttheir lives.

While September 11, 2001 will live in infamy as a traumatic and horrific moment in American history, people can focus on the positive aspect of the heroes and find ways to honor their memories.



TOWN OF EPHRATAH ZONING BOARD MEETING LAST CALL

The workshop on August 15th had a good attendance. It's clear the only people who are aware of zoning are opposed to it, and a large amount of people are still UNAWARE of it. It seems Mr. Bradt has already made his decision in favor of zoning well before the Town Board Meeting set for September 14. 

propped up outside a vendor's booth at the local farmers market. scrawled in dry erase marker, was a word I did not recognize: purslane. Everything else on the board was easily recognizable as a food product: tomato, zucchini, peppers—but purslane? The word sounded like the name of a forgotten Shakespearean heroine, or a brand of moderately priced leather shoes. Not a type of produce.

Curious, I asked to see a sample. After a few seconds of looking at the

On the whiteboard reddish stems and dark green, oblong leaves, I realized I had seen them many times before. This was a common garden weed. I'd seen all my life. I used to pull it out of the garden while helping my grandmother with her potato plants. Even now, there was some growing by the foundation of my house, and in the gaps in the pavement out front. It never crossed my mind to look up this plant's name, or even consider that a person could grow, pick, and sell it. I decided to buy some and try it out. That option certainly seemed wiser than just pulling it out from the cracks in the sidewalk!

> At home, I used some as a salad topping, and later mixed it into a zucchini dish. It added some light spicy crunch, and I imagined that it would also work well as a taco topping, or as a great way to accent a pork or pasta dish. While I looked up recipes, I learned that purslane is more than just a way to

make everyday food feel fancy--it is also boasts many significant health benefits. It turns out that this vegetable, which I had treated as a trash plant for three decades, is rich in:

• Omega-3 fatty acids (more than in many fish oils!) • Vitamin A (contains

more than most leafy green vegetables)

• B-complex vitamins • Minerals such as cal-





You could see the wheels turning inside his head, searching his vast knowledge of manual and mechanical implements.

The feature of this item that kept folks guessing are the numerous hinges, articulations, and swivels. It was a real "digit pincher" and you had to be careful while inspecting it — parts would swing about and shift without warning.

Once mounted in the proper way (see thumbnail inset), it makes perfect sense. Our Whatchamacallit is the handle and plunger mounting for an old wooden washing machine.



Country Preacher

Would you say that you have a life that would be described as abundant, superior, very high, even above measure? Looking only at the negatives in our life, few of us would say yes.
