## Fort Klock historic restoration in St. Johnsville

Fort Klock Historic Restoration and the Burning of the Valleys Military Association (BVMA) will host a Revolutionary War encampment at Fort Klock on Route 5 in St. Johnsville on Oct. 1 and 2. "Interrupted Harvest, 1781 valley raids" They will interpret "Rural Life Under Threat", a daily autumn routine on a fortified Mohawk Valley farm during the fall of 1781.

The site will come alive with interpreters performing life chores using 18th century skills and equipment, under nearly constant threat of attack from Lovalist and Native raiding parties. Almost a year earlier to the day, the largest Loyalist raid of the Revolution passed

by Ft. Klock as it spread its destruction throughout the Mohawk Valley.

The afternoon public tactical at 2 p.m. on Saturday and 1:30 p.m. on Sunday will be based on an Aug. 6, 1781 raid on a nearby-fortified homestead in the Mohawk Valley. On Saturday afternoon, at 3 p.m., the ladies will host "Great Necessities Call Out Great Virtues", telling stories of the experiences of courageous Loyalist, and Patriot Native

## Revolving quilt display for Fort Plain Library building fund raffle

FORT PLAIN —A quilt pattern reflecting what National Quilt Museum Curator Judy Schwender has described as "the desire for beauty using the language of flowers" was the inspiration for a vintage hand stitched quilt that the Fort Plain Free Library is raffling to raise money for ongoing construction. The traveling, "Carolina Lily" block quilt will be on display at the Fort Plain branch of NBT Bank from Sept. 12 to 30 before moving to its next destination.

As noted by Schwender in a document archived at www.quiltmuseum.org, the Carolina Lily block was "popular from the mid-1800s on." The upper, pieced section of the locally made antique quilt was given to local history buff Willis "Skip" Barshied by

Barsheid, and assembled with batting and a backing by local Amish quilters. It is the first place prize in the raffle.

For the second place Fulton raffle prize, County resident Liz Argotsinger will be creating a 4-foot x 4-foot quilt barn square based on the design and colors of the vintage quilt. Argotsinger has been instrumental in establishing and promoting the tourism related Fulton Montgomery Quilt Barn Trail which aims to "create a visual trail using quilt barn unique squares to connect the landscape outdoor throughout Fulton and Montgomery counties."

Raffle proceeds will go toward repairs and improvements to the 100plus year old Greek Revival structure and subsequent additions, which sustained extensive damage during devastating flooding of the village



## Safe driving tips: how to get the most out of your tires

(BPT) - A tire's tread depth significantly affects driving safety. In fact, to ensure a vehicle

drives safely, the National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration recommends a tire be replaced once its tread depth reaches 2/32nds of an inch. Winter tires should be replaced even sooner.

Worn tires cause more than just headaches for drivers. Less tread means longer braking distances and more difficulty handling a car. This is especially true in slippery conditions be-

cause the tires are not able to effectively clear water from underneath causing the vehicle to hydroplane.

The contact area between the tire and the road is dramatically reduced when tires wear out and when driving speed increases. While driving 50 mph in 1/8 inch of water, the contact patch between the tire and road is only 16 percent compared to the contact patch of a stationary vehicle.

"Unfortunately, many drivers don't regularly check the depth of tread on their tires. People check tread depths when fitting the tires, but then blissfully forget about them for the entire season," says Matti Morri, technical customer service manager, Nokian Tyres.

Monitoring the condition of tires throughout their lives helps drivers

maintain safety on the road. So, what steps should you take to ensure you get the most out of your tires?

1. Monitor and rotate your tires.

Tires wear unevenly, especially on front wheel drive vehicles where the front tires wear down much quicker than the rear tires. For this reason, you should monitor the tread depth throughout the season and rotate tires from front to back, providing the tire size is the same on both

If a set of tires are installed in the spring and used heavily until the start of autumn without being rotated, it is completely possible for the front tires to be worn down while the rear tires still have up to 70 percent of tread left.

Rotating helps to minimize the performance and grip differences between the front and rear of the car for more predictable handling.

2. How to measure tread depth.

A U.S. penny is a handy tool for measuring the main grooves in the center of a tire's tread. Insert the penny into the main groove so that the edge of the coin touches the tread and Lincoln's head is upside down. If the top of Lincoln's head remains visible from the groove, the tires are fully

market have innovative tread wear indicators to alert drivers when their tires need replacing. In fact, all new models from Nokian Tyres come fitted with a Driving Safety Indicator (DSI) that indicates how much tread is remaining, as well as a raindrop or snowflake symbol that appears once the tire has worn down to the point where the vehicle could handle unsafely on wet roads.

3 Minimize tread wear through proper inflation.

To help extend tread life, maximize fuel economy and optimize a vehicle's performance, it's important to check a tire's air pressure once per month in the summer and twice per month in the spring and fall when there are large fluctuations in temperature. Tire over-and under-inflation cause tread to wear quicker than normal and can potentially result in a dangerous blowout. Additionallv. under-inflation will cause your vehicle to use more fuel (or reduce range in an electric vehicle) and diminish the performance of your vehicle as it requires more effort to for the car to move.

For the most accurate pressure reading, check the tires while they are still cold. Driving heats up the tires causing the air inside to expand resulting with an inaccurate reading. The correct tire pressure for the vehicle and tire size combination can be found on a placard in the driver's door jamb, on the inside of the gas cap, or in the vehicle's owner's manual. Remember also to check the pressure of the vehicle's spare tire (if equipped).

Drivers should keep these simple tips in mind throughout the spring and summer to help ensure a safe driving vehicle and to get the most out of their tires.

## Wait for the correct weight oil

(BPT) - Most vehicle owners know it is important to regularly have their motor oil changed. Many owners may not know that choosing any oil weight other than the one specified in their owner's manual could damage their engine.

"My dad taught me to switch oil weight depending on the season and the driving conditions. I used 10W-40 or straight 30 weight oil in the summer and switched to 10W-30 in the winter," says RockAuto.com Vice President, Tom Taylor. Conventional wisdom for old cars said oils with higher weight numbers had a thicker viscosity that would make them better for hot weather and hard driving while lighter weight oils were better for cold weather.

The newest engines are often designed to use only one specific oil with a weight number that may be

unfamiliar, such as 0W-20 or 0W-40. Doing something like substituting "heavy duty" 20W-50 for 0W-20 in the summer could quickly result in big repair bills.

Oil does much more these days than simply lubricate and cool the engine. Engine oil may act like a hydraulic fluid in engines with variable valve timing, cylinder deactivation or other new systems that are pressure sensitive and route oil through tiny orifices. "We see variable valve timing solenoids that are clogged by dirty oil, but they also get clogged by clean oil that is just the wrong viscosity," says Taylor.

Using the right weight oil is made more difficult by all the gas stations and convenience stores that still sell 10W-30 for old cars but do not have the shelf space to stock the many different oil types for newer cars. Do not top off your engine with the incorrect oil because that is all a store carries.

Also, do not choose 10W-30 simply because it is less expensive. Newer engines may take seven or 10 quarts of oil. When buying that much oil, it can be tempting to buy a cheaper weight. Putting the wrong oil in your engine could cost you much more money down the road. "Imagine an engine oil pump designed to circulate seven

quarts of low viscosity 0W-20 oil rapidly around a motor now struggling to move some witch's brew of various weights," says Taylor.

If you hire a shop to change your oil, then make sure they use the correct oil for your engine. Always wait until you can get the oil

at least a year and approximately 70 re-enactors from around New York State took part in the weekend event, including Americans, British and Indians.

The weekend encampment also provided an opportunity for the public to see what life was like in colonial camps during the 1780's.

"This was the first reenactment of the raids on Currytown; celebrating the 235th Anniversary," said Root Town Historian Bill Maring.

Local re-enactor Richard Gaydos has been a re-enactor for 30 years. He said he believes historical re-enactments are important to the public. "They remind people of what the country suffered to make it what it is today," said Gaydos. "A lot of people don't appreciate it!"

Kruppenbacher

agrees. "These events are important for people to understand the history of where we came from in the Mohawk Valley, and what it took for people to survive in those days. Too often we lose focus on history thinking it is unimportant, but in reality history is what made us and shapes our future," Kruppenbacher said. "If we forget history we are too likely to repeat the same mistakes

we made in the past."

This adze was made for smaller, tighter curves.

It is also called a foot adze. The foot adze has a long handle and is capable of powerful swings using both hands and the cutting blade makes contact





with the wood at foot or shin level (hence, the name). It is made for the hollowing out of large work pieces like whole log canoes or large bowls. The adze is useful to remove large amounts of waste material quickly, roughing out the final shape, preparing it for finer work.

The hand adze is the short-handled version that is swung with a single hand. The adze's cutting blade is situated perpendicular to the handle as opposed to the ax whose blade is in plane with shaft.

## As warm temperatures persist across New York, state agencies partner to keep kids and pets out of hot cars

Across the country, heatstroke kills dozens of children left in hot vehicles each year, including 24 children in 2015

The New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), partnering with several New York State agencies, reminded New Yorkers to be aware of the dangers of leaving children and animals in hot vehicles as warm temperatures and humidity persist across the state.

"It is simple: leaving babies, toddlers, young children, and pets in cars when temperatures climb has deadly consequences," said DMV Executive Deputy Commissioner Terri Egan. "It is always important to remain alert and remember the dangers that rising temperatures in cars can pose to children and animals. Remember that there is no safe length of time or any good reason to leave a child or a pet locked in a parked car in the hot summer weather. By being vigilant and cautious, we can each do our part to prevent tragedies.'

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 661 children died due to heatstroke from 1998 to 2015; 24 of those deaths were just last year. Such tragic situations can happen to anyone, even the best of parents and caregivers, making it imperative to raise awareness of the issue. In 54 percent of cases in which a child died from heatstroke in a hot car, the child was "forgotten" by the caregiver, and in 29 percent of cases, children got into the vehicle on their own.

NHTSA reports that even cool temperatures in the 60's can cause the temperature to rise well

above 110 degrees inside your car. In fact, the inside temperature can rise almost 20 degrees within the first 10 minutes. NHTSA also reports that children's bodies overheat easily, and infants and children under four years of age are among those at greatest risk for heat-related ill-

Last year, the New York State Department of Health (DOH) released a video, "Keep kids out of hot cars!" to raise awareness of the issue. Health officials recommend that parents and caregivers follow these tips to keep children safe from heatstroke and from being left alone in a hot vehi-

errands? Running Take kids with you. Or use a "drive-thru" so you don't need to leave the car. Pay for gas at the pump.

Keep a toy or large, stuffed animal in your child's car seat. When you buckle in your child, move the animal/toy to the front seat. It will remind you that a child is in the car seat. Alternatively, put your briefcase, cell phone, or diaper bag in the backseat so you need to open the back door to get it. It will also remind you that a child is waiting for you.

Ask your childcare provider to call you if your child doesn't show up as expected, especially if there is a change of

Set a reminder or alarm on your cell phone to remind you to drop your child off at school, or have a loved one call you to confirm that your child was dropped off or picked up.

Put a "sticky" note where you will see it while in your car - on your dash or another spot. It will remind you where your children are and when to pick them up or drop them off.

Before you lock your car, always check the backseat and trunk or cargo area.

Anyone who sees a child alone in a hot car should not wait more than a few minutes for the driver to return, and should call 911 and get the child or pet out of the car. Stay with the child until help arrives, and have someone else search for the driver or ask the facility to page them. Warning signs of heatstroke vary, but may include red, hot, and moist or dry skin; lack of sweating; a strong rapid pulse or a slow weak pulse; a throbbing headache; dizziness; nausea; confusion; being grouchy; acting strangely.

"A hot car can be deadly to children and pets they should never be left behind for any amount of time in a hot parked vehicle," said Commissioner of Health Dr. Howard Zucker. "Heatstroke can happen in a matter of minutes. We're urging New Yorkers to remain alert to the presence of children and animals in their cars. And if they ever see a child or animal in a car alone, they should call for help immediately."

Other members of our families - including pets - are put in danger by being left in hot cars. Each year, pets suffer brain damage or die from

## Get the facts on rabies

The World Health Organization says rabies causes thousands of deaths every year, despite readily available tools to manage the disease.

Humans and animals can get rabies any time of year, though humans and household pets may be at greater risk in warm weather because that's when they tend to spend the most time outdoors. Children who spend time outside playing may be especially susceptible because they may not recognize rabies warning signs in animals afflicted with the disease.

Rabies might not be as rampant in North America as it is in other areas of the world, but it still is a dangerous threat.

#### What is rabies?

Considered a zoonotic disease, rabies is transmitted from animals to humans and vice versa. With the exception of Antarctica, rabies is present on all continents. In the United States, rabies has been reported in every state except Hawaii. The WHO reports that most cases of rabies in humans occur in rural areas where effective treatments are not readily accessible. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says half of the people

who die from rabies are under the age of 15.

Rabies was named for the Latin word "to rage." That's because animals that are affected by rabies can sometimes act as if they're angry. Pets may act strangely and become unapproachable. Rabies attacks the brain and spinal cord. As the disease progresses, animals can develop hypersensitivity to light and sound as well as paralysis of the nerves that control the head and throat.

#### How is rabies contracted?

Rabies is a virus that is spread through contact with saliva from an infected animal. This occurs when an infected animal bites another animal or person, but it also can be contracted if that animal licks a scratch or open wound. Being bitten or licked may not immediately cause rabies symptoms, however. WHO says thorough cleansing and immunization within a few hours after contact with a suspected rabid animal can prevent the onset of the disease. Once symptoms appear, such as fever and pain, rabies can be fatal.

#### Which animals get rabies?

Rabies only affects mammals naturally. These can include dogs, cats, cows, horses, foxes, and skunks. Many people attribute rabies to raccoons. The CDC has indicated that raccoons are the most common wild animal with rabies. In the United States alone, about 93 of every 100 reported cases of rabies are in wild animals.

#### **Rabies prevention**

Vaccinations can prodomestic pets against rabies. In fact, rabies shots are required by law in many areas.

People should steer clear of wild animals to avoid rabies. Never walk up to a wild animal and be careful of pets that are unfamiliar. Animals afflicted with rabies may exhibit peculiar behavior or act out of characters (i.e. nocturnal animals roaming during the day). Anyone who suspects a sick animal should promptly call the local animal control center and have an officer come and check it out.

Treated food is sometimes used to prevent the spread of rabies among wild animals. The animals eat the medicated food, which immunizes them

heatstroke or suffocation. Signs of heat stress in animals include panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, a staggering gait, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue. The Humane Society of the United States recommends the following tips for helping a pet left in a hot car:

Take down the car's make, model and license-plate number.

If there are businesses nearby, notify their managers or security guards and ask them to make an announcement to find the car's owner. Many people are unaware of the danger of leaving pets in hot cars and will quickly return to their vehicle once they are alerted to the situation.

If the owner can't be found, call the non-emergency number of the local police or animal control and wait by the car for them to arrive.

Dr. David Smith, New York's State Veterinarian, implores pet owners to never leave pets unattended in cars. "On a hot day, the temperature inside a parked car can hit 130 degrees in just 40 minutes - pets can die or get very sick from heat exhaustion in a closed car in very little time."
