Senior News Line: Should you redeem old Savings Bonds?

Do you have any old savings bonds tucked away, ones bought years ago to help a grandchild with college expenses? Or maybe you want to take care of all your credit card debt by cashing in bonds. Redeeming savings bonds isn't as easy as it used to be.

Savings bonds have been paperless for many years, and you can't just buy or redeem them anywhere now. There are some banks where you can cash in your bonds, but the preferred method now is to do it online.

As a first step, go online to check the value of each bond. Try Savings-Bonds.com and use the calculator. Click the yel-

low box ("Get your bond values here") and select the details of your bond from the drop down menu. It's not necessary to include the bond's serial number if your other details (series, face value, date issued) are correct.

You'll get a color coded message at the top. Red, for example, means that your bond isn't earning interest and should be cashed in. Blue means the bond is less than five years old, and you'll forfeit three months in interest if you redeem it too early. Before you can get a printout list of your bonds, you'll need to enter your email address.

Look at the In the News section for specific information about how your interest can affect your taxes. When you cash in bonds, you'll get a Form 1099-INT showing the interest you earned. You might have to pay taxes on it.

If you have paper bonds that you don't want to redeem yet, you can have them switched to digital. Your best bet: Ask your bank if it redeems savings bonds, and let it help you.



2. Add the onion and cook, stirring often, until golden, about 10 minutes. Transfer to a bowl. 3. Add remaining 2 tablespoons oil to the Dutch oven and heat until hot but not smoking. Add the apples and cook, stirring often, until lightly browned, about 3 minutes. Add the cabbage, apple juice, vinegar, brown sugar, thyme and bay leaf, and stir well to coat the cabbage. The creel is all original and intact, although there are no identifying marks on it to know who made it or



in design and has been well cared for.

The history of this knife manufacturer however is quite phenomenal. The entire history is found at



www.mman.us/jrussellco.htm, but I'll give you the abbreviated version.

John Russell was born March 30,1797 in Greenfield, MA, and learned his father's trade of goldsmith as he grew. By age 21 he decided to try something else and moved south and made enough money in cotton that by age 33 he retired from the cotton business, married a girl from Lancaster, PA and lived there for the next two years.

Deciding he didn't care too much for the idleness of retirement he moved back to Greenaxes under the name J. Russell & Co. in order blade.

to acquire the skill and knowledge necessary to expand his product line. His tools quickly

earned a reputation for quality and endurance. By 1834 he was ready to start manufacturing cutlery, which was his original intent. To make a very long and interesting story short enough to fit this space, during the 1840's — just in time for the westward expansion of the U.S. — J. Russell & Co.'s "Green River Works" began making what became known as the Green River Knife. This knife became a favorite of cowboys, buffalo hunters, Indians, settlers, miners and emigrants. The words: J. Russell & Co / field and started manufacturing chisels and Green River Works are clearly marked on the






