Collecting: Art Deco

Q: I have become fascinated by Art Deco after purchasing a cocktail set from the 1930s at a flea market in Chicago. Can you recommend a good general reference? Laura, Naperville, IL

A: Judith Miller claims in her new book, "Art Deco: Living With the Art Deco Style," that Art Deco completely transformed all branches of design, from the fine and decorative arts to transport, product design, fashion, graphic design and even architecture. The clean lines of Art Deco make it

classic and timeless, and she points out what to look for as a collector.

Miller is considered an expert of antiques and collectibles and frequently appears on television, both in America and the U.K. Her book explores all the key collecting areas with chapters on furniture, glass, ceramics, sculpture, metalwork, silver and jewelry, prints, posters, rugs and textiles. Miller's handsome, lavishly illustrated book also features accurate, up to date pricing. Her book is published by Millers/Mitchell Beazley.

This might be a good place to begin your exploration of Art Deco.

9: During the 1940s, I attended a Nelson Eddy concert in Springfield, Illinois, with my parents and brother. How can I find out the date of the concert and approximate value of the autographed program I have? — Betty, Decatur, Illinois

A: You will have to become a detective to find the date of the concert. I suggest you begin your investigation by tracking down the microfilm of the newspapers published in Springfield at that time. Contact the venue where Eddy appeared to see if it has records of the event. Your signed program is worth about \$25, according to several autograph dealers I contacted.

Q: I have a small dish that I believe was made by the Powelton Cut Glass Company. What can you tell me about the company? — Barbara, Albuquerque, New Mexico

A: The Powelton Cut Glass Company was established in Philadelphia in about 1910. During its first six or seven years, the company produced brilliant cut glass patterns on heavy blanks. After 1918, it focused on light cut wares and painted designs on glass, according to "Glass A to Z" by David J. Shotwell and published by Krause

Fort Plain Museum: 350 years of firearms

On Oct. 27, 2016 a large group of firearm and history buffs met at the Fort Plain Museum and Historical Park to learn more about the history and progression of firearms. John Phillips, who has been collecting guns since he was five years old, brought part of his collection to show

how far rifle technology has come. Starting with wheellock rifles and ending with cartridge weapons that are similar to what we use today. This presentation was the third of four free events put on by the Fort Plain Museum in order to allow the public a glimpse into the history of Mohawk Valley. Phillips used to give a similar presentation to 7th and 8th graders in school as a way of bringing history into the classroom. "There's something about holding it in your hands

that really brings history alive," says Phillips.

One of the first duns dis-

One of the first guns displayed was a wheellock musket made with an ivory and rosewood stock. The firing mechanism on this is similar to a flintlock but the ignition system makes a full circle before lighting the fine powder. Next came the classic flintlock that Phillips brought a wide array of. These guns were the backbone of early American hunting. Willis 'Skip' Barshied also brought a pilllock rifle, a little known

step between flintlock and percussion cap fired guns. The pilllock mechanism uses the same material as a percussion cap but instead of a brass cap, it was just a small bead about the size of a mustard seed — that is put in a small hole leading into the barrel. The hammer of the gun was sharpened, crushing the bead, which caused the fulminates to detonate. This particular gun was made in Salisbury, NY.



Next was the percussion cap firing system that used the mercuric fulminate in a brass cap. This allows for firing even in damp or wet conditions. This allowed hunters and soldiers to be able to use their weapons in the rain. In 1777 the Battle of Oriskany was held up because the rain wouldn't allow the guns to fire. Phillips next brought out a Burnside cartridge rifle that while using cartridges also required a percussion cap as the initial ignition source.

Finally came cartridge rifles with primers that combined everything into one and what most people use today. Another was a Remington cavalry rifle that had a ring that could be attached to the saddle in order to prevent the rider from dropping his gun.

Another hunting tool shown was a German hunting knife that had a long blade accompanied by a small gun barrel on either side of the blade.

Many expressions came from these early guns, such as a "flash in the pan" or "lock, stock and

barrel." Guns were a crucial part of early life in America, while most people associate them with defending or attacking, the main use of guns was hunting and a good gun was irreplaceable when trying to put food on your family's table.

John Phillips also brought a replica set of the Aaron Burr and Alexander Hamilton dueling pistols. There were 200 replicas made to commemorate America's Bicentennial. A little known fact about the pistols, which were chosen by Hamilton, is that there was a secret hairpin trigger that was set by pushing forward on the trigger when the gun was cocked. While this could have given Hamilton an advantage in the duel he was shot by Aaron Burr and died from the wound 30 hours later.

Muskets and rifles al-

lowed early settlers to put food on their tables, protect their livestock and protect their land. The progression made in weaponry shows the ingenuity and creativity of those interested in making a better a better tool for survival.



How to stay healthy when dining out

Dining out is wildly popular. The convenience of letting someone else do the cooking and the opportunity to try new types of cuisine is too great to resist for many people.

According to Zagat's 2016 National Dining Trends Survey, people go out to eat (not counting breakfast) an average of 4.5 times per week. While it can be easy to count calories and adhere to other dietary restrictions when eating at home, that's not always the case when dining out. Fortunately, there are ways for people who love to go out to eat to have their gourmet cuisine and eat it, too.

• Request that items be cooked a certain way. While diners might not be able to order off-menu dishes, they can try their luck at asking for dishes on the menu to be prepared a certain way. For example, if a menu is loaded with fried foods, try asking for dishes

to be grilled instead of fried. Researchers affiliated with the Harvard School of Public Health found that people who ate fried food at least once per week had a greater risk of both type 2 diabetes and heart disease than those who avoid fried foods, and that their risk increased with each additional fried meal they consumed. In addition, researchers also found that eating fried foods away from home posed the greatest risk, as the frying oil used

may not be fresh. Reused oil is more easily absorbed by foods than fresh oil that has yet to degrade, and that increased absorption can contribute to high cholesterol, high blood pressure and weight gain. Many

restaurants are amenable to diners who want to avoid fried foods, but diners must ask.

- Eat only half the meal. Restaurant portions tend to be bigger than portions diners would make for themselves at home. In fact, the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute notes that food portions at restaurants have doubled or tripled over the last 20 years. Diners who want to dine out but prevent overeating can ask that half of their entrées be boxed before the meal even makes it to the table. In addition, avoid appetizers and choose coffee or tea as dessert instead of high-calorie and sugar-laden baked or frozen desserts.
- · Make sure salads are healthy. Some diners mistakenly believe that all salads are the same. However, salads loaded with bacon and cheese and smothered in creamy dressings can be just as detrimental to diners' waistlines as large entrées cooked in an unhealthy

way. When ordering salads, make sure the salad is loaded with healthy fare like raw vegetables and choose a low-calorie, low-fat dressing.

· Peruse menus before leaving home. Perusing menus online before leaving home allows diners to find restaurants that offer the kind of healthy fare they're looking for. Arriving at a restaurant without knowing its menu increases the chances that diners will simply choose something

from the menu, regardless of how healthy it may be.

Health-conscious diners can still enjoy nights out on the town without sacrificing their waistlines or putting their long-term health in jeopardy.

While few would likely be shocked to learn that so many people enjoy dining, the types of restaurants consumers prefer reflects a trend that might not have been so important as recently as a decade ago.

The National Restaurant Association notes that 68 percent of consumers sur-

veyed for the organization's 2016 Pocket Factbook are more likely to visit a restaurant that offers locally produced food items. Locally produced foods not only support the local economy, but also tend to be more eco-friendly, as fewer natural resources must be used up to get them from the farm to the dinner table. That preference for eco-friendly food might also explain why 60 percent of consumers are more likely to choose restaurants that offer eco-friendly foods than establishments that provide no such offerings.



Paw's Corner: Picking the perfect cat

Dear Paw's Corner: I'm really excited — my mom has decided we can get a kitten! We're going to adopt one from the local shelter. Do you have any advice on picking the best cat? — Jaynah and Sherar in Poughkeepsie, NY

Dear Jaynah and Sherar: First of all, congratulations! It's exciting to get your first pet. And I'm glad you're choosing to adopt from a shelter.

While I've always liked to say that we don't pick

cats, they pick us, that's not entirely true. Sometimes it takes a little time to find that perfect fit. With kittens, it's even harder, because they're almost universally cute.

When you visit the shelter, ask if you're allowed to play with the kittens before choosing one, or to observe them in a play area outside of their cages. Note how they interact with each other and with humans. Are they confident or aggressive? Standoffish, or anxious

and shy? Will they play with a toy or string that is dangled in front of them?

Note the kittens' general health. It's easy to spot a potential problem if a cat is listless, won't play, has visible sores, shakes its head frequently or has trouble walking. Most shelters are open about a cat's known health problems. That way potential owners can decide if they want to take on the costs of bringing an adopted cat back to health.


Again, take your time and don't commit to one kitten immediately. If there are multiple shelters in the area, check them out as well.

And of course, once

you've found your new friend, be sure to schedule a checkup with a veterinarian to give it the

healthiest start with your family.

In keeping with the maize harvest season theme from last week, our Whatchamacallits this week are items the Iroquois made from the cornhusks.

This doll was made by Ethel Nellis Barshied (1930-2006), who was lovingly referred to as "The Pumpkin



Lady" by many. Our example is many years old and still looks as pretty as the day she was made — even the corn silk hair is intact and supple.

Northeastern Native Americans most likely have been making cornhusk dolls since the

beginnings of corn agriculture. Some were made for amusement, but others were used in healing ceremonies.

The mask is representative



of types made for use during curing and other ceremonies. According to www. nativetech.org, the masks were usually woven by women but only worn by men during the ceremony. The masks were of different sizes and were made for different purposes, such as the Midwinter Ceremony and the Green Corn Ceremony

(in spring).

Cornhusk masks are still used in authentic tribal rituals today and are considered by the Iroquois to be sacred objects in their cultural context.

There were two types of husk

masks. Ours shows the type using braided husk roping spiraled and sewn together to hold its shape. The other type was entirely woven (not sewn) into the face shape.

Corn was the staple grain for tribes across the continent and every part of the ear was used in some way. Other objects made from

the husk include rope and twine, kindling and filling for pillows and mattresses, containers, mats and other household items.

Indicators that it's time to change air filters

Vehicle maintenance can protect drivers' investments and help their automobiles run efficientlv. One area drivers should pay particular attention to is their vehicles' air filters. When operating at optimal capacity, an air filter improves fuel efficiency while ensuring vehicles accelerate smoothly without taxing the engine. But when air filters are clogged, fuel efficiency is reduced and emissions are increased, a 1-2 punch that costs motorists money and hurts the planet at the same time. Drivers can check their owners' manuals to determine the recommended intervals to replace air filters, but the following are a handful of indicators that suggest it's time to change them.

- Gas mileage: Unless you just purchased your vehicle, you likely know how many miles you can drive on a full tank of gas. If that gas mileage is suddenly slipping and you find yourself visiting the filling station more frequently, then it might be time to replace your air filter.
- Engine light: Drivers may be alerted to engine issues when the "Check engine" lights up on the vehicle's dashboard. This light may come on to indicate a problem with the air filter, as clogged air filters reduce air flow to the engine, resulting in an imbalanced air-fuel mixture that adversely affects the engine.
- Starting and idling problems: Vehicles sometimes don't start up as smoothly as they once did, and drivers may also notice vehicles are not idling smoothly. These symptoms may indicate misfiring spark plugs that are being polluted (and made less effective) by a dirty air filter that is


reducing the flow of air to the engine.

- Acceleration difficulties: Automobiles that are operating at peak capacity accelerate quickly. But dirty, worn out air filters adversely affect acceleration. Drivers who notice that their cars are struggling to accelerate when stoplights turn green or on highways may need to replace their vehicles' air filters.
- Dirty air filter: Perhaps the biggest indicator that an air filter needs to be replaced is the filter itself. If you cannot find the air filter on your own, consult your vehicle owner's manual to determine where it is. Once you find the air filter, examine it in broad daylight. Clean air filters are white, so if the filter has darkened, it may need to be replaced.




