

# Local volunteer organizations reach out to flood victims

Herkimer-Oneida Organizations Active in Disasters (HOOAD) is reaching out to residents to assess the needs of individuals in Herkimer and Oneida impacted by the recent flooding and to make them aware of how they can easily connect to resources and services that are or may become available. HOOAD is a group of volunteer, private, not-for-profit and government organizations, and businesses that support local relief efforts after a disaster or emergency. This local organization is modeled after the National Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters (VOAD) that has for many years worked to assist communities affected by disasters. "Many people don't realize that we have this local partnership of organizations made up of a variety of public, private, not-for-profit, volunteer and business organizations in place to coordi-

nate and assist with immediate and long-term needs that arise after a disaster," said HOOAD Chairperson Mike Scalzo. "The beauty of HOOAD is that its broad membership of organizations allows us to better identify needs and leverage and link those affected by a disaster to assistance that they may not be aware of," he added.

Residents may report their needs to HOOAD by calling 2-1-1, a toll free, health and human service hotline that can be dialed 24/7 to connect callers to existing local services quickly and easily. Calls are confidential and free. Here are some of the types of calls that 2-1-1 receives after a

- "Our basement was flooded, and even though it was pumped out, there's still mud."
- "My furnace and hot water heater were flooded out and I didn't have insurance."


- "We were flooded and now there's mold. What can I do to be sure we are safe?"
- "Ever since the flood, I've been really depressed. Whom can I talk
- "Where I was living was flooded. I've been staying with friends and family ever since, but I need to find a permanent solution."
- "I'm on SNAP and lost food because our power was out for so long. How can I get food for my family?"

Sometimes, especially after an event like a flood, it may take time to mobilize help. There isn't always an available service to meet the needs of every caller. In these times, 2-1-1 will take the individual's name and contact information, so that if services become available, they can be contacted and connected later. "Calling 2-1-1 and identifying your unmet needs makes it easier for local

disaster responders to identify what types of help are needed," said Betty-Joan Beaudry, Director of 2-1-1 Mid-York. She continued, "For example, if 2-1-1 receives many requests for basement clean out assistance after a flood, it becomes clear that this type of help is needed.

Knowing what the demand for clean-out assistance is makes it easier to make the case with volunteer groups specially trained in flood clean-up that their help is needed."

HOOAD and its many partner organizations want to assist, but it all starts with getting connected. If the recent flooding impacted you, please call 2-1-1 to request assistance and learn what services are already available. Some residents of heavily impacted areas may also receive this message in a direct letter HOOAD.

#### Why food safety is vital during pregnancy

9: Why are pregnant women at greater risk of foodborne illness?

**A:** When a woman becomes pregnant, she undergoes all sorts of physical changes that are necessary for her body to accept and nurture the growing baby in her womb.

One of those changes involves part of the mother's immune system called "cell-mediated immunity." When it's working normally, cell-mediated immunity helps fight the kinds of pathogens that move from cell to cell. This doesn't affect the part of the immune system that involves antibodies, which remains fully functioning during pregnancy.

Cell-mediated immunity is the type of immunity involved when a person has an organ transplant and the body rejects the new organ, thinking it's a foreign invader. When a woman becomes pregnant, the body suppresses this function to allow the body to accept the fetus.

That's all well and good, but it does put the mother and fetus at higher risk for some types of foodborne illness

According to foodsafety.gov, the federal government's hub for food safety information, the top five pathogens related to food poisoning during pregnancy are bacteria Listeria monocytogenes, Campylobacter, E. coli and Salmonella, and a parasite, Toxoplasma gondii. Depending on the pathogen and the severity of the illness, these can cause miscarriage, premature birth, stillbirth or birth defects in the fetus, as well as serious health problems for the mother.

Food Safety for Pregnant Women, online at foodsafety.gov/risk/pregnant, provides details about each of these pathogens as well as other guidelines, including:

- Avoid unpasteurized milk and products made from it. Soft cheeses, such as brie, feta, Camembert, Roquefort, queso blanco and queso fresco are frequently made with unpasteurized milk. Some hard cheeses are also made with raw or unpasteurized milk. Always read the label.
- Avoid unpasteurized juice or cider. Even fresh-

- What's on sale in February? Get great deals on electronics including computers and mattresses, carpet/tile/laminates and other flooring, used cars, catalog closeouts and exercise equipment. Also, look for gift add-ons with perfume purchases and after-holiday deals on candy and red items (think ahead for Fourth of July and Christmas tableware!)
- "We recently got a cute pot rack, but when we put up our stainless steel pots, it became clear that we weren't doing a great job of cleaning them — eew! My neighbor and best friend came to the rescue with a product called Barkeepers Friend. It's a scouring powder, but it doesn't scratch. Anyway, all the yellow stains on the bottom of our pots came off. And it de-grossed a castiron skillet too (we re-seasoned it). Our pot rack now looks great." — M.D. in Louisiana
- Fine particles of dust and grease mix in the air in the kitchen, and when they settle on things, it can get sticky! If you have a buildup of this sticky dust on appliances, try this trick: Make a paste from baking soda or cream of tartar and water. Apply with a damp sponge for a little gentle abrasive. Follow with a clean damp cloth. This works especially well on the top of the fridge
- If you dye your own hair, apply a border of petroleum jelly to the outside of your face at the hair line. This will keep those drips from staining your face. Apply some to your ears as well, and the back of your neck for the same reason.
- Don't forget to wash your kid's backpack from time to time. The places it goes and the things it sees make me shudder, especially in this cold and flu season.

squeezed juice has been associated with E. coli.

- Avoid raw seafood and be selective with smoked seafood. Both pose a risk from Listeria. Smoked seafood is okay only if it is canned or otherwise processed to be shelf-stable (the kind that doesn't need refrigeration), or is an ingredient in a casserole or other dish cooked to at least 165 degrees F.
- Avoid premade ham, chicken, tuna or other meat or seafood salads, such as those you can buy in a deli. Make them at home instead.
- $\bullet$  Don't eat hot dogs or lunchmeats unless you've heated them to steaming hot 165 degrees F.

• Be sure any eggs you eat are cooked until the yolk is firm. Any casseroles or foods containing raw eggs should be cooked to 160 degrees F. Avoid foods containing raw or undercooked eggs, including unpasteurized eggnog, cookie or cake batter, Caesar salad dressing, tiramisu, eggs Benedict, homemade ice cream and freshly made hollandaise sauce.

# Kovels: Antiques and Collecting

#### by Terry and Kim Kovel To My Valentine

Valentine's Day is a holiday that has its roots in ancient times. But it was celebrated with gifts until the first cards appeared about 1760. Cards were made at home, with drawings, poems, cutouts and other ways of expressing love. Since then, valentines have changed with the fashions and technology, and they are a popular collectible.

In 1848, Esther Howland of Worcester, MA, started making valentines from pieces of fancy paper lace and printed pictures with handwritten messages of affection. Soon, she was selling valentines to friends, and started a business that lasted until 1880.

The style of the valentine can help tell its age. Mechanical cards with parts that could move so a pictured girl could wave her arm were the newest type in the 1890s. Embossing also was popular. In the early 1900s to 1920s, postcards were used. Postage was 1 cent. Die-cut cards that could be punched out of a single sheet of stiff paper were developed around 1900. These often came as a set with 25 cards for students and one for the teacher. Folded cards were in style by the 1930s and these, plus photographs and digital cards, still are sent today.

Vintage homemade lacy cards made from paper lace, "scraps" and small shaped and printed pictures sell today for \$10 to \$100 or more. Age, condition and beauty determine the value.

**G:** I have a matching set of two High Point Bending & Chair Co. office-style walnut chairs labeled "Pattern No. 6711." They are in good original condition. How do I determine their value?

A: This company started as Siler City Bending Co. in Siler City, NC, in 1901. It made bentwood parts for carriages. In 1904, it was reorganized by Capt. Malvola Jackson Boling and renamed High Point Bending & Chair Co., after a nearby city. The company made bentwood chairs and other furniture. It became Boling Chair Co. in 1956. It

remained open until at least 1999. Your chairs, with swivel seats and rolling casters, are called banker's chairs. The price of your chairs is only about \$15. They are not in a style that is popular today, and old office chairs are not wanted. Wooden chairs are not as comfortable as the new padded or mesh chairs.

This handmade 1930s card is made from storebought paper lace and features small chromolithographed pictures of children and flowers. The printed cardboard background is made to fit in an envelope. A collector bought it for \$25 about 1980 and felt the message "To Miss Nash" on the back added to the value. It would cost about \$50 today.

#### Cranberry juice can boost heart health

Drinking two glasses of cranberry juice a day can lead to significant heart health benefits, according to a study led by Janet Novotny, an Agricultural Research Service (ARS) physiologist at the Beltsville Human Nutrition Research Center in Beltsville, MD.

Novotny gave 56 people either low-calorie cranberry juice or a similar-tasting placebo twice a day for 8 weeks and found that the juice lowered several risk factors for cardiovascular disease (CVD), diabetes and stroke. The 30 women and 26 men were given 8-ounce servings at breakfast and dinner in a double-blind study in which they ate only foods provided as part of the study.

The cranberry juice was sweetened with sucralose and had the same juice content (27 percent) and nutrients as most sugar-sweetened cranberry juice available in stores. The placebo was a flavor-matched, calorie-matched, artificially colored beverage. The research was funded by Ocean Spray Cranberries Inc. Ocean Spray provided the juice, but was not involved in conducting the study or analyzing the results.

After 8 weeks, volunteers given the juice had lower levels of 5 of 22 indicators of cardiometabolic risk in their blood, compared with volunteers given the placebo. The differences could be considered "a notable result," Novotny says. Cardiometabolic risk is the combined risk of cardiovascular disease (CVD), diabetes and stroke, which together causes more deaths in the developed world than anything else. CVD alone causes 930,000 deaths in the United States each year. Risks of developing CVD, diabetes and stroke can be modified with diet and exercise.

Previous studies have shown that cranberries are



rich in the types of polyphenols associated with a reduced risk of heart disease, diabetes and stroke. But Novotny's study is the first to show that cranberries confer such health benefits in a controlled-diet, double-blind clinical trial, which is considered the gold standard in health and medical research.



#### Protect vehicle paint finish

Perhaps nothing ages a car or truck more than a lackluster exterior finish.

evaporation and may oxidize and damage the paint, it's best to wipe away as much residual moisture as possible with a chamois.

#### Paint protection

Waxing can prevent bird droppings, berries, splattered bugs, and more from sticking to the paint and wearing down the finish. Waxes come in paste, liquid and spray. Each type has a different reapplication schedule, so drivers should consult the product instructions.

Vehicle owners also can invest in spray films to further protect painted surfaces. Do-it-yourself products are applied like a spray and then dry to an invisible, durable film. This helps protect against insects, gravel, sand, winter salt, and even road grime. Different manufacturers offer protection films.

It is important to safeguard the exterior of a vehicle to help it look newer longer, protecting the value of the car or truck while also protecting it against the elements.


#### Your vehicle has a recall ... now what?

Vehicles are expensive. When motorists drive their vehicles away from a dealership, they hope to travel many miles before they need to come back for maintenance. But manufacturers sometimes issue recalls that can affect drivers of both new and old vehicles.

Recalls are safety precautions taken should a portion of a vehicle or the entire car or truck not operate in the manner it was intended. In many instances, auto manufacturers will directly contact

customers who are affected by a recall via a letter, email or both. Individuals also can stay current on recalls by visiting the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's website (www.NHTSA.gov).

According to AutoTrader, recalls are becoming more common because of the complexity of modern vehicles. NHTSA flagged nearly 22 million vehicles for safety issues in 2013. and that number is on the rise. Drivers can follow these important steps if they learn of a recall.



- tions. A recall notice should come with instructions. Instructions often advise drivers to take their vehicles to the dealership where the cars were purchased. Notices may provide information regarding nearby dealerships for drivers who have moved since buying their cars or trucks.
- No payment should be necessary. The cost of repairing the recalled part should not fall on your shoulders. Such repairs are paid by the manufacturer. The financial resource Bankrate.com

notes that, "if you had the repair made before the recall was issued (up to a full year), the automaker is legally obligated to reimburse you, as long as you had the work done at one of its franchised dealers." Save all receipts for the work. If work was done by a private mechanic, drivers still may be eligible for reimbursement.

- Be patient. Dealerships are not responsible for making repairs until the date indicated on the recall notice, so motorists may need to wait before having their vehicles repaired.
- Request a loaner vehicle. In some instances, recalls may take a few days to fix. Although not every dealership may make loaner vehicles available, it's still worth requesting one so you are not inconvenienced.

Anyone having difficulty with a recall can contact the NHTSA online, by phone or by mail. Those

who suspect a safety problem also can contact the agency and report their concerns.





Recalls can affect any vehicle. Follow the instructions on the recall notice and have the problem addressed promptly.

Soon the concept caught on, and many other women began "showering" future brides in such a manner. Naturally, as presents became larger and heavier, the tradition of literally showering the bride with gifts was modified — but the name has stuck.

Bridal showers are designed to equip couples with many of the necessities to start their new life together. This custom is believed to have evolved from an old dowry system, in which a bride was expected to bring valuables to the marriage. The dowry was originally intended as compensation for the burden of supporting a wife placed on the groom. Some parents of the bride were not rich enough to afford an ample dowry, so friends and family members would offer small gifts to help offset this financial responsibility.

Today, both the bride and groom are equal partners in the marriage, bringing together their collective wealth. However, showers are still held regardless of the financial need of the bride as a way to offer good wishes before she embarks on her new journey.

#### Ginger-crusted salmon with melon salsa

Spicy and fresh, this easy dinner of rich salmon and melon-hot pepper salsa is healthy and anything but bland.

- 2 cubed cantaloupe cut into 1/3-inch pieces
- 1 cubed honeydew, cut into 1/3-inch pieces
- 1/4 cup packed fresh cilantro leaves
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh mint leaves
- 1 jalapeno chile
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- 2 tablespoons grated peeled fresh ginger

#### Whatchamacallits



Although still in use today, the pickaroon has been a tool used by those in the lumber industy for a long time. This Whatchamacallit comes from a time before machines carved out the metal pick.

Lumber has always been a big industry, and it continues to be dangerous and physically strenuous. To decrease the danger and expedite the process, many devices have been created. The pickaroon, or hookaroon, was created to help move cuts of wood or felled trees with minimal effort.

Pickaroons were also used in log drives, or moving logs down river to sawmills or paper mills. This was to help the logs from damming up the river and stay moving.

The metal head of the pickaroon has a pointed tip running perpendicular to the handle. The handler would have to simply swing the pickaroon and stick the tip into the wood that needs to be moved. At this point, the wood could be carried or dragged to whatever location the wood was being moved to. This saved energy and a literal backbreaking experience.

Many antique pickaroons can be found on the internet, but this particular one had no identifying mark to indicate a maker. It is made out of iron, bolted to the wooden handle by a bolt at the base of the hook and a nail placed in the handle.



#### by Keith Roach, M.D. Blisters may need medication for life

Dear Dr. Roach: A year ago, I broke out with pimples on my back, arms and thighs. They itched so badly I thought I would go mad. A dermatologist took a biopsy and told me it was an autoimmune disease called bullous pemphigoid. I was started on prednisone and doxycycline. When it cleared up, I would stop the medication, but it came back. The doctor said she thinks I'll have to take medication for the rest of my life. I don't like taking this medication, as it blurs my eyesight and I lose energy. I also have osteoporosis. I do take some vitamins. — G.B.

Answer: Bullous pemphigoid is an autoimmune disease that causes blisters, mostly in older adults. The blisters are large and tense (as opposed to pemphigus, an even more dangerous au-

toimmune disease, in which the blisters are soft). Bullous pemphigoid tends to come and go over months or even years. Diagnosis is confirmed by biopsy.

The usual treatment for bullous pemphigoid is a corticosteroid, either topical or systemic. Since it was over such an extended area of your body, your dermatologist decided on systemic, at a moderate dose of 20 mg. Prednisone has many longterm side effects, including making your osteoporosis much worse. Further, I am concerned that the blurry vision could indicate the onset of diabetes or a cataract, as both are strongly associated with chronic steroid use. Your regular doctor should be testing you for diabetes and treating the osteoporosis, and should make sure that you see the eye doctor.

Certain medications, such as the doxycycline

she started you on, can reduce your need for steroids. Other medications used for autoimmune disease can further reduce the need for steroids, but azathioprine, methotrexate, mycophenolate and others have serious side effects of their own. Nicotinamide, also called vitamin B-3, can make the doxycycline more effec-

**Dear Dr. Roach:** My adult daughter contracted ringworm or some other fungus from her beautiful Border Collie. She

has been using over-thecounter meds on the two of them for over 10 months! The dog is doing better than my daughter. Any solutions to get rid of this once and for all? — E.B.

**Answer:** Ten months is too long to treat something empirically. It's time to find out what this fungus might be, and that means a visit to a

dermatologist, who can do a culture of the infection to find out what it is. There are some unusual fungi that can be passed from animals (dogs, cats, pigs, horses, cattle) to humans and cause skin infection. Rarely is systemic treatment necessary.

#### **Country Preacher**

by Pastor Dan West

Those of us in evangelical churches (as our Baptist church is) often use the term "born again", but others may not know what it means or where it comes from. This term, of course, comes from the Bible, being first used by Jesus Himself. In **John 3:1, 2** we read that a religious leader came to Jesus one night and inquired of Him regarding the kingdom of God. Jesus answered him "... except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

As you follow this conversation over the next few verses, you see that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God (I Corinthians 15:50) so to be a part of it a person must have a spiritual birth — be born spiritually (John 3:5). Our first birth was only physical in nature. No one has ever had a spiritual nature or life at the time of their physical birth. (Adam and Eve were created [but not born] with a spiritual nature, but their fall into disobedience, sin, took that away from everyone after them.) So a second birth, a spiritual birth is needed to even see the kingdom of God (John 3:3) After our physical birth, we need to make the choice to be born again, born spiritually.

Peter writes of this in **I Peter 1:23** where he explains to believers "... Being born again, not of corruptible seed (that which is physical) but of incorruptible (spiritual), by the Word of God which lives forever," physical things like flesh and grass wither away and die (v. 24), but the Word of God is eternal (v. 25). Our physical body one day will cease working and die, but if we have made the choice to be born again, our soul will continue living in the presence of God for all eternity. Jesus continues to speak of this choice in **John 3:15-18**; whoever believes (trusts) in God's only Son (Jesus) will have eternal spiritual life.



#### Learn to break the procrastination habit

The idiom "Never put off until tomorrow what you can do today" has been credited to many people, including Thomas Jefferson, Mark Twain and Oscar Wilde. Regardless of who first uttered the phrase, it still rings true. Many people are guilty of procrastinating, which can affect their productivity and various other areas of their lives.

Procrastination can sometimes be a good thing, giving a person time to think through decisions more thoroughly instead of acting impulsively. Waiting to do something until a deadline looms also may motivate a person to work harder to complete the task at hand. Yet chronic procrastination can be a problem that affects one's job performance, academic success and general state of mind.

Psychology Today says procrastinating is often done to temporarily reduce a person's anxiety about a task or alleviate boredom or negative feelings toward the work at hand. Procrastination is more a symptom of emotions rather than a problem of poor time management. Experts in the field of psychology say that even though procrastinating may temporarily relieve anxiety or unpleasant feelings, procrastinating ultimately can increase negative feelings.

Resolving to stop pushing tasks into the future can be a worthwhile goal, but it's difficult.

"To tell a chronic procrastinator to 'just do it' would be like saying to a clinically depressed person, 'cheer up'," said Joseph Ferrari, a professor of psychology at DePaul University.

Individuals can instead employ these strategies to get focused.

- Set deadlines. Open-ended time frames for getting things done may be a procrastinator's worst enemy. Setting deadlines can provide the inspiration needed to get things done. Set reminders to help stay on task.
- Seek cognitive-behavioral therapy. CBT is a common type of talk therapy that is used as a tool in treating various mental health conditions and other situations. CBT helps a person become aware of inaccurate or negative thinking to change a view on challenging situations, says the Mayo Clinic. This way one can respond to them in a more effective way.
- · Identify feelings. Identifying why a person is procrastinating can help him or her get past the block. Fear, change, sadness, or lack of experience may be behind a person's tendency to procrastinate. Identifying the cause can help men and women overcome this hurdle.
- Break down the task. Dividing a challenging task into a handful of smaller tasks can make it easier to complete the project. Reward little successes, which will eventually add up to a big success.
- · Keep distractions at bay. Remove distractions from the environment, so they can't be used as a procrastination

Exercising more is a primary goal for many people, especially those interested in losing weight. Athletes also look to increase the time they spend exercising as new seasons draw near. While additional exercise can benefit many people, those who frequently perform weight-bearing exercises or repetitive motions, such as running, dancing and jumping, may find themselves battling shin splints.

Also known as tibial stress syndrome, shin splints are a condition

marked by pain in the shinbone, also known as the tibia. Shin splints are common among athletes and dancers who spend so much of their time on their feet. The Mayo Clinic says shin splints are caused by repetitive stress on the shinbone and connective tissues that attach muscles to the bone. Shin splints typically appear when there is a sudden increase in distance or intensity of a workout schedule.

Shin splints are characterized by tenderness, swelling, soreness. and/or pain along the inner part of the lower leg. While the pain may stop when the body stops exercising, eventually that pain can transform into continuous pain.

Many cases of shin splints can be alleviated through rest, icing and other self-care methods. Wearing proper footwear and modifying exercise routines can help ensure that shin splints are not a recurring problem.

Should shin splints not clear up on their own, or

if over-the-counter pain relievers prove ineffective at managing pain, then

athletes should contact their physicians. Doctors will likely try to determine

if the pain is caused by something other than shin splints.





#### Grieving cat needs comforting

**Dear Paw's Corner:** My 3-year-old cat, "Rascal," is having a terrible time adjusting since my other cat, "Fresca," died just a few weeks ago. He roams the house at night, meowing for hours, and doesn't always eat his food. What can I do to help him? — John C., El Paso, Texas

**Dear John:** I'm sorry to hear about the loss of Fresca. It can be surprising to learn that many animals go through a grieving process after losing a companion — whether human or animal. And, just as with humans, grieving can take time.

The best thing to do is to be supportive of Rascal. Recognize that you're both missing Fresca, and give Rascal plenty of attention and cuddles.

However, don't change his routine. Mealtimes should stay the same; playing and socialization times should stay the same (though you can extend the length of that play time).

If Rascal starts eating less or stops eating altogether, try encouraging him to eat by adding a little bit of warm (not hot) broth to his food. Stay in the room while he eats — many cats don't like being petted while they eat, but they often don't mind owners sitting nearby.

It may take as long as six months for Rascal to recover from the loss of his friend. Be as supportive as possible without changing his routine, or feeding him too many treats. If he stops eating for more than three days, still won't sleep or doesn't seem to be improving after a couple of months, contact the veterinarian.

#### Scammers at the door

The guy who showed up today came to the wrong door: mine. I pegged him for a scammer before he even said a word. And I was right. The only thing I didn't know was what kind of scam it was.

Turned out it was utilities. The guy claimed he was at the door at the request of my electric company to update my records. Then he said he only needed to scan my previous utility bill.

Wrong. I'd read about these guys.

First, I knew that my electric company didn't send him. Second, if I'd showed him my bill, he would have had my name and account number and would know what rate I pay.

The scam works like this: With all that information, they would offer me a ridiculously low rate. If I signed up, before I knew it, my electric bill would have gone up 400 percent. I'd be locked into a contract and would have to pay a lot of money to get out of it. If I didn't pay, they would send the bill to a collection agency, and it would show up on my credit report. So I shut the door in his face.

This particular scammer has a long history in other states, and there are class-action suits and investigations. They've targeted seniors, saying the local utility company had changed names and new information is needed, falsified signatures to sign up, come to the door again and again, misrepresented who they worked for, lied about rates and much, much more.

If someone shows up at your door with a clipboard and a photo ID hanging from their neck, it's probably a scammer. If they ask for any information, it's probably a scammer. Just shut the door.
