





Those old horse pistols



When I was very young I became interested in hearing grandfathers tell about their grandfathers serving in the militia of our state. When asking if they had any things military from long ago, these old men's memo-

ries went back into the 1800's when all able-bodied males had to belong to a militia unit. When I look back in conversations they would go about like this: "I have one or a pair or horse pistols and a sword Grandpa had in general training." There would be certain days the men of the unit would gather together to do some militia drills. It often seems that old established or wealthier family members would become officers. It cost money to equip as an officer. Most officers were mounted on horses. That is why pistols were called horse pistols. A pair of holsters and pistols were carried just ahead of the saddle. Officers also carried swords.

Occasionally fragments of uniforms still existed in local families however most had surrendered to moths. Note the cost of the "Regimental Suit" on John





H. Grame's (now Gramps) list of March 15, 1814. That was in the days of the War of 1812. At that period militia were sometimes required to serve on the northern boundary of the state — usually near Sackets Harbor. There still was a threat of British invasion.

This pistol and receipt are from the Gramps family of Stone Arabia, which had resided there from the early 1700's.





Kovels: Antiques and Collecting

Many artists don't create just pictures or sculptures. They make furniture, jewelry, dinnerware or even kitchen tools and toys. In the 1920s and '30s, there was a new title for these multi-talented artists: industrial designer. They redesigned existing large machines like trains or trucks, and small household goods like telephones and clocks. The result was better-looking objects that were less expensive to make.

Collectors today may not have space in their homes for the largest industrial machines, but they can find examples of smaller decorative items by these famous men. A few designers to look for are Russel Wright (dinnerware, furniture, aluminum); Henry Teague (Kodak camera); Henry Dreyfuss (telephone); Lurelle Guild (aluminumware, vacuum cleaner); Viktor Schreckengost (Cowan pottery, pedal cars, dinnerware); and Bjorn Wiinblad (posters, furniture, dinnerware and tapestries).

At a summer Rago auction in Lambertville, NJ, a 1970s Wiinblad table and six matching chairs sold for \$1,875. The black lacquered pieces had a different colorful modern design on each chair


back and tabletop. They are large examples of Wiinblad's talent. But his ashtrays and dishes, decorated with drawings of round-faced people in pseudo 19th-century clothes and often surrounded by vines, floral wreaths and trees, can be found online and in shops for less than \$50.

Q: I found four vintage baseball cards glued to the bottom of a dresser that I bought at an estate sale. The players are "Pete" Appleton, "Line Drive" Nelson, "Hank" Greenberg and "Red" Kress. I'm not a collector. Are they worth anything?

A: Your baseball cards are part of the 1940 set by Play Ball and issued by Gum, Inc., a Philadelphia company that made Blony bubble gum. It was the largest bubble-gum producer in the United States. Play Ball baseball cards were included with the gum from 1929 to 1941. The 1940 set included 240 different cards. In 1948 Gum, Inc. became Bowman, which was bought by Topps Chewing Gum in 1956. Whatchamacallits



This week's Whatchamacallit is identifiable to those in the scientific community, but less so outside of it. This interesting device is a cork borer.

This item is made out of brass and is stored by nesting one into the other. The sizes of the borers range from 10 to 14 mm. The only thing missing from this set is the item called the pusher, used to push out the item from inside the borer.


The use of this item was originally to punch holes out corks used in scientific experiments.

The borer is hollow and the cy- foods without completely comlindrical end would be sharpened before being pushed through the cork. The pusher would then be placed though the hollow of the handled-end and it would push out the cut remains.

This was, and still is, convenient for scientists. Since the mid-1800's, cork would be used to stop vials of chemicals in biology and chemical experiments. Boring a hold in the corks would allow tubes to be inserted into the vials.

Modern day scientists would use the borers for tree ring analysis, coring into fruits of vegetables, and to perform well diffusion assays.

Donna's Day: Creative Family Fun

Fresh-Air Fun

"Hey, come on, Donna, follow us...we're playing loop-de-loop," shouted barefoot five-year-old Eva gleefully, as she followed the freshly drawn trail in the damp sand that her older brother was marking ahead of her with his "magic" driftwood. Lured into the playful "follow the leader" game, I couldn't help but feel their childlike freedom to run forever in the salty air.

Spring is the season to get in the great outdoors and discover the elements of surprise that await your family. Here are some ideas for fresh-air entertainment:

• Tiptoe through the tulips

If you live near or enjoy traveling to Washington State's Skagit Valley; Holland, Michigan; or even the Netherlands, take in the glorious colors of fields of

tulips and daffodils in bloom. In colder climes, conservatories and greenhouses also provide an opportunity to walk pathways of spring's first flowers.

• Skip stones

On the shoreline of a calm lake or river, find flat stones. With bent knees, stand with feet parallel to the water's edge. Throw a stone sidearm with a snap of your wrist so that it skips off the surface of the water. Keep practicing until your stone skips several times.

• Practice concentration

When it's time to take a break, sit around a circle and play "First one to laugh." Choose a leader who tells everyone to keep a serious face. Then as he makes gestures, players have to imitate them without laughing. The last person left who keeps a straight face is the leader for the next round.

Or, play the "silent game." When the leader announces that the game begins, everyone has to remain quiet and listen to nature. The person who is silent the longest wins. Hiccups don't count!

• Classic schoolyard games

Play hopscotch, marbles, four square, kick the can, or set up a relay race.

• Make a touch-andfeel guessing game

When you return from the outdoors, empty out

nature finds and other items from the adventure. An older child or adult may sort through them and place interesting shapes and textures of things "players" will feel in separate tall containers. For example, dried seaweed from the beach in one container and shells, bark, feathers or leftover potato chips from lunch in another. Without peeking, each person places her hand in each container to determine what's inside. Encourage players to describe what it feels like (prickly, puffy, smooth) as they guess the contents.







Plastic surgery for pets

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: My 4-year-old pug, "Granby," is having surgery soon to correct a problem that makes it difficult for him to breathe. One of my friends said the procedure is nothing more than cosmetic surgery and that I ought to save my money. What do you think? — Mel in New York

DEAR MEL: For pugs and other short-nosed breeds, surgery is sometimes necessary in order for them to breathe better. If their nostrils are malformed or too narrow, they can be widened to improve airflow. Or, if the soft palate (at the top of their mouth) is too long and causing breathing issues, surgery can be done to shorten the soft palate.

While these may cause slight changes in Granby's appearance, they can drastically improve his quality of life and overall health.

Pets are increasingly receiving cosmetic surgery. A CBS report said that dog owners in the U.S. spent \$62 million in 2011 on such treatments. For pugs like Granby as well as many bulldogs and Boston terriers, corrective surgeries are often necessary. Likewise for shar-peis, which may need surgery to raise their eyelids, improving vision and preventing medical issues like scratched corneas.

However, other procedures are more cosmetic — lifting saggy skin around the face or abdomen, for example. And apparently some owners opt to give their dogs testicular implants after neutering, so they're (hopefully) less likely to notice or be bothered by the loss of their real testicles.

On the plus side, Granby's surgery appears to be medically necessary and might be covered by some pet insurance plans.








New York State Public Health Law requires that all dogs, cats and domestic ferrets shall have initial vaccinations administered against rabies no later than four months of age and stay up to date with re-vaccinations. Re-vaccinations are required one year later and a booster shot every three years. It is important to have pets vaccinated in a timely manner in order for the pet to be considered protected against the virus. Pet owners should bring proof of their pet's last rabies vaccination. This helps the veterinarian determine whether the pet will receive a one or three year vaccination; without it your pet will receive a one-year vaccination only.

Veterinarian administration fee for rabies vaccine is \$10 per vaccine. Other vaccines will be available at additional

To Your Good Health

by Keith Roach, M.D. Infection causes many Alzheimer's deaths

DEAR DR. ROACH: Our local newspaper just ran the obituary of a 59-yearold woman who died from Alzheimer's disease I didn't know her, but I've known at least two other people with that illness. One has passed away; the other is in a memory-care unit. How does Alzheimer's cause or contribute to death? -- A.

ANSWER: Alzheimer's disease is a common degenerative disease of the brain. It's unfortunately very likely that in the years ahead, you will know many more people diagnosed, as the risk increases with age. Its exact cause is unknown. We often think of Alzheimer's as being a disease of memory; however, personality changes, loss of insight, impaired visual skills and language dysfunction are other cardinal findings of the disease, though any of these may show more clearly as the disease progresses.

Alzheimer's can progress in individuals at very different rates, but the mean survival after diagnosis has been reported as three to eight years. People with Alzheimer's disease usually become debilitated due to poor nutrition and hydration, which leads to increased

risk for infection, one of the most common causes of death in Alzheimer's.

I don't mean to suggest that debility is the fault of the caregivers of people with advanced dementia. Caring for a person with Alzheimer's disease is a difficult and demanding task - physically, mentally and emotionally. But no matter how devoted and skillful the care is, there is no preventing the physical decline that happens as the Alzheimer's progresses; we can only slow it down. It has been my experience that in patients with advanced dementia, the caregiver becomes the most important part of the team to get information from and give guidance on care and provide support to.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm pushing 90 years old. I developed large, blue veins, similar to the varicose veins my mother had in her legs. What are these called on the hands? I read that Hollywood stars get their hand veins collapsed. I am embarrassed by the vein condition on my hands.

ANSWER: "Varix" is the Latin word for a dilated vein, so we call them varicose veins no matter where they are on the body. They run very strongly in families, but it isn't clear exactly what

Most varicose veins do not need to be treated, but if they are complicated by bleeding, blood clots or pain, they may require treatment. Varicose veins in the legs also can be a cause of restless leg syndrome. Treatment can be effected by surgery, injecting a medication to close the vein or with a

laser. Having an experienced practitioner is important.

Some people do treat them for cosmetic reasons. You don't have to be a movie star to be concerned about your appearance. It is expensive,


