

### Hello Again,

I'm sure we are all familiar with one old saying, "Try, try again," but maybe the smartest way would be when you have tried and then tried again and even tried again and it still doesn't work - quit.

Then, on the other hand, we are reminded of the phrase or old saying, "Quitters never win."

On several occasions, through Hello Again and other means, I have attempted to organize a meeting to explore the Palatine Corridor idea. The last notice and request was a few weeks ago via Hello Again.

Hello Again is read in over 36,400 homes in the Mohawk Valley and five, and only five, responded to say they would attend a Palatine Corridor meeting. Just think - 10% would be 3,600 and 1% would be over 360 and 1/10th of 1% would be approximately 36. We received 5 replies. If you enjoy playing with numbers, and I do, in most households there are two adults which could be interpreted to mean 72,800 adults could have read the message/request and only 5 people responded. We have more than adequate proof that Hello Again has a great readership so what is the problem?

Does this mean the people of the Mohawk Valley do not want or do not care? I personally know hundreds if not thousands of the residents in this valley and I am absolutely sure they do care. They do want businesses to come to our valley, which will create permanent good jobs.

Sunday in church I listened to a Bible-

based message about the fellowship and community of the believers. This message prompted me to write about two occasions which happened in our Mohawk Valley area.

One morning a few years ago I had a reason to go visit a business in Johnstown. I was late so I drove up Route 10 out of Palatine Bridge in an attempt to miss heavier traffic. A few miles north out of Palatine Bridge, I was totally set-back, surprised by a very large gathering of Amish with their horses and buggies. It quickly became obvious they were there to build a farm barn.

Now, we all know the Amish community gathers together from far and wide when a brother needs help, especially to build or rebuild a barn. I could hardly believe my eyes. There must have been upwards of 150 Amish men with their carpenter tools all set to build a barn, and you know those men would have to eat so their wives were there also.

The following morning at about 6 o'clock, I was heading to my office at the printing plant and I detoured up Route 10 to see how much they had accomplished. The barn was totally built and only one horse and buggy was standing near the new barn.

Then two years ago the same story came to life. One morning a concrete silo was standing sole guard at a farm on Route 5 between Nelliston and St. Johnsville. You could almost imagine Gil Favor yelling, "Head'em up and move'em out." With that what seemed like hundreds, the Amish families with their horse and buggies plugged Route 5 heading for that lone silo. Now you know the rest of the story - by nightfall a brand new dairy-hay barn was standing

there completely finished and ready to serve the Amish farmer, his wife and his family.

The real subject of these two accounts of barn structures magically growing up out of the ground in one 8-10 hour day is really not the barns, but the people.

If 150 Amish friends and neighbors can come together in one day to completely build a barn - what would happen if the 72,800 readers of Hello Again came together to create a new retailmusic-restaurant-entertainment-etc. Palatine Corridor. Seventy-two-thousand-eight-hundred people could build a new upstate world of employment and all you are being asked to do is attempt to be a part of it.

A community of people with faith and leadership could and will create a miracle of business in our already famous Mohawk Valley. What I, the writer of "Hello Again" need to know - Should I reserve a hall, restaurant, or what have you for 100 - 200 - 250 how many - or will the room have to accommodate the original 5? Family, friends, neighbors, coworkers - we are an upstate community. No one will come along to help us. If we work and plan together, great things will happen. So - please write a card or letter to Palatine Corridor, PO Box 121, Palatine Bridge, NY 13428. When we receive an account of those who intend to be present at a meeting, we will reserve a hall and notify everyone via Hello Again. Say "yes" to the Palatine Corridor.

Turn your imagination loose - what do you see?

1. A Christmas Store - such as the

- giant Bronner's in Frankenmuth, MI with up to 500 employees.
- 2. A teddy bear store the "teddy bear" named after one of our New York State Boys Teddy Roosevelt is the number one toy in the world.
- 3. A teddy bear factory teddy bears built right here in our valley and sold via store and sold throughout the world via Internet.
- 4. A group of factory discount stores stores of famous name brand. Why not here with 3 million 500 thousand people within 50 miles?
- 5. Country Western Music Hall why not a Nashville right here in our valley?
- 6. Giant sporting goods store with year around sporting equipment.
- 7. Amish family restaurant similar to those in Ohio and Pennsylvania.
- 8. Fort Plain built to its original size with early American activities.

We have a justice of the peace in our church family - this may have happened in his court. The judge asked a thief - "Just what have you done to serve the people in our Mohawk Valley?" "Well judge," he said, "I've kept several cops working since the 1990's."

Soon I may have to wrap the little red bike up in its winter pj's. So while you have a chance - wave hello. He smiles with every wave, and so does his driver.







### Restored tractor returns to field

If you happen to drive past Freysbush Farm Organic Dairy on Highway 163, or any of the farm's subsequent land, you may be privileged to see owner Ed Trumbull puttering through the field in full vintage. You'll have to look closely, because the tractor he's driving has been given a new coat of paint, which belies its true age. The tractor is, in fact, an original John Deere R.

The John Deere company created Model R machines from 1949-1954. Trumbull's tractor falls smack in the middle of those production dates, at 1952.

At 61, the machine is pushing retirement age but instead of ending its career, it has just returned to the workforce, having been still for the past six years. "It's an antique. We need to keep it going," Trumbull said.

Trumbull knew the tractor needed to be used soon before it became too rusted. So he sent the tractor to John Leonard in Cherry Valley, NY to be restored and repainted. The entire process took one month and was completed in time for Trumbull to enter the tractor in the Cherry Valley Antique Show last August. It

was the only R model there.

Not only was the tractor restored locally, it was originally purchased in the Valley, too. Many vintage enthusiasts search high and low for their favorite make and model machine, but Trumbull's tractor has been in the family its entire life.

"My dad bought it brand new in St. Johnsville," Trumbull says. "Paid about \$6,000."

Sentiment is not the only benefit of driving the antique tractor. "It's the most fuel-economic tractor around," said Trumbull's son, Jeremiah. This little 2-cylinder was John Photo by Emily Enger Deere's first diesel tractor and — unlike vintage cars, renown for being gas hogs — the 1952 John Deere R is more fuel efficient than the Trumbulls' other tractors, which date circa 1970.

Trumbull farms with his sons Jeremiah and Benjamin. Their organic dairy farm is home to 90 holsteins, for whom they grow 500 acres of feed crops. The antique tractor is already busy preparing said crops, planting winter rye for next year's seed.

"We're trying to get it warmed up," Trumbull explains. "It's such a cold blooded old girl!"







- ~High School Student Council: Student Council elections were recently held for the 2013-2014 school year. The newly elected officers are: Chrisitan Arndt-President, Gene Ryan-Vice President, Julia Rodriquez-Secretary, ShyAnn Snyder-Treasurer, Lisa Hudyncia-Public Relations. The Student Council will host a Halloween Dance and Haunted House on November 1st at 7:30 p.m. at the Jr/Sr HS.

- ~Cross Country Team News: The Fort Plain Sports Complex hosted 36 schools and over 700 runners for the 36th annual Cross Country Invitational on Saturday, September 14th. Schools from four different sections of the state came to compete: Section 1 (Arlington-Hudson River Valley), Section 2 (Mohawk Valley/Capital District), Section 3 (Central New York) and Section 4 (Southern Tier). The Invy consisted of 8 races and featured both male and female runners in the Freshmen, JV, and Varsity categories. In the large school category, Arlington took both the boys and the girls top spots. In the small school category, it was Greenwich taking first place for both boys and girls. Fort Plain will host the annual Modified Invitational on Saturday, October 19th starting at 9:00 a.m. at the Sports Complex. The annual WAC League Championships will also be held at Fort Plain, on Tuesday, October 22nd beginning at 3:00 p.m.
- ~Varsity Volleyball News: The Varsity Volleyball team is off to a great start this season, with a solid record and a roster of 15 girls who are playing well together. The team will host Senior Night and their annual Think Pink game on Thursday, October 10th at 6:00 p.m. The game will be versus Mekeel. All of the money earned during Think Pink night will be donated to the Think Pink Tournament in Schoharie on Saturday, October 12th, in support of breast cancer research and awareness. The team will host the annual WAC tournament on October 19th. The Varsity Volleyball team is coached by Mrs. Lisa Trembley.
- ~Target Supports Fort Plain Reading Program: The elementary school recently received a \$2,000 grant from Target, for a "Reading Around the Seasons" program aimed at teaching and modeling family literacy skills in a relaxed and fun setting. The school's Library Media Specialist, Mary VanPatten, will lead four seasonal Family Reading Nights, focusing on the themes of Halloween, Winter, Earth Day/Spring, and Summertime. 50 students, and their parents, will be welcomed to each event, which will feature reading-aloud demonstrations designed to model behavior that parents can use to engage their children in reading at home. Each student who attends will receive a seasonal book to bring home, which will be selected to match the theme of the session. Through the generosity of the Target grant, the school will purchase books and supplies for each session, which will be held for students in grades K-3.
- ~Seventh Graders Take a Field Trip: Seventh grade students learn about many aspects of New York State history in their social studies curriculum. They had a chance to see some of those lessons represented during a visit to the New York State Museum in Albany on October 1st. The students toured the Iroquois Indian exhibit and visited the longhouse on display there. They took some time to remember the impact of the September 11th attacks, viewing artifacts and photos from that day in New York City. Finally, the group took advantage of the being able to see the temporary exhibit called "An Irrepressible Conflict: The Empire State in the Civil War." This learning experience was put together by seventh grade social studies teacher Katherine Sacco.
- **~Fourth Grade Chemistry:** The first day of school started off with a bang for students in Jade VanGorder and Amy Bartholomew's fourth grade classroom. The teachers introduced the students to basic scientific principles by dropping Mentos mints into a bottle of soda and analyzing the results. The students witnessed an explosion of soda with each attempt, with the final test yielding a stream of foam 8 feet high! "Today, they learned about the scientific method and scientific inquiry," said Mrs. Bartholomew. "I think we're going to do a different experiment each month. During the lessons, the students ask questions so that they can form a hypothesis." The science experiments are part of the fourth graders core curriclum, as students analyze, predict, conduct research, and read to find information. Both teachers noted that activities like this are a fun way for students to learn about science.
- ~October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month: Of the more than 12.5 million cases of cancer in America, more than 2.7 million are breast cancer. The main risk factor is being female, followed by an age factor (two out of three cases are found in women over age 55), and finally family history increases risk. Breast cancer is one of the main causes of death in women. While the exact cause is unknown, some lifestyle factors have been linked such as being overweight, tobacco use, lack of physical activity, and excessive drinking. By modifying these behaviors, and receiving a mammogram at the recommended age, risk can be reduced. Early detection and awareness is the best defense against breast cancer. Medical professionals estimate thousands of lives could be saved each year through regular screenings and self-examinations. Talk to your doctor about when mammograms should start and often you should go. For more information, visit cdc.gov/cancer/breast

Far right is a type of whet stone and holder that farmers carried on their belt in the field, to sharpen the sith on an as-needed basis while they worked.

The other two tools utilize the hammer at left.

The center stake would be pound into the ground. The sith blade was set on the stake and was lightly hammered to return the edge to sharpness.


The small wedge at left was similar to the center one. Farmers would take the hammer and pound the wedge against the edge of the sith blade.

### RPI and FMCC students step up to help flood clean up in Fort Plain

Local volunteers and dignitaries were on hand in Fort Plain on Oct. 5 to greet college students from both Fulton Montgomery Community College and RPI who were volunteering to help complete mudouts in flood affected areas.

Students from FMCC, along with Radiologic Tech Director Cindy Close, presented Fort Plain Mayor Guy Barton with a check for over \$523 to help towards rebuilding.

"It is so important to recognize these volunteers who are stepping up to help get people back into their homes before the weather gets any colder," remarked Volunteer Director Pastor Gail Adamoschek.

Adamoschek confirmed that although much has been completed, there is still much work to be done, noting that the calendar is quickly approaching November.

One major project folks can participate in is "adopting a room" in the flood affected homes.

"We've had a few women's groups from Canajoharie and Johnstown adopt a room in these homes. They donate enough sheetrock to complete just one room."

Adamoschek said that \$300 is enough to sheetrock a 12x12 ft. room. An entire bathroom can be sheetrocked for \$100.

"Several houses have lost their entire first floors and need kitchens, bathrooms and living rooms rebuilt. One family with children is still living in a camper with no heat available. If other church groups or other organizations would step up and adopt a room, we could get these families back in their homes and buttoned up before the snow flies!"

Skilled and unskilled volunteer laborers are desperately needed. Carpenters, plumbers,

Adamoschek said Saturday had been a very productive day. "We are definitely turning a corner from mudout to rebuild. We did demolition work, mudouts, gutouts, and clean ups. Also, we sent out more new building supplies, food and water to families in need. We prayed with local dignitaries and college students, asking for God's blessing and help."

The Reformed Church of Fort Plain provided a welcome and wholesome meal for the volunteers.

### Roles of the best man and maid of honor

Being chosen as a best man or a maid of honor is a significant and meaningful honor. Those roles have evolved over the years, but these special participants must still perform some of the traditional duties of the past, including serving as the official witnesses to the ceremony. The following is a rundown of the various duties maids of honor and best men are now expected to handle once they're chosen for these distinguished honors.

### Prior to the wedding

Before the wedding takes place, the maid of honor will closely assist the bride-to-be with many of the important decisions related to the look and the feel of the wedding. She typically accompanies the bride to dress shops to select gowns for the bride and bridesmaids. Much in the same manner, the best man will assist the groom-to-be with choosing tuxedoes or suits and also with coordinating with the ushers to ensure they know when to go for fittings.

Although the best man will serve as a sounding board for the groom, traditionally the bride and her bridesmaids have taken on the majority of the wedding planning, so the maid of honor can expect to play a larger role than the best man. The maid of honor may be asked to delegate certain assignments, such as helping to find wedding vendors or addressing invitations. She may go with the bride for makeup and hairstyle trials. Together with the bridesmaids, she will plan a bridal shower party and a bachelorette excursion. She may select a wedding gift for the couple and present it on behalf of all the wedding attendants.

The best man will coordinate the bachelor party and may be asked to assist the groom with selecting a honeymoon site or to come along to book the trip.

### Wedding day

On the day of the wedding, the maid of honor and the best man will act as a support system for the bride and groom. The maid of honor will help the bride get dressed and help iron out any miniemergencies that should crop up. The best man will help ensure all of the ushers are dressed and get the groom to the

wedding on time.


During the ceremony, the maid of honor will hold the bride's bouquet while she participates in the wedding. The best man will keep the rings safe until they are needed. The maid of honor also will help adjust the bride's train and veil as she sits and stands during the ceremony. Both will sign the marriage certificate as witnesses.

At the reception, the best man is expected to give a toast and the maid of honor may share some words as well. She also may accompany the bride to the restroom and assist her with managing the gown.

### After the wedding

The best man will be in charge of returning the tuxedoes to the rental shop, if necessary. He also may drive the newly married couple to the airport so they can depart on their honeymoon.

The maid of honor will assist the bride in changing out of her gown and into her travel clothes. Oftentimes the maid of honor takes the gown to the cleaners in the days following the ceremony so the dress can be preserved.



### **Deer Hunting**

Below are answers to a number of questions frequently asked by New York hunters.

### Deer Management Permits (DMPs)

Q: When is the deadline for getting my DMPs? Where do I get them?

A: The deadline for applying for DMPs is Oct. 1, and you may apply at any license issuing outlet, by phone, mail, or online. Be sure to know the Wildlife Management Unit for which you want to apply.

### Q: My DMP has the wrong WMU specified on the tag. Can I get a new one?

A: Possibly. It is always best to check the WMU on your DMP before leaving the license issuing outlet. If the clerk simply made an error, he or she can contact our DMP

Season (Bow/Muzzleloading) and Tags

**Q:** May I shoot more than one deer in a day if I have the proper tags?

A: Yes, as long as you have the proper tags you may shoot more than one deer in a day.

Q: May I use my Bow/Muzzleloading tags (either-sex and antlerless tags) during the Regular Season?

A: No. Bow/Muzzle-

loading tags are only

valid during the special bowhunting and muzzleloading seasons depending on which privileges vou purchased. Bow/Muzzleloading tags are not valid during the Regular Seasons, except in Westchester and Suffolk Counties or by junior archers hunting with a

and Southern Zones to take a buck. Except, the Regular Season deer tag is valid for deer of either sex in Westchester & Suffolk counties, in areas restricted to bowhunting only (WMUs 4J and 8C), and during the late seasons with the appropriate bow or muzzleloading privileges. During the late seasons, the Regular Season deer tag is valid for deer of either sex.

\* Your previous year's unused regular season deer carcass tag, accompanied by your previous year's bow privilege, can be used from Sept. 27-30 during the Northern Zone Bowhunting Deer Season and is valid for deer of either sex during this period.

Why g: are bowhunters not allowed to use the regular deer bucks prior to the opening of the gun season would be to provide bowhunters an unfair advantage.

Q: Can I use my antlerless Bow/Muzzleloading tag in a unit where the muzzleloader hunting regulations specify only antlered deer can be taken?

A: No. You may only shoot deer that can legally be taken in the unit in which you are hunting. The individual unit regulations and tag requirements must both be satisfied and dictate what may be taken during the muzzleloading seasons.

### **Miscellaneous** Q: What is an antlerless deer?

A: An antlerless deer is a female or a male with antlers that are less than 3 inches long. Antlerless deer may be tagged with your DMP or Bow/Muzzleloading antlerless or either-sex tags. Deer with antlers that are 3 inches or longer may only be tagged with your Regular Season tag or Bow/Muzzleloading either-sex tag.

Q: Does the Pilot Antler Restriction Program change the type of deer I can take with my antlerless tag?

A: No. The legal definition of an antlered deer remains any animal with one antler 3 inches long or longer. This definition applies in the Pilot Antler Restriction area and throughout the rest of the state. You may only use antlerless tags vour (Bow/Muzzleloading or DMPs) for female deer or bucks with antlers less than 3 inches. You may NOT use an antlerless tag on a buck with antlers greater than 3" but less than the 3-point on one side restriction.

### Q: Where should I attach the carcass tags to my deer?

A: DEC does not require the carcass tag be attached to a deer in any specific location, but we recommended that you attached the tag to the head of the deer, either to an antler or through a small slit through the ear. Twist ties or small cable ties work well for this purpose. Look carefully for the perforated hole on the carcass tag. You must fill out the carcass tag immediately upon taking

a deer, but you do not  $\overset{\omega}{\cdot}$ need to attach it to the  $\varphi$ animal until you get back to your vehicle or camp. You are responsible to " ensure that your deer is tagged. If the tag falls off during transport, you □ could be ticketed for possessing an untagged deer.

### Q: I'm having trouble ≥ cutting out the notches [ on my carcass tag. What can I do?

A: Immediately upon 톶 taking a deer you are required to fill out the carcass tag. You must mark the date of kill on the carcass tag either by cutting out the day and month along the edge of the tag or by writing the day and  $\vec{N}$ month with a pen that ℵ won't erase.

### Q: Do I need to have my deer tags with the deer meat in my freezer?

**A:** No, the tags remain on the carcass. When the carcass is disposed of, the tags may also be discarded. However, when you are transporting packaged venison, you must provide a tag with the meat.

Four-wheel-drive systems, often referred to as 4WD, trace their origins to the late 1800s, while all-wheel-drive, or AWD, did not arrive until the

AWD system was used on an Audi vehicle for rally racing. Now many cars and trucks come with 4WD or AWD, particularly crossovers and SUVs.

Both drive systems engage all four wheels at the same time to provide more traction. On AWD systems, the powering of the wheels is automatic and usually handled by the electronic system of the car. Some vehicles drive in two-wheel-drive, but then engage AWD when sensors detect a need for more traction maneuverability. When operating 4WD vehicles, drivers may have to manually engage the system. True 4WD uses a transfer case mounted by the rear of the transmission. A button or selector lever on older model SUVs would switch the vehicle from 2WD to 4WD. Unlike in AWD systems, the front and rear axles are locked together in 4WD systems.

Four-wheel-drive systems are better for offroading, rock-climbing and driving through mud and water. Individuals who participate in many off-road recreational activities will find that 4WD, especially in vehicles with more gears, is more effective and provides better traction. Allwheel-drive provides stability, largely on roadways, and enables the vehicle to modify the level of power to either the front or rear wheels to

improve traction as needed. All-wheel-drive is adequate for many drivers and situations.

It is important to note that, on icy or slippery roads, neither AWD or 4WD systems assist with braking or completely prevent cars from skidding on slick surfaces. Having the ability to engage all four wheels at

the same time should  $^{\mathbf{o}}$ not be used as a replace-ment for cautious driv-ing in inclement weather.

Four-wheel-drive and w all-wheel-drive both provide power to all four wheels on the vehicle but have subtle differences that make each better for certain driving conditions.





**Mandatory Hunter Ed**ucation: A hunter education course is required for persons who cannot show proof that they have ever possessed a hunting license. The general course is a minimum 10 hours in length. DEC honors hunter education certificates and sporting licenses from all other states and countries.

**Mandatory Bowhunter** Education: Hunters wishing to bowhunt for deer and bear must take an additional 8 hour minimum bowhunter education course. DEC also honors bowhunter education certificates issued by:

- National Field Archery Association or National Bowhunter Education Foundation or International Bowhunter Education Program issued in 1974 or later in any state or country,
- · Any state or provincial fish and wildlife agency (certificate or card must specify the course was for bowhunting and not a general hunting course with a bowhunt-

ing segment),

- Ontario Bowhunters Association (on green or brown letterhead stationery with mooseheadbow and arrow emblem until July 31, 1987), or
- Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (on letterhead after August 1, 1987).

### Residency

To qualify for a resident license, a person must live in New York State for more than 30 days immediately prior to date of application. Land ownership in New York does not make vou a resident. Residency is that place where a person maintains a fixed, permanent and principal home (regardless wherever temporarily located), such as where a person is registered to vote. If under 18, the residence of parents or legal guardian shall be deemed such person's residence.

Active members of the US Armed Forces stationed in NY and full-time college students in residence in the State during the school year (proof required) qualify for annual resident licenses.

You will need one of the

following proofs of residency at time of purchase:

**Hunting licenses** 

- NYS drivers license
- NYS non-drivers identification from DMV
- Current NYS vehicle registration
- IT-201 OR W-2 income tax form from the previous vear
- · Current voter registration card
- Current Student ID
- Military LES (Leave and Earnings Statement) OR military orders
- Current pay stub OR note on letterhead from a current employer verifying your legal address

### Minimum hunting age

Minors under the age of 12 may not obtain a hunting license or hunt wildlife.

### License year

Licenses and permits are valid from Oct. 1 through Sept. 30. To hunt in small game or big game seasons starting prior to Oct. 1, the previous year's license is required. Previous year big game licenses are available at all license issuing agents.

License responsibilities

• A license, permit, tag or stamp (except Deer Management Permits or Lifetime Licenses) is not transferrable and may be used only by the person to whom issued.

- It is not legal to possess another person's license, permit or stamp (except a transferred Deer Management Permit) while hunting, unless accompanied by the person to whom issued.
- A license to hunt, trap or fish does not give the holder any right to go on private property without permission of the land owner.
- You can legally purchase and possess only one big game or sportsman license per year.
- It is illegal to refuse to show your license on demand to a law enforcement officer or the owner. lessee or person in control of the lands (or their designees) while on their property.
- Make sure that your license has all the correct information. Carefully check it immediately after purchase or as soon as delivered in the mail. If you discover an error,

have it corrected as soon as possible. Errors render a hunting or fishing license invalid.
