

Karl Niklas, Cornell University professor of plant biology whose research focuses on the relationship between plants and the physical environment, predicts the 2013 fall season will be filled with beautiful, vibrant colors.

Niklas says:

"Autumn coloration will be average to better than average this year. Leaf coloration depends on temperature and rainfall, but it also depends on the health of a forest. Overall, we had a reasonable amount of rainfall, about average temperatures and forest health

appears normal as well. The autumnal coloration will commence at higher elevations in the Northeastern parts of the state. Cooler weather will arrive at these higher elevations, which have more well-drained soil. As a consequence of the confluence of drier soils and lower temperatures, the plants will respond by going into dormancy sooner, which for deciduous species entails drawing nutrients from leaves that in turn results in coloration of leaves."

Cleaning your garden tools regularly after use is ideal, but at the least they should be cleaned S before putting them away for winter. Clean away for winter. Clean tools work more effectively, so are easier to use, and they last longer. Keeping blades sharp improves cutting, which is easier on you and the plants. Keeping tools **6** used in soil cleaned keeps their edges sharper too, preventing rust from forming, and renoves possible diseasealaden soil particles. Cleaning tools even more often when working on infected plants is essential to prevent disease spread. If pruning diseased limbs from trees, keep a container of rubbing alcohol, bleach (one part to 9 parts water), or disinfectant (such as Lysol) handy to dip blades in between prun-

ing each plant to avoid

spreading disease.

For tools such as shovels, hoes and garden forks that are used in soil, wash them after use with a forceful stream of water from the hose. For stubborn soils such as clay, use a wirebristle brush or dull implement if needed. Then dry tools with a rag. For blades of saws and pruners that end up with sticky plant sap, such as from evergreens (pines, spruces and the like), use some paint thinner to remove the sap before wiping with a rag.

Even after cleaning, the worn metal can rust, even more so if higher grade steel. To prevent this, wipe tools or spray with a very light coat of motor oil. Some dilute this with kerosene, two parts oil to one of kerosene. Others recycle their old oil from mowers for this use. You can wipe the oil on with an old rag or paper towel,

stuffers etc.

spray it on with a hand sprayer, or make a mix of the soil with sand to push tools into after each use. The latter is easy, quick, and the sand helps provide some abrasion to remove soil in the process. The oil breaks down rapidly in

For hand tools, some use a strong black tea. Brew up enough in a pan or kettle to cover the tools, then let them, or blades at least, soak for



a few hours after the tea is cooled. Rust should wipe off easily with a rag. If tools aren't very dirty or rusty, a balled up handful of wax paper rubbed over surfaces may be sufficient — both cleaning and leaving some protective wax on them.

If tools have gotten severely rusted, you may need to use rough sandpaper, and even perhaps a wire bristle brush. For the most rusted, you may need to use a drill with wire brush attachment. For the latter in particular, make sure to wear safety glasses. Then make sure to wipe and coat with oil.


Sharpen tools too, at least at the end of the season. Best is to sharpen them regularly as used during the season. This is more important if tools have rusted. For dull large tools such as shovels, axes, and spades, you can use a hand file available from hardware or home stores. If very dull, you may need a high speed grinding stone or drill attachment. As with cleaning, make sure to wear eye protection if using a high-speed grinder.

Many tools now have plastic handles, but if you have one with wood, treat it as well for longest life. Rub wooden handles with a rag, slightly moistened with linseed oil or other wood protection oil product.

Once tools are cleaned and sharpened, store them properly in a closet, garage, or shed out of the weather. Keeping them off the floor helps prevent any moisture and rust, and dulling. I like to hang mine by the handles. If straight handles, I hang upside down with ten-penny nails used to hold the tool itself. When buying new tools consider stainless steel ones, if available, that are easier to keep clean.

From Tesla to Volvo: New car models in 2014

DETROIT (AP) **Tesla**

Model X: Electric car maker Tesla currently makes just one sedan, the Model S. Its next vehicle, the Model X crossover, is expected to go on sale toward the end of 2014. A preproduction version shown at the Detroit auto show last January had seven seats and unique gull-wing doors that open vertically instead of sliding to the side. Like the Model S, the Model X will have a choice of batteries – 60 kWh or 85 kWh and a large touchscreen dashboard. The Model X will also have an allwheel-drive option, something the Model S doesn't have right now.

Toyota

Corolla: The 11th generation of the Corolla one of the best-selling small cars on the planet — goes on sale in September. Toyota took a risk with an edgier, more chiseled design, and LED headlights give the car a more premium look. The car is nearly 4 inches longer, which makes the interior roomier, especially for the rear passengers. Toyota also added more carpet insulation and other materials to make the cabin quieter. There are two four-cylinder engine choices: a 1.8-liter with 132 horsepower, which is carried over from the previous generation, and the 1.8-liter with Toyota's Valvematic technology, which slightly improves fuel economy and horsepower by offering a broader range of valve timing. There's a four-speed automatic transmission in base models, but Toyota expects most buyers will opt for its new six-speed continuously variable transmission. Toyota estimates the Corolla gets 37 mpg on the highway and 29 mpg in the city. An Eco version gets 40 mpg on the highway with the help of aerodynamic improvements, low rolling resistance tires, a spoiler and the Valvematic engine.

4Runner: The redesigned 2014 4Runner has a distinctive, architectural front grille and a standard roof rack on all trim levels. Inside, there's more second-row leg room thanks to sculpted front seats, and lower trim levels get nicer features like a leatherwrapped steering wheel and shifter. The 4.0-liter, 270-horsepower V6 remains, and gets 17 mpg in the city and 22 on the highway for the 4x4 or 23 for the 4x2.

Highlander: Toyota hasn't yet released details on the new Highlander SUV, which will go on sale early in 2014. A hybrid version will hit the market in the spring.

Tundra: The 2014 Tundra full-size pickup truck gets a complete makeover, with a bigger, bolder grille up front, improved suspension below and an integrated spoiler in the rear to improve fuel economy. A backup camera is standard on all trim levels, a first for the full-size pickup segment. On the inside, Toyota has made ergonomic improvements, including installing more comfortable front seats that move back farther, and reduced wind noise. There's a new top-of-theline model, the 1794 Edition, which pays homage

to the San Antonio ranch. founded in 1794, where Toyota's plant is now located. It has a western theme, with saddle brown leather seats, suede accents, and premium features like heated and cooled seats and navigation. The engine choices a 4.0-liter, 270 horsepower V6; 4.6-liter, 310horsepower V8; and a 5.7-liter, 381-horsepower V8 - are carried over from the previous model, which got up to 17 mpg in city and highway driving. Volkswagen

Beetle: Sometime during the model year, the base 2.5-liter five-cylinder engine will be replaced by a 170-horsepower, 1.8liter turbocharged four to increase gas mileage by 17 percent. Current fivecylinder Beetle gets 31 mpg on highway. New GSR retro racer line is added, and Beetle Turbo becomes the R-Line.

Jetta: VW's top seller gets the new 1.8-liter turbocharged and a directinjection four-cylinder engine to replace the 2.5liter five-cylinder. New engine gets 36 mpg on highway. A 30th anniversary GLI performance model comes late in the model year.

Passat: The midsize VW gets the same 1.8-liter turbocharged engine to replace the five cylinder.

Volvo

XC60: The XC60 small SUV gets its most extensive refresh since it was introduced four years ago. A new hood and grille give the vehicle a wider, more confident stance. Inside, Volvo now offers sporty paddle shifters mounted on the steering wheel, which let drivers shift without taking their hands off the wheel. The interior also has upgraded materials and a hightech instrument cluster. Corner traction control. which helps the vehicle on wet or winding streets,

is now standard. Also " standard are a new blind 8 spot monitoring system and cross-traffic alert, a radar system that warns ${}^{\boldsymbol{\varpi}}$ the driver if vehicles are approaching the rear no sides. An optional technology package offers active high beams, which automatically switch to low beams if oncoming traffic is detected, and a system that automatically brakes if the car is about \mathbf{Z} to hit a pedestrian or cyclist. The three engines remain, including a 3.2liter V6 with 240 horsepower, a 3.0-liter turbocharged V6 with 300 horsepower and a top-ofthe-line 3.0-liter turbocharged V6 with 325 8 horsepower. The base en- $\overline{\boldsymbol{\omega}}$ gine gets up to 25 mpg on the highway.



Seasonal driving checklist

(NAPSA) — Whether drivers are trading out their ice scrapers for an open sunroof or putting the cover on the convertible after another summer driving season, experts advise that seasonal car prep should go beyond the basic wash and wax.

With that in mind, consider these car care tips for keeping your vehicle looking and running in tip-top shape.

Check tire tread depth. To check tread depth, look inside the grooves on the tire. At every six to 10 inches, a raised wear bar will appear, and if the tread is worn to the same height as the bar, it's time to replace the tire. Make sure to check for wear at several spots on each tire, as wear may not always be even. If new tires are needed, be sure to follow your vehicle manufacturer's recommendation for size and type of tires, as the wrong tire can hurt vehicle handling.

battery Verifv strength. Don't assume all is well with the car battery just because your vehicle starts. While some drivers may be able to check their own battery, this is usually best left to the professionals.

monitor Regularly tire pressure. Underinflated tires reduce fuel mileage and optimal handling, and can suffer unnoticeable damage that compromises car performance and safety. Check tire pressure often; don't just "set it and forget it."

attention to Pay brake operation. Properly functioning brakes are essential to vehicle safety. Disc brakes on modern vehicles are exposed to road salt, dirt and moisture, which together can create problems. Pay attention when braking. While an occasional noise is not

uncommon, unusually loud or constant noises when applying the brakes should be checked by a professional.

Inspect/replace wiper blades. The joys of a leisurely drive through changing scenery can be quickly erased by a freak thunderstorm, especially if that's when you discover you need new wiper blades. The rubber used in wiper blades can become dry and brittle during the hotter months, especially if they've already been through a season of snow and rain. Replace them early to ensure a clear view of the road ahead
