

In 1905 wealthy railroad magnet Henry Morrison Flagler built a railway 170 miles across the keys to Key West, Florida at a cost of \$50,000,000. A hurricane in 1935 thoroughly destroyed the railroad.

On March 20 the U.S. government opened a new auto-truck highway-bridge based on the foundation piers of the Flagler railroad at a cost of \$57,000,000. At that time it was the longest bridge in the world.

Businesses in both Canajoharie and Palatine Bridge take part in the celebration.





Collecting

by Larry Cox Grandfather Clock

Q: I have a grandfather clock that I have been told was made in 1820 or maybe 1880. I would like to know how much it is worth. — Barbara, Albuquerque, NM

A: Let me see if I have this correct. You have a clock, and don't apparently know the maker and aren't even certain when it was made. Even though I can't help you, you do have several options.

You can hire the services of a professional appraiser to document research your clock. This would not be a free service, but in my opinion it is well worth the fee since it is not a guess but an expert opinion. Your second option is to contact clock dealers in your city for their ınput.

One of the better general references is the "Antique Trader Clocks Price Guide" edited by Kyle Husfloen (Krause Books, \$17.95). This book features more than 1,400 entries covering timepieces from the 17th through the 20th centuries.

Q: I have two Edison machines and am trying to find cylinders to play on them. have searched antiques stores throughout my area but have been unable to locate more than

two or three. Can you help me? — Steve, Rochester, NY


A: Richard Gesner is the owner of The Music Connection, New Hampshire's largest and oldest record shop. In addition to LPs, 45s, 78s, cassettes, compact discs and 8-tracks, Gesner has an excellent selection of Edison cylinders. A: I found your recording referenced in "Goldmine Record Album Price Guide" by Dave Thompson \$27.99). (Krause, According to Thompson, your record was issued in 1959 and is worth \$20.

## Tips and tricks for a perfect Christmas tree

As families brave the elements to pick the perfect Christmas tree, Cornell University experts offer a few tips on choosing a tree as well as some tricks to preserve its beauty throughout the season.

Tips for selecting the best Christmas tree:

- Firs and pines have the best needle retention and can last for a month or more indoors. However if buying a spruce tree, plan to have it in the house for just a week to 10 days.
- Look for a tree with a good solid-green color. Needle yellowing or a slight brown speckled color could indicate there was a pest problem and could lead to early needle drop.
- · Don't be afraid to handle and bend the branches and shoots.

Green needles should not come off in your hands. Also, the shoots should be flexible. Avoid a tree if the needles are shed or if shoots crack or snap with handling.

- Christmas trees should smell good. If there isn't much fragrance when you flex the needles, it may mean that the tree was cut too long ago.
- If possible, make a fresh cut on the bottom so the tree's vascular tissue (pipe work) is not plugged and so the tree can easily take up water. Then, if you're not bringing it into the house right away, get the tree in a bucket of water outside.
- Once your tree gets moved to inside the house, don't locate it next to a radiator or fur-

nace vent. And always remember to keep water in the tree stand topped off, so it never goes below the bottom of the trunk.

and Dok Stanford, holly and mistletoe are an integral part of holiday imagery and tradition. Holly is used to adorn a home in green and red finery alongside everboughs green and wreaths. In addition, it has become customary to hang a bouquet of mistletoe under which people are encouraged to share a holiday kiss. While these elements of celebrations are now incorporated into many of the secular and religious components of Christmas, they have very different origins.

## Holly

Holly has been used since the days of the early Pagans as a decoration for midwinter festivities, when it was brought into homes to keep evil spirits away. The ancient Romans also believed that holly prickles drove away evil spirits, and it held a place of honor at December festivals dedicated to the god Saturn. To avoid persecution during the Roman pagan Saturnalia festival, early Christians would participate in the

tradition of hanging evilrepelling holly on their homes to appear like the masses. Eventually as the number of Christians grew, the tradition became less of a pagan one and more associated with Christians and Christmas. Some people have inferred that holly and its prickly edges is symbolic of the crown of thorns Jesus wore at his crucifixion, with the red berries representing blood.

## Mistletoe

Mistletoe was once held sacred by the Norse, Celtic Druids and North American Indians. It is actually a parasitic plant that grows on a wide range of host trees. Heavy infestation can dwarf the growth and kill these trees. In cultures across pre-Christian Europe, mistletoe was seen as a representation of divine male essence (and thus romance, fertility and vitality). The plant also was thought to be a symbol of peace, and anyone standing below it should receive tokens of affection. When enemies met beneath mistletoe,

they had to lay down . their weapons and observe a truce until the next day. This is how the tradition of kissing under the mistletoe likely began, and why a ball of mistletoe is now hung in  $\overline{\mathbf{Q}}$ homes during Christmas, a season of peace and affection.

Homeowners hang mistletoe and holly around their homes during the holiday season should be mindful of pets and youngsters around the plants. 🚡 Mistletoe and holly are considered to be moderately to severely toxic, and ingesting the leaves could be dangerous. \$\delta\$ Therefore, keep these plants away from curi- a ous hands. Mistletoe is commonly hung up high, which should make it less problematic, but holly should be hung high as well.

Now largely associated with Christmas celebrations, holly and mistletoe were once part of pagan rituals and ancient superstitions.

• Drive safe and cash in on lower insurance premiums. The total cost of buying used after six years was \$20,960, while the cost of leasing was \$24,768 and the cost of buying new \$28,330. Buying used

• Drive less. Of course, the easiest way for automobile owners to trim the costs of owning their vehicles is to drive less. Though vehicle manufacturers have improved fuel economy in recent years, driving less will save money on fuel, the cost of which hinges on a host of factors, including petroleum demand and economic conditions. Such factors may cause a dip in fuel prices one day, but a sharp increase in price the next day. Regardless of those fluctuations in fuel prices, drivers who can cut back on their driving are certain to save money.

## Weather or not, winterize your vehicle now

The last thing any driver needs is to break down in cold, harsh winter weather. A vehicle check now before winter arrives is a sensible way to be car care aware and avoid the inconvenience

of being stranded out in the cold and with the unexpected expense of emergency repairs, says the Car Care Council.

"Winterizing your vehicle before the temperatures drop is a wise idea," said Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council. "An investment of an hour or two to have your vehicle checked is all it takes to have peace of mind and help avoid the cost and

hassle of car trouble during severe weather."

The Car Care Council recommends the following steps for winterizing vour vehicle:

- If you're due for a tune-up, have it done before winter sets in. Winter magnifies existing problems such as pings, hard starts, sluggish performance or rough idling.
- Have the battery and charging system checked for optimum performance. Cold weather is hard on batteries.
- · Clean, flush and put new antifreeze in the cooling system. As a general rule of thumb, this should be done every two years.
- Make sure heaters, defrosters and wipers work properly. Consider winter wiper blades and use cold weather washer fluid. As a general rule, wiper blades should be replaced everv months.

- Check the tire tread depth and tire pressure. If snow and ice are a problem in your area, consider special tires designed to grip slick roads. During winter, tire pressure should be checked weekly.
- Have the brakes checked. The braking system is the vehicle's most important safety
- Have the exhaust system checked for carbon monoxide leaks, which can be especially dangerous during cold weather driving when windows are closed.
- Check to see that exterior and interior lights work and headlights are properly aimed.
- Be diligent about changing the oil and filter at recommended intervals. Dirty oil can spell trouble in winter. Consider changing to "winter weight" oil if you live in a cold climate. Have your technician check the fuel, air and

transmission filters at the same time.

Motorists should also keep the gas tank at least half full at all times to decrease the chances of moisture forming in the gas lines and possibly freezing. Drivers should check the tire pressure of the spare in the trunk and stock an emergency kit with an ice scraper and snowbrush, jumper cables, flashlight, flares, blanket, extra clothes, candles/matches, bottled water, dry food snacks and needed medication.



## Dos and don'ts of holiday shopping

Thanks to sales featuring heavily discounted items, millions of people wait to start their holiday shopping until the season hits full swing. But in spite of such bargains, overextending budgets during the holiday season is too tempting for many shoppers to resist. However, shoppers need not risk financial peril if they shop smartly and heed some dos and don'ts of holiday shopping.

• Do set a budget. Establish what you can afford to spend on gifts and other seasonal trimmings early on. - Do schedule time for shopping. Hectic schedules sometimes result in last-minute shopping that leads to impulse purchases. Schedule some distraction-free time for your holiday shopping so you're less likely to rush into purchases before thinking them through.



Spray: A vertically shaped arrangement generally wider than the swag and is fan-shaped.

vertically, and is often used in combination with garland.

Kissing ball: A round

of greens generally hung most often is hung suspended from a hook, shepherd's hook chandelier.

Mantlepiece: A long, creation of greens which narrow arrangement de-



signed to be displayed horizontally along a ledge or fireplace mantle.

Custom wreaths: Made to order, following the customer's individual design, dimensions, colors, etc. to compliment your personal decor and/ or theme.

Designer wreaths: Generally more ornate than the traditional design. Often, one-of-akind or original themes using traditional and non-traditional colors and applications.

Natural wreaths: Decorated with materials found in nature (cones, berries, nuts, flowers, etc.)

Traditional wreaths: Decorated with cones, berries and a "traditional" red or plaid bow.

Advent wreath: This wreath is most often used in church or home to commemorate the Advent season. Tapered candles in purple, pink and white are traditionally inserted into the wreath frame and are lighted weekly until Christmas.

Cemetery wreaths: A small to medium sized wreath, usually wired to an easel or frame. A traditional symbol of everlasting love & eternal

Door wreaths: Averaging 18" to 26" in diameter to fit a standard sized residential door. Available in double door size.

Wall wreaths: Varying in size from 8" to 6 ft. or more. Is generally displayed flat against an interior or exterior wall.

Window wreaths: Generally smaller than a door wreath and lighter in weight. Often displayed in multiple groupings. Can face in or out.
