Game plan for a safe Super Bowl

Many favorite Super Bowl foods are time and temperature sensitive: hot wings, chili, pizza, barbecue, sandwiches containing meat or eggs, dairy-based dips and more. If left too long at room temperature — anything after two hours — these foods can harbor harmful bacteria. The longer they sit, the greater the chances that bacteria will multiply and potentially sicken guests.

So what's your game plan for preventing foodborne illness?

Cleanliness counts

Unclean hands are one of the biggest culprits for spreading bacteria, and finger foods at parties are especially vulnerable. Chefs and guests should wash their hands with soap and warm water for 20 seconds before and after handling food. Also, be sure to clean eating surfaces often, and wash serving platters before replenishing them with fresh food.

Some teams just shouldn't play together

Think of your party fare as two different - uncooked versus ready-to-eat foods. Prevent encroachment at all costs and keep each team in its own zone. The juices from raw meat can contain harmful bacteria that crosscontaminate other food. Use one cutting board for raw meat and poultry and another one for

cutting veggies or foods that will not be cooked. If you use only one cutting board, wash it with hot soapy water and sanitize it after preparing each food item.

Take temperatures to be safe

Use a food thermometer to be sure meat and poultry are safely cooked. Remember that internal temperature, not meat color, indicates doneness. Steaks should be cooked to 145° F, ground beef should be cooked to 155° F and all poultry should be cooked to 165° F. The stated degrees are minimum temperatures.

The party may last through the night, but the food shouldn't

Holding may be one of the most likely offenses your referee encounters if your party lasts late into the night. Never hold foods for more than two hours at room temperature. Refrigerate or freeze leftovers promptly to block offensive bacteria from multiplying. The same rules apply for cold foods. If cold food has been sitting out for more than two hours, do not eat it. When in doubt, throw it out of the game — and your party.

When it comes to foodborne illness, there is no opportunity for an instant replay. To avoid these infractions, make sure you understand

the rules completely.

Display at Fort Plain Free Library

The kitchens, pantries, and cellars may have changed through the years but the dedication of those whose work it was has not. The fireplace hearth where cooking was once done has given way to the cookstove and then to the electric or gas kitchen range — to say nothing of the now-indispensable microwave. The utensils used in earlier days have mostly become treasured relics to marvel at or admire.

High on the display shelf at Fort Plain Free Library, some of them now rest to help recall an era lost to most of us. I say most because yet in Amish kitchens some of yesterday remain for those who sit at the meal table with family — those who know the mother and daughter have prepared the mountain of mashed potatoes, the creamed corn, meat and fruit canned much the same as some of us remember from our youth. Canning, pickling or drying were everyday tasks not well known to today's housewives. At this point I hope the reader will excuse the foregoing where the ladies were the only ones mentioned as cooks. Often the male members of the family have been cooks and still are.

Let's take a closer look at this display of yesterday's implements. My grandpa's pancake batter pitcher reminds this writer of morning meals of pancakes and sausage with milk gravy and maple syrup. The iron pancake griddle and pancake turner displayed are from an earlier day when it, along with the heavy tea kettle, hung from the crane in the kitchen fireplace. The andirons and long handle frying pan served the Mohawk Valley Seeber family in early days. Those long handles kept the cooks from the heat of the fire.

You might want to make your breakfast toast in the swivel bread toaster, which the blacksmith ornamented with skilled hands. Can you imagine the toast from that toaster

being passed to you at Sprakers Tavern, where the implement came from? That small iron kettle once held the stew that John L. Nellis ladled from it. John was a Stone Arabia farm boy born just the right number of years before the American Revolution that he saw service in the conflict that brought the United States of America into existence.

See that brass kettle up there? It was used by Aunt Mary to make her famous Brass Kettle Pickles. When you look at the metal utensils in this exhibit, you may well realize that they can bring yesterday's kitchen into view much the same as books or television programs.

We have noted how the blacksmith added some decorations to the utensils he produced. The other artisans of yesteryear did much the same, depending upon which material he used. The wood carver embellished his work with animals or other designs from his imagination. Stoneware jugs and crocks were often ornamented to add a splash of color to everyday life. Birds and flowers were often chosen as decorative features. The birds stare down at us, possibly waiting for their modern counterparts to fly by the window. Some stoneware is marked by its maker, often from a not-far-away location. Others bear the advertising of local stores where doors were closed a century or more ago.

All of the examples in this exhibit date from

the 1800s when crocks were used to hold everything from butter to saur kraut and pickled meat. What was once in those jugs? The answer could be anything from maple syrup to vinegar to hand cider or most any other liquid.





Tkaczyk flood relief measure passes Senate

Legislation co-sponsored by State Senator Cecilia Tkaczyk to aid property owners hurt this summer's flooding unanimously passed the State Senate on Jan. 27.

Immediately following the flooding of Fort Plain in Montgomery County, Senator Tkaczyk introduced legislation to allow impacted businesses and homeowners to have their property taxes reassessed and lowered to reflect the flood-damaged status of their home or prop-

Senator Tkaczyk said, "It is simply not fair that flood victims are expected to pay property taxes based on the pre-flood condition and value of their property. Even worse, it can hamper recovery efforts because people have so many other expenses to deal with. This legislation would help the victims by lowering their tax bills to reflect the decreased value of their property.'

A version of that (S5931) measure passed the Senate together with a second (S5985)that would create an income tax credit for flood victims. Two additional measures were also passed, S5987 would establish a supplemental state disaster aid program and S6345 create would the upstate flood mitiga-tion task force within the canal corporation.

Senator Tkaczyk Fort toured Plain immediately after the flooding, which damor destroyed more than 250 homes and businesses. She assisted with cleanup, met with local leaders, business people and homeowners, and brought investors and community development experts into the area to build relationships with local officials.

She developed her legislation after meeting with local official and community leaders to discuss the needs and the challenges they faced in the recovery effort. She also wants the State to take further action to reimburse local governments for lost tax revenue.

"It is important that we provide immediate relief to the property owners who have been hit the hardest," she said. "But we have to ensure that local governments are not doubly saddled with the cost of recovery well as the loss of revenues from sales tax, property tax and other sources.







IRS warns of tax-time scams

It's true: tax scams proliferate during the income tax filing season. The IRS provides the following scam warnings so you can protect yourself and avoid becoming a victim of these crimes:

• Be vigilant of any unexpected communication purportedly from the IRS at the start of tax season.

• Don't fall for phone and phishing email scams that use the IRS as a lure. Thieves often pose as the IRS using a bogus refund scheme or warnings to pay past-due taxes.

• The IRS doesn't initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. This includes any type of e-communication, such as text messages and social media channels.

• The IRS doesn't

ask for PINs, passwords or similar confidential information for credit card, bank or other accounts.

• If you get an unexpected email, don't open any attachments or click on any links contained in the message. Instead, forward the email to phishing@irs.gov. For more about how to report phishing scams involving the IRS visit the genuine IRS website, IRS.gov.

Here are several steps you can take to

help protect yourself against scams and identity theft:

Don't carry your Social Security card or any documents that include your Social Security number or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number.

Don't give a busi-

ness your SSN or ITIN just because they ask. Give it only when required.

 Protect your financial information.

• Check your credit report every 12 months.

• Secure personal information in your home.

• Protect your personal computers by using firewalls and anti-spam/virus software, updating security patches and changing passwords for Internet accounts.

• Don't give personal information over the phone, through the mail or on the Internet unless you have initiated the contact and are sure of the recipient

• Be careful when you choose a tax preparer. Most preparers provide excellent service, but there are a few who are unscrupulous. Refer to Tips to Help you Choose a Tax Preparer for more details.

Renovate right

Do you have plans to renovate your home? If you have an older home, Montgomery County Public Health has some tips for your safety. Lead exposure cause serious problems, especially for children under six years old. Lead-based paint was used in millions of homes until it was banned in 1978. If your home was built before then, here are some facts you should know

- Lead can affect a child's brain and developing nervous system causing reduced IQ and learning disability. Children under 6 are most at risk.
- Lead exposure can cause behavioral problems.

- Lead in dust is the most common way people are exposed to lead. Lead dust is often invisible. You can get lead in your body by breathing or swallowing lead dust or by eating soil or paint chips containing lead.
- Even children who seem healthy can have high levels of lead in their bodies.

If renovation is taking place in your child care facility or your home, the work areas should not be accessible while the work is being done. Moving out of your home temporarily while the work is being done or considering alternative accommodations for children may be a possibility to consid-

er. Federal law requires contractors who are hired for renovations in homes, child care facilities and schools built before 1978 that dispainted turb surfaces, be certified and follow specific practices to prevent lead contamination. Landlords who do renovations, repairs and painting must also be certified. Lead-based paint may be hazardous on surfaces that children can chew on such as windowsills, doors and doorframes, stairs, railings, banisters, porches and fences. Lead can also be found in drinking water in homes that have plumbing with lead or lead solder.

Always hire certified contractors for work that will disrupt paint in housing or child occupied facilities built before 1978 or get properly trained and certified yourself. You can search for a certified firm at http://cfpub.epa.gov/flpp/searchrp firm.htm.

- Shop at thrift stores just as everyone is doing spring cleaning.




