# This is a hammer

# by Samantha Mazzotta Painting in winter can be tricky

**Q:** Can I paint rooms during the wintertime? My friend says it's impossible to do because the weather is too cold. What do you say? — Jeanine H., via email

A: It's not impossible, but in colder climates it certainly can be more difficult. The main reason is that rooms need to be well-ventilated when painting; otherwise the room is hazardous to be in. It'll need to continue to be ventilated while it's drying, in order to keep humidity down, which means the windows will be wide open in the middle of winter.

In more-temperate regions, painting in winter really isn't a problem. Not only can you ventilate a room without getting frozen out of the house, but the paint cures more evenly. In belowfreezing temperatures, a latex-based paint may not dry as evenly or cure as well.

But painters do interior work in cold weather all the time. How do they do it without sealing off the room from the rest of the house? You could take a few hints from them.

Professional painters often use a reverse-air system. Rigged into one of the windows, it pulls air from the room to the outside of the house

> at a constant rate, so that fumes don't into seep the rest of the house — and the room being painted stays at a comfortable temperature.

Even without







such a system, you can paint a room by setting up a fan in the window pointing outward, and keeping your heating system registers open in the the room. Wear a respirator mask when painting to avoid breathing in fumes, and keep children out.

If you need to add more than one coat or the paint seems to be taking longer than usual to dry, consider bringing in a dehumidifier to remove more moisture from the air and speed drying.

HOME TIP: To keep paintbrushes from drying out while you take a long break, place a sandwich baggie over the bristles.

A: Officially, the Internal Revenue Service has three years to audit federal income tax returns, but there are exceptions. The agency gives itself six years after a return was filed to audit in unusual cases — for example, if additional income comes to light, and the amount is more than 25 percent of the income shown on the return. In addition, if the IRS determines a return was false or fraudulent, an audit can occur at any time — there is no time limit.

Even as you purge your old files, you might want to keep some of the records that you have with your tax returns. For example, you may want to hang onto your W-2 forms, which show your annual income and the taxes withheld from your paycheck. These could be important at some point, such as when you file for Social Security or other benefits, in case there's some type of discrepancy about your work history.

In addition, if you've kept records pertaining to buying or refinancing property or making major home improvements with your taxes, pull those before you start shredding. They could be useful if you sell your property in the future and need to establish capital gains or losses.

While you're going through that file cabinet, you might want to go on the attack on other paperwork you may no longer need. Ohio State University Extension has a fact sheet, "Household Record-keeping Tips" (online at http://ohioline.osu.edu — click on "Home" and scroll down, or search for fact sheet MM-08-02). It offers guidance on keeping financial and other types of family records, such as:

• Records that are not easily replaceable, such as military service records, Social Security cards, birth and marriage certificates, property titles, and household inventories. These should be kept someplace safe — in a home safe (fire-, water- and burglar-proof), for example, or in a safety deposit box.

# Seven winter safety tips for seniors

During the winter months ice, snow and cold temperatures can make life challenging for everyone. Slippery sidewalks and cold weather can cause a wide range of injuries and illness especially for seniors.

1. Avoid slipping on ice. Make sure to wear shoes with good traction and non-skid soles and stay inside until the roads are clear. Takes shoes off as soon as you get indoors because often snow and ice attach the soles and can become slippery.

2. Dress for warmth. Cold temperatures can lead to frostbite and hypothermia. Dress in layers, wear warm socks, a heavy coat, hat, gloves and scarf. Cover all exposed skin. Use a scarf to cover your mouth to protect your lungs.

- 3. Fight wintertime depression. Many seniors have less contact with others during cold months. This can breed loneliness and isolation. Have family check in on seniors as often as possible. Even a short phone call can make a big difference.
- 4. Check the car. Get your car serviced. Check things like the oil, tires, battery and wipers. Make sure your AAA membership is up-to-date in case of emergencies.

- 5. Prepare for power outages. Winter storms can lead to power outages. Make sure you have easy access to flashlights, a battery powered radio, blankets, and non-perishable food that can be eaten cold.
- 6. Eat a varied diet. Because people spend more time indoors and eat a smaller variety of foods nutritional deficits especially Vitamin D deficiency can be a problem. Eat foods that are fortified with Vitamin D, such as milk, grains and seafood like tuna and salmon.
- 7. Prevent carbon monoxide poisoning. Using a fireplace, gas heater or lanterns can lead to carbon monoxide poisoning. To ensure safety check the batteries in your carbon monoxide detector or buy an updated one if needed.

Don't be afraid to ask for help if you need it! Hire someone to clear your property of snow/ice. Arrange for transportation to the store or appointments. Reach out for help if you need assistance!

### Fun facts about February

February is the shortest month of the year, but many people have no idea why that is. February is the only month to have fewer than 30 days, but there is no scientific reason behind that distinction, though there have been various changes to the calendar throughout the centuries, and eventually February became what it is today.

The Romans developed a 10 month calendar that began with the Spring equinox in March and ended in December. There is belief that what is now February was overlooked when this calendar was created, as winter weather had little to do with the harvest in the northern hemisphere. where Rome is located. Romans essentially considered the winter a period of time with no distinctive months.

When the second king of Rome, Numa Pompilius, took to the throne in 713 BC, he had plans to make the calendar more accurate by synchronizing it with the actual lunar year, which is roughly 354 days long. Thus, two new months, January and February, were added to the end of the calendar. Both January and February had 28 days.

At the time, even numbers were considered bad luck, and these months were not looked upon favorably by the king. So he decided to make changes once more and added a day to January to make it 29 days long. February was left untouched, remaining an "unlucky" month and one devoted to honoring the dead and performing rites of purification, as the word February comes from

februare, which means "to purify." February remained the last month of the year for roughly 200 years until the calendar was reevaluated and February was reassigned as the second month, with January being the start of the new year.

This new 355-day calendar simply could not stay in sync with the seasons because it did not account for the amount of time it takes the Earth to orbit the sun. Therefore, an extra "month" of 27 days was added after Feb. 23 each year to play catch-up. Sometimes this extra month was overlooked or not scheduled in time, continuing the calendar conundrum.

Julius Caesar was responsible for tackling calendar problems further when he was in power. He wished to make the calendar solar-based, like the

one Egyptians used, instead of the older lunar-based calendar. This led to the creation of the Julian calendar. Ten days were added to the calendar year in various months, and February was increased every four years (leap year) to 29 days to coordinate the calendar year to the solar cycle of roughly 365.2425 days.

February remains the shortest month of the year. Through the years there has been no widespread attempt to reorganize the calendar once more to even out the months and give extra time to February. As a result of the shorter number of days, February has some unique attributes. In common years, February can pass without a single full moon. The next time this will happen is in 2018. Once every six years, February is the only month that has four, full seven-day weeks.

February starts on the same day of the week as March and November in common years, and on the same day of the week as August on leap years. February ends on the same day of the week as October every year. In leap years, it is the only month that begins and ends on the same weekday.

People born on a leap year technically celebrate their birthday only once every four years, but most observe it on the 28th. Celebrities born on February 29 include Tony Robbins, Antonio Sabato, Jr., Mervyn Warren, and Dennis Farina.

Despite its status as the shortest month, February is packed with many events, including Valentine's Day and Groundhog's Day. Americans celebrate the birth of two presidents in February, as well as Black History Month. Mexicans celebrate Flag Day in February, while residents of St. Lucia celebrate their Independence Day. February is also a time for families, especially in Canada, where Family Day is celebrated on the third Monday of the month in many provinces.

February is also an important month for sports fans, as two teams will face each other in the Super Bowl on the first Sunday of February.

No one really knows for certain why February was relegated to the shortest month. However, with so much trivia and special events surrounding the month, it is still a special time of year.

### Exercise beneficial for dementia

Exercise may benefit older people with dementia by improving their cognitive functioning and ability to carry out everyday activities, according to a new systematic review published in The Cochrane Library. However, the authors of the review did not see any clear effect of exercise on depression in older people with dementia and say that more evidence is needed to understand how exercise could reduce the burden on family caregivers and health systems.

Due to people living longer, rates of dementia are expected to rise sharply in the coming decades. Dementia affects the brain in different ways and is associated with effects on memory and personality. It is thought that exercise might be useful in treating dementia or slowing its progression, through improvements in the ability to carry out everyday tasks and positive effects on mental processes such as memory and attention, collectively described as cognitive functioning. Exercise may therefore indirectly benefit family caregivers and the healthcare system by reducing some of the burden of dementia.

The study updates a Cochrane review carried out in 2008, when only four trials on the effects of exercise in older people with dementia were available. In the updated review, data from eight trials involving 329 people showed that exercise could improve cognitive functioning. Data from six studies involving 289 people showed that exercise could improve the ability of older people with dementia to carry out daily activities, such as walking short distances or getting up from a chair.

"In our previous review, we were unable to draw any conclusions about the effectiveness of exercise in older people with dementia, due to a shortage of appropriate

trials." said researcher. Dorothy Forbes, an Associate Professor of Nursing who works at the University of Alberta in Edmonton, Alberta. "Following this new review, we are now able to conclude that there is promising evidence for exercise programs improving cognition and the ability to carry out daily activities. However, we do still need to be cautious about how we interpret these findings."

The researchers remain cautious because there were substantial


differences among the results of individual trials. In addition, they did not find enough evidence to determine whether exercise improved challenging behaviors or depression in older people with dementia. They were unable to come to any conclusions regarding quality of life, or benefits for family caregivers and health systems, because there was not enough evidence.

However, the researchers suggest that if more evidence becomes available in future, it may help to address the question of whether exercise can help people with dementia remain at home for longer. "Clearly, further research is needed to be able to develop best practice guidelines to enable healthcare providers to advise people with dementia living at home or in institutions," said Forbes. "We also need to understand what level and intensity of exercise is beneficial for someone with dementia.'



### Staying safe on frozen lakes


Anglers, skaters and outdoor enthusiasts often take to the great outdoors when lakes and other bodies of water freeze. But even after days of below-freezing temperatures, lakes may not be solid, increasing the risk that revelers will fall through the ice, possibly resulting in drowning or hypothermia. As a result, it is imperative that safety precautions be taken when spending time on frozen lakes.

Though it can be fun to skate or fish on a frozen lake, ice is never safe and it's always in one's best interest to treat ice with caution. Ice strength depends on various factors. including daily temperature, water depth, water chemistry, currents, and distribution of the load on the ice. It is impossible to judge the thickness of the ice by appearance alone. Your best bet is to proceed with caution and follow these tips for survival.

• Be prepared for any scenario. Prepare for the possibility of a plunge. Carry a long metal or you are unsure about. The bar also can be used as a walking stick. Carry safety spikes to provide traction if you fall through and need to

ice. Also, never venture out alone. Always go with a partner or alert someone to your whereabouts.

• Always wear a life jacket. Life jackets act as



metal-tipped wood pole, called a spud bar, which can be used to test the strength of areas of ice climb up onto the ice.

• Avoid crossing frozen bodies of water in a single file, as it may stress the flotation devices until you can get to safety.

• Do not take a vehicle onto the ice. A car or light

truck needs 8 to 12 inches of clear ice to be safe.

- Be aware of cracks or fissures in the ice. Be extremely cautious crossing ice near river mouths, points of land, islands, and springs. Currents can cause ice to be thinner in these areas.
- Carry a safety line. Such lines can be thrown to someone who has fallen through the ice. This may be the best method of pulling someone to safety.
- Remain calm if you fall through the ice. Avoid thrashing, which can use up energy and body heat. Try to keep your head and face above the water. The body will react to the plunge by going into "cold shock," a condition characterized by hyperventilation, involuntary gasping and internal responses including hypertension (high blood pressure) and changes in pulse

rate. You do have time to get out. Many people can last two to five minutes in cold water before strength and coordination are compromised.

Try to normalize your breathing to ensure you get enough oxygen to react and get to safety. Concentrate on breathing slowly and steadily. Kick your feet and pull yourself out of the water at the strongest edge of the ice. Try to roll up onto the ice, staying flat to distribute your body weight. Roll yourself away from the hole into which you fell and remain on your hands and knees until you crawl several feet away. Only then should you stand up and walk to safety to get dry and warm.

Spending time on a frozen lake can be fun, but it's also risky. Knowing how to react in an emergency situation may just save a life.


