

Hello Again,



# Bill Naple's incredible edibles

According to retired Adirondack guide Bill Naple, New York State Department of Conservation rescues about 200 people lost in the woods each year. That's one reason he's dedicated to teaching folks about edible wild plants for survival.

St. John's Lutheran Church in Freysbush recently sponsored a workshop presented by Naple, where amidst much laughter, he shared humorous experiences and information.

"If you get lost in the woods you need food, clothing and shelter," said Naple. "What I want to accomplish here, is to tell you some plants that you can eat if you get lost."

Wild strawberries plants, grass, dandelions, blackberries, raspberries, white daisy, yellow birch, cattails and invasive Japanese Knotweed were a few of the plants discussed by Naple, along with bark, white pine, roots and mushrooms.

Naple said when he hikes he never gets thirsty because he chews blueberry, raspberry and blackberry leaves. "And that just keeps the saliva flowing."

Attendees examined, smelled and tasted the many

samples of plants that were distributed.

"Yellow birch is the best," Naple stated. "It even has some natural aspirin in it. The elm tree has good flavor to it and so does the inner bark of white pine, blue spruce or any spruce."

Naple explained that the needles of pine trees are full of vitamin C and make an excellent tea.

Naple credited his mother for teaching him and his five siblings about wintergreen leaves and buds of different plants including milkweed. "Some folks will tell you this is poison," Naple said about the milkweed. "I got on the Cornell site and they said that this very tasty white milk in here has a poison that makes your heart beat faster. I don't worry about that with the buds. The only thing I worry about is those crazy ants. They really do like the milk and you may get bit on the tongue!" He did caution folks with a heart condition to steam the plant before ingesting it.

Naples pointed out several important things to remember when walking or hiking in the woods. If you get lost, stay in one place. Carry a flashlight, mirror, compass and whistle -

even if you only intend to go for a short walk. "Most people that get lost say they are just going down the trail a little ways."

Plastic bags in various sizes may be invaluable if you are lost. Extra large sized bags can be used to keep you warm and protected from the elements.

Cotton balls soaked in Vaseline make excellent firestarters and dandelion diggers are good tools to carry.



Dear Editor,

I would like to bring to your attention a project being proposed to the Manheim Board of Appeals. The Xpress Natural Gas Company (XNG), would like to build a natural gas compression station on Route 167 in the middle of a field in the town of Manheim, Herkimer County, NY. Route 167 runs from Rte 29 in Dolgeville to Rte 5 in Little Falls. There have been many meetings and many concerns have been raised. This area is agriculture/commercial and a natural gas compression station is clearly industrial. Many farms, livestock and residents are in very close proximity to the site. XNG will need a special permit something that can be awarded to them by the Manheim Board of Appeals.

It has become known that the town of Manheim did not file the required paperwork for the NYS moratorium on hydraulic-fracturing (fracking), despite the board voting unanimously to do so in June of 2013. We have been told that the moratorium on fracking would not affect the construction of the compression station. We beg to differ! The moratorium was thrown out in a private executive meeting.

Another concern is the amount of traffic that will be traveling on Rte 167. XNG will be running between 25 to 45 tractor trailers 20/7 [20 hours a day, 7 days a week], continuously. Residents of this area consider 167 to be a dangerous road, especially in winter. The wind can blow the snow from the fields onto the roadway all winter long.

XNG has chosen this site because the Iroquois Pipeline runs through this farm and they can tap into it with ease for their commercial customers. They will not be offering CNG to residents. This station will not bring benefits to the individuals here. It will cost all of us in property values, diminished landscape and increased traffic and potential health issues.

This project has been in the hands of the Manheim Boards since December 2013. We are running out of time! At one of the meetings there were 120 people. Where are you? This is



your neighborhood. If the board gives XNG the OK it will then be too late!

Usually when people think about keys, they envision the type used for opening doors and starting cars. But did you know that there is such thing as a bed key? Bed keys are for loosening the bolts securing a bed's side rails to its head and foot boards.

This particular bed key comprises a single arm with a tapered slot which allowed the bed key to be used for bolts of various sizes. The forked end was used to loosen slotted cap screw-type bolts.

Bed keys were also an important early firefighting tool. In the 1700s, when firefighting equipment was still only able to supply small amounts of water, firefighters instead turned to salvage efforts in order to minimize property loss. Bed keys helped these men disassemble beds efficiently.



If you are interested in acquiring a HUD Home that is in need of repair, you may be interested in applying for an FHA 203(k) Rehabilitation Loan.

When a homebuyer wants to purchase a house in need of repair or modernization, the homebuyer usually has to obtain financing first to purchase the dwelling; additional financing to do the rehabilitation construction; and a permanent mortgage when the work is completed to pay off the interim loans with a permanent mortgage. Often the interim financing (the acquisition and construction loans) involves relatively high interest rates and short amortization periods.





consider. 1. Adaptive cruise control. This uses forwardlooking sensors like radar and cameras to monitor the distance to a lead vehicle. The system will automatically slow the vehicle in traffic to maintain a safe following distance without the driver having to do anything. As traffic accelerates, the vehicle responds to maintain the 2. Forward collision avoidance system. Using the same forward-looking sensors, these pre-crash warning systems alert drivers with visual or auditory cues when the vehicle is getting too close to the one in front.

3. Autonomous braking. If the driver doesn't respond to the warning, some systems are able to brake automatically to prevent a collision or lessen the impact. Systems that combine forward-collision warning and auto-brake are the most effective, Camarano says.

4. Adaptive headlights. This innovative technology surprised researchers with how well it performed. According to Highway Loss Data Institute research, property damage liability claims fell as much as 10 percent with adaptive headlights.

5. Backup camera. Once a luxury vehicle standard, the backup camera often displayed in the rearview mirrors or in-dash display is now a popular option on midrange cars, giving drivers assurance when backing out of a parking spot or down a driveway. 6. Reverse backup sen-

sors. For use with or without a camera, this equipment beeps if you are about to hit something while backing up.

7. Side view assist. Sensors can detect a car in your blind spot and then alert you with a light in your side mirror or with a beep if your turn signal is engaged.

8. Parking assist. An increasing number of models offer a feature that detects the size of a parallel parking space, guides you into the starting position, then allows you to completely take your hands off the wheel while the computer backs the vehicle into place.

## Learn the proper way to wear a graduation mortarboard



Graduation season is upon us, and that means students from all over the country are preparing for the next chapter in their lives. But before they further their educations or enter the job market, they must first participate in a longrunning tradition: the graduation ceremony.

At this event full of pomp and circumstance, graduates will be required to wear some sort of unifying, formal dress to set themselves apart from others. Many schools use the traditional cap and gown for graduations. This consists of a robed gown and tassel-topped mortarboard that usually

coordinate with the official school colors. Graduates also may wear other accoutrements depending on the level of their degrees. This tradition dates back to medieval Europe when students wore special uniforms each day to denote they were scholars. But today's students dress up in academic regalia only during commencement proceedings or other graduation-related events.

Of the various components of graduation dress, the one that may give graduates the most difficulty is the mortarboard. The square academic cap is referred to as a "mortarboard" because of its similarity in appearance to the hawk or hod tool used by masons to hold mortar. It can be a cumbersome piece that may slip off if not worn correctly or if it cap of the mortarboard should fit snugly on the

head. It should not rest on the top of the head, but fit well enough to cover at least the top one-third of the head. If the cap seems loose, graduates may want to use a few bobby pins to keep it in place.

The mortarboard should be positioned so that its point faces the middle of the forehead. When viewed from above, it should create a diamond shape, not a square. Also, the mortarboard should be horizontal (parallel) to the floor. Imagine it to be a flat surface on which a cup or book can be placed. If the mortarboard is tilted upward, it is worn incorrectly. Some graduates position the mortarboard

around a button. The tassel indicates the level of academic achievement. Graduates who will be receiving a high school diploma or an undergraduate degree from a college or university will wear the tassel so that it hangs over the front-right side of the mortarboard. Once the diplomas are received, graduates will be instructed to flip the tassel over to the left-hand side. Graduates receiving a Master's

degree begin with the tassel on the front left side and switch it over the right after receiving their diplomas. Graduates frequently keep their tassels as mementos.

The graduation ceremony is rife with tradition, from the processional to the speakers to the manner of dress. Mastering the mortarboard can help graduates look their best on this special day.




