Six backyard projects

(BPT) — When it comes to caring for your yard, maintenance is crucial especially during the fall when it needs to recover from the wear and tear of summer and prepare for winter's harsh conditions. Knowing what your lawn and garden needs from season to season not only makes it easier for you to stay organized with your list of backyard to-do's, but it also allows you to identify and treat any problems before they become bigger issues down the road.

Get your lawn and garden back in shape and ready for the coming season by completing these fall backyard projects.

1. Patch and seed -Extreme summer weather conditions like heat, excess rainfall and drought can lead to diseased or dead patches of grass throughout your yard. If you notice an affected area while inspecting your lawn, treat the problem area immediately and then reseed it. This will nourish grass, plus help it establish strong roots needed for growth in the spring.

2. Plant bulbs - Give your spring garden a head start by planting bulbs five to eight inches deep, depending on the size, with the pointy end up. You can also plant bulbs in clusters. However, since bulbs can be hard to tell apart, be sure to keep the labels intact until they are planted.

3. Remove leaves and small debris -Leaves, small twigs and light dirt can quickly accumulate in your yard during the fall and if not removed, can cause soil compaction and make your yard look messy. For a quick cleanup solution, use a leaf blower to easily move debris from your lawn, driveway or patio.

4. Compost - Fall isn't too late to start a compost pile as it takes six months to one year to develop into rich soil you can use in your garden. Keep in mind, compost decomposition slows down during the cooler months, which is why it is important to retain needed for decomposition by refraining from turning your compost pile.

5. Prune - Pruning is considered the best preventive mainte-

nance for your trees and shrubs, particularly in the fall and late dormant season. Look to prune diseased or dying branches, but be sure not to remove unreasonably large branches. This leaves exposed stubs that can potentially cause health problems.

6. Weed — Though a year-round yard task, it's extremely important to pull as many weeds as possible in the fall. As cooler temperatures set in, weeds start to store food in their roots for the winter. Prevent regrowth by pulling or digging weeds out of the ground with a weeding blade or use a homemade weed control solution, such as a combination of vinegar, water and dish soap.







by David Uffington Save on funeral costs

Do you know the cost of a funeral? If not, you're not alone. A recent poll by the National Foundation for Credit Counseling found that 83 percent of respondents had no idea of the costs or the financial responsibilities of a funeral.

The average cost of a funeral can run between \$7,000 and \$10,000.

If you're responsible for a funeral, you'll need to interact with the funeral home; acquire headstone, likely from a marble supplier; and consult with the cemetery for a plot. While the funeral home can put these together in a package, all cost money.

In addition, you'll need to consider use of a hearse, a limo to bring people to the funeral, multiple death certificates (every agency will want one), an organist for the service, clergy or minister, flowers and obituary notices in the newspapers.

The NFCC has some suggestions for making a difficult (and expensive) time a bit easier.

- Know in advance the funeral preferences of your loved ones. Make sure your own wishes are known as well by others in the family. Put these in writing and give copies to those who would handle arrangements for your funeral.
 - When the time

comes, treat the expense of a funeral as you would any other large expense: comparison shop with at least two funeral homes.

- By law, you must be given an itemized statement of costs of goods and services being purchased. Barring specific costs, a good faith estimate must be given to you. Federal Trade Commisrules sion apply here, too, when it comes to the purchase of a casket. For example, you cannot be charged a fee for using a casket that is purchased elsewhere.
- Don't spend more than you need to. Fancy and elaborate isn't necessary.
- Know the laws of your state, as they Understand vary. which are optional and which are required. Some funeral homes, for example, require embalming there is to be viewing and visitation, while the state laws don't require it. That might an optional expense you avoid.
- If you purchase a pre-arranged funeral plan policy, know your state laws, and be sure your family knows you have it.



A: Your bank was patented on March 2, 1886, by James H. Bowen of Philadelphia. It was manufactured by J. & E. Stevens and Compa-Cromwell, of Conn. The bank was available on either a brown or red base. I found the Monkey and Coconut bank referenced in "The Official Guide to Mechanical Banks" by Dan Morphy and published by House of Collectibles. Morphy claims this bank is worth somewhere the \$1,000 to \$12,000 range based, of course, on condi-

A: Barber shop col-

Remodeling insurance can protect homeowners

Many steps are involved in a successful home remodeling project. A common mistake made by homeowners is failing to consult with a homeowners' insurance agent before beginning a major home overhaul. The National Association of Insurance Commissioners advises reviewing your home insurance policy before any significant work is done on your home. The right amount of coverage will protect your assets both during construction and afterward when your home is worth more.

According to the independent consumer insurance website Insure.com, one in four remodeling projects will increase the value of a home by more than 25 percent, so there's a good chance you will need to increase your

coverage to compensate for renovations done on the home. Many insurance companies require you to insure your home for at least 80 percent of its replacement value. If you have added an extension or installed an inground pool, you may have raised the value of your property enough to necessitate an insurance policy change.

Begin by talking with your insurance company and explain the scope of the planned renovations. Inquire whether you will need to update or amend your current insurance policy to protect yourself financially during the renovation. This is particularly important for those who will be doing the work themselves or asking a friend or family member for help. While many contractors have

business and general liability insurance to protect themselves if a worker is injured, homeowners may need sufficient liability protection in the event a non-contractor gets hurt working on your home. Your insurance company may have other types of insurance to protect you further if you are planning a very large project. Failure to ask about coverage before starting the renovations puts you at risk.

If you will be using contractors and subcontractors, be sure that they are insured and bonded. Should they damage your home or be injured during the renovation, their insurance will cover any resulting expenses. However, if they are not insured or bonded, you may be held liable through your own insur-

ance policy or you may have to pay out of pocket.

Keep all receipts and document the progress of the renovation. You may need this information to present to your insurance carrier after the renovation is complete. This way you can request a new appraisal of the property

and secure adequate insurance coverage.

Certain improvements may make you eligible for discounts. For example, a new heating system, energy efficient appliances or an alarm system may qualify you for rebates or lower premiums.

Homeowners may think

they have covered all of their bases when preparing for a home renovation project. However, it also is essential to consider insurance needs before you begin work and then again when the project has been completed and the value of the home has increased.

Did you know?

Many home improvement projects involve hanging decorative items, such as photo frames or shelving. Homeowners frequently wrestle with nails, screws and hanging hardware, perhaps creating more holes in their walls than is necessary to get items level and in the right spots. Instead of playing a guessing game of figuring out where the hanging holes or hooks are located on the back of items, use your office equipment to make life easier. Make a copy of the back of the item you're trying to hang with a printer/scanner or a copy machine, making sure to copy the item to full

scale. Print the copy at full size and use it to drill the hanging holes. If you don't have access to a copy machine or scanner, use a piece of tape to measure the distance between the hanging holes on

the back of the frame. Stick the tape to the wall and then put your nails or screws at the ends of the tape.



Hunting season is on the horizon and that means preparing now for the few weeks of sport to come.

Hunting is a popular hobby and sport enjoyed by millions of people across North America. Over the last 10 years, data from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service indicates that more and more females are taking up hunting.

Hunting seasons vary depending on where you live. Regulations designed by local conservation, game, fish, and wildlife departments often dictate the start and end of hunting season. Although the licensing, seasons, limits, and fees for hunting may differ geographically, the preparation that goes into getting ready for hunting season is similar regardless of geography.

Many seasoned hunters realize hunting season does not begin on "opening day." Rather, it can take weeks or months to get ready for a successful season. Considering hunting seasons can be brief, preparation helps hunters make the most of their time spent in the field.

- Purchase your license, tag or stamp. Many wildlife departments require hunters register in advance of the season, and this registration includes securing a hunting license. Because there is a limit to how many animals each hunter can hunt, tags for the animals they're hunting also will be issued. Hunters planning on going out for the season should stay apprised of when licensing and registration begins and ends so they can hunt legally.
- Scout areas. The landscape can change from year to year depending on a host of factors, including construction, commercialization and weather. Areas once open to hunting may now be restricted lands. Map out your potential hunting location and be aware of any new landmarks or changes.
- Check and replenish gear. Inspect weaponry, field-dressing supplies, clothing, and other supplies for wear and tear. Address any issues that need

to be fixed, or replace items as necessary. If a rifle, bow or shotgun hasn't been fired in a while, take it to a range to verify accuracy and sighting. If you hunt out of a tree stand or blind, make sure it is sturdy and in good condition prior to use.

• **Get in shape.** Hunting often requires hiking

in and out of the great outdoors in various terrain. It's helpful to increase physical activity leading up to the hunt to prepare your body for the physical demands of hunting.

• Organize and pack gear. Ensure your equipment is clean, in working order and packed away in your travel bags. Establish a system of organization and a checklist so you're certain you will have what you need. Don't forget to bring along your hunting license and animal tags; otherwise, you may be levied with costly fines.

• Always hunt safely. It is quite easy to get swept up in the moment when tracking game. Don't let overzealousness cloud rational judgement and safety precautions. Otherwise an injury or even death can occur.



It's lunch time!

School is back in session — and so is your daily lunch-making routine. A good lunch is a balanced one, formed around a dependable main course and punctuated with a solid supporting cast of nutrient-packed sides, a low- or no-calorie drink and even a little treat.

Don't worry if your child wants basically the same lunch every day. Just include these nutritious choices that we call the four elements to a perfectly packed lunch. Here are some tips that will keep your child's school mealtimes healthy and happy all year long!

Food safety tips

- Keep food preparation areas in the kitchen clean. Wash countertops, cutting boards, utensils and your hands in hot, soapy water. And don't let the family pet jump up on kitchen coun-
- After preparing lunches, remember to immediately return unused portions of perishable foods — like cheeses, deli meats and mayonnaise — to the refrigerator. Don't let them sit out on the counter.
- Make sure that cold foods are cold before packing them in a lunchbox. If possible, prepare the lunch the night before and store it in the refrigerator. (This also takes the edge off the mad morning rush!)
- Insulated lunch bags or boxes are the best way to keep food at a safe temperature until noon. Sandwiches made with refrigerated items such as luncheon meats, cheese and tuna salad should be car-

ried in an insulated lunch bag with an ice pack or frozen juice pouch inside so sandwiches will stay ex-

- At school, instruct the kids to store their lunchbox out of direct sunlight and away from radiators or other heaters, if possi-
- Keep hot foods like soups, stews or chilies hot. In the morning, bring the food to a boil and then immediately pour into a hot, sterile vacuum bottle. (Sterilize the vacuum bottle with boiling water.)

Lunch foods that can be eaten at room temperature include:

- Peanut butter
- Jams and jellies
- Breads, crackers, cere-
- · Clean fruits and vegetables
- Dried meats, such as beef ierky
- Baked products, such as cookies and cakes
- Canned meat or poultry products that are eaten immediately after opening

Make healthy choices

In a nutshell, meats should be lean (no salami or bologna), breads should whole-wheat condiments should be used sparingly. Here are some ideas:

- A turkey or roast beef and Swiss sandwich on wheat bread with a drizzle of low-fat Italian dressing (instead of mayo) and loaded with produce, if you can get away with it! Shredded coleslaw mix (cabbage and carrots) is a great sandwich addition. It stays crisp, adds a nice crunch to a sandwich, and is high in vitamins A and
- · Sliced ham, cheese and Triscuits
 - PB&J (check vour school's policy on nuts and nut products first) made on whole-wheat bread with a pure-fruit jelly Smucklike er's Simply Fruit.
 - Thermos of hot soup
 - Grilled $c\ h\ i\ c\ k\ e\ n$ breast
 - Hardboiled eggs
 - Tuna or cubed chicken with tossed light mayo,

mustard, celery and carrot Lunch sides with substance

Only one in four kids consumes the recommended five servings of fruits and vegetables daily, so pack a lunch without produce and you're missing a golden opportunity to slip some much-needed nutrients back into their diets. As long as you have at least one piece of fruit or a serving of vegetables, adding a second crunchy snack is fine.

- · Carrot sticks
- Celery sticks
- Apple slices with peanut butter
- Fruit salad; banana, pear, peach, or any other whole fruit
- Grapes
- Olives
- Almonds and raisins (mixed 50-50)
- Triscuits
- Small bag of pretzel sticks or Goldfish pretzels
 - Baked! Lay's

Considering that many

kids' beverages have nearly as much sugar per ounce as soft drinks, tossing the wrong drink in the lunchbox could translate into 3-5 extra pounds by the end of the school year. Drinks should be either zero- or low-cal (water, tea. diet drinks) or high in nutrition (milk, 100 percent juice). Here are the best picks, in descending order.

- Water
- Lightly sweetened iced tea, like Honest Tea
- Low-fat milk

- 100 percent juice drinks
- Low-calorie kids' drinks, like Minute Maid Fruit Falls and Tropicana Fruit Squeeze







Get the 411 on flooring

Choosing the right flooring for a home is no small task. Flooring is expensive, so homeowners want to make the best decision possible so their choice of flooring is not one they regret and ultimately replace in the years to come.

Bamboo flooring is made of strands of bamboo that are glued together. forming engineered planks or solid strips. Laminate

Laminate flooring is among the less expensive flooring materials to buy and install. Homeowners who purchase laminate flooring have an array of options to choose from, and floating laminate flooring systems can be installed over existing floors without glue or nails. Some feel laminate flooring is indistinguishable from real wood, but the plastic coating that makes up the top layer of laminate flooring is often a giveaway that the floors are laminate and not real wood. Similar in construction to engineered wood, laminate flooring differs because its top layer is a photographic imprint on the face of each board, whereas engineered wood is made up of real hardwood veneer attached to several layers of plywood.

Cork

Cork is another sustainable flooring material that's a favorite among homeowners looking to make their homes more eco-friendly. The appearance of cork floors is unlike many flooring materials, as it is speckled thanks to unusual grain patterns of the trees from which it is harvested. Cork flooring is popular in kitchens and bathrooms because cork tiles have a naturally nonslip surface that makes areas of a home where floors get wet safer. Cork flooring may need to be resealed every few years to guard against stains and potential moisture issues.

Flooring choices vary greatly, and it's easy for homeowners to become overwhelmed by all of the options at their disposal. But taking time to understand each of those options can make the process of choosing a floor that much more fun.

Countertop options abound

Also like laminate countertops, quartz surfaces tend to have easily visible seams, which may irk homeowners who find such minor imperfections an eyesore. Quartz countertops can be expensive depending on the amount of surface area a kitchen has, so budget-conscious homeowners with especially large kitchens may find quartz countertops bust their budgets.



The numerous countertop options give homeowners the opportunity to find the one that best suits their needs.

Granite

The natural beauty of granite is what draws many homeowners to install this popular surface material in their kitchens. Thanks to their unique shading and tone, granite countertops are never the same from one home to the next, and granite complements many different cabinet colors. Granite also is resistant to heat, scarring and, when sealed properly, stains. Granite is naturally porous, so if it is not sealed properly, it can harbor bacteria. Some granite countertops must be sealed annually, while some pretreated countertops can go as long as 15 years without a need for resealing. Unlike other countertop surface materials, granite, which is among the most expensive countertop materials, does not come in a vast array of colors, so homeowners should expect to choose from just 20 or so color options.

Recycled glass

Homeowners who want to give their kitchens a modern and eco-friendly feel may want to consider recycled glass countertops. Recycled glass countertops, the majority of which are now produced with 80 to 90 percent post-consumer glass, are made of pieces of glass that are held together with cement binders. Some might be concerned that countertops made of recycled glass are not very strong, but the cement binders are very hard, making the countertops durable, strong and unlikely to chip or crack. Recycled glass countertops come in various colors and are resistant to both heat and stains. Installation of recycled glass countertops can be tricky, as improper installation can lead to stress points that make the glass susceptible to cracking. As a result, the installation of recycled glass countertops is best left to professionals with experience on such projects. Recycled glass countertops can be quite expensive as well.

A homeowner's choice of countertop surface material can go a long way toward defining the personality of his or her kitchen, so homeowners should consider their options before making a final decision.

Budget-friendly bathroom transformation tips

The allure of a spa-style bathroom is something few homeowners can resist. Such bathrooms can make for a welcome retreat after a long day at the office or an afternoon spent chasing kids around the yard.

Did you know?

Homeowners about to embark on home improvement projects should prioritize dust removal to avoid the potentially negative side effects of exposure to lead dust. When undergoing a renovation, homes built before 1978, the year the use of lead paint was banned, are likely to produce lead dust, which occurs when lead paint is sanded or chipped. That dust can be especially harmful to children, pregnant women and pets.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. lead dust that is as small as a grain of sand is enough to poison children, who may suffer brain damage, hearing loss, nervous

system and kidney damage, and decreased muscle and bone growth after exposure to lead dust. When pregnant women are exposed to lead dust, that exposure may affect the baby's cognitive development while increasing the mother's blood pressure. Household pets exposed to lead dust may suffer from a series of side effects, including vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain and possibly death.

When making renovations to their homes, homeowners can open windows and wear protective gear such as masks and safety goggles to avoid direct exposure to lead dust.

Financial options

Home owners have financial advantages that renters do not enjoy. With a fixed rate mortgage, you know exactly what your payment will be for up to 30 years. Even on an adjustable rate mortgage, you have a cap on your rate, and you can figure out what your maximum possible payment would be. Renters do not have the luxury of knowing what their rent will be next year or 20 years from now. Another advantage is that your home is considered a financial asset that you can borrow against once you have built up enough equity. You also can use the interest and property taxes that you pay on your home to lower your federal income tax. If you are a first-time home buyer, you also may qualify for a tax credit. The most common types of loans used to borrow against equity include home equity loans, reverse mortgages and refinancina.

Home Equity Loan

A home equity line of credit allows you to borrow money against the equity in your home. It provides a convenient, lowcost, tax deductible source of extra funds. The downside is that your home is used as collateral on the loan and you risk foreclosure if you miss any of your payments. If you are having trouble making your monthly mortgage payment or home equity loan payment, there are steps that you can take to prevent foreclosure, but you must act quickly.

Reverse mortgage

A reverse mortgage is a special type of home equity loan that allows older adults to use the equity in their homes without having to sell or pay back the loan as long as they live in the home. The lender gives the borrower a lump sum, monthly payments or a line of credit, which are usually are not repaid until the borrower moves or dies.

• How it works. In a "regular" mortgage, you make monthly payments to the lender. In a "reverse" mortgage, you receive money from the lender, and generally don't have to pay it back for as long as you live in your home. The loan is repaid when your home is no longer your primary residence, and you never will owe more than the home is worth when it is eventually sold. The proceeds of a reverse mort-

gage usually are tax-free, and many reverse mortgages have no income restrictions.


- Types of reverse mortgages. The two most common types of reverse mortgages are federally-insured reverse mortgages, known as Home Equity Conversion Mortgages (HECMs) that are backed by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and proprietary reverse mortgages, which are private loans back by the companies that make them.
- Do you qualify? You may be eligible for a reverse mortgage if you own your own home, use the home as your principal residence, have substantial equity in the home and you and your spouse/partner are at least 62 years of age. It is important to shop for a reverse mortgage as each loan program will have its own eligibility requirements, income amounts, timing of payments, interest rates, and/or initial costs. You may qualify for one program, but not another.
- Is a reverse mortgage right for you? AARP suggests that you consider other housing options before deciding on a reverse mortgage. AARP also provides

independent information about reverse mortgages and other, less costly alternatives to help you decide if a reverse mortgage is right for you. Virginia Cooperative Extension also provides a worksheet and checklists that can help you sort through the advantages and disadvantages of reverse mortgages.

• How to get the best deal. If vou want a reverse mortgage. there are several resources that can help you find the best deal. You need to shop carefully because the initial costs (application fees, points and closing costs) and interest rates are usually higher for a reverse mortgage than for other types of mortgage loans. Consumer's union offers a tip sheet with questions to ask when shopping for a loan. Reverse-mortgage counselling is available online through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Refinancing your mortgage

Refinancing a mortgage is a process of taking out a new mortgage on your existing home in order to lower your interest rate, lower your payment, convert from an adjustable rate mortgage (ARM) to a fixed rate

mortgage, convert to a loan with a shorter term, or use some of the equity in your home to make major purchases. Remember... refinancing is not always in your best interest. As a general rule, it takes at least three years and a savings of at least 2 percentage points below your current mortgage interest rate to recover the costs of refinancing. If you decide that refinancing is too expensive, ask your lender whether you can get some or all of the new terms you want by requesting a mortgage modification instead of taking out a new



Shopping for a loan

Your choice of lender and type of loan will influence not only your settlement costs but also the monthly cost of your mortgage loan. There are many types of lenders and types of loans you can choose. You may be familiar with banks, savings associations, mortgage companies and credit unions, many of which provide home mortgage loans. You may find a listing of some mortgage lenders in the yellow pages or a listing of rates in your local newspaper.

Mortgage Brokers.

Some companies, known as "mortgage brokers" offer to find you a mortgage lender willing to make you a loan. A mortgage broker may operate as an independent business and may not be operating as your "agent" or representative. Your mortgage broker may be paid by the lender, you as the borrower, or both. You may wish to ask about the fees that the mortgage broker will receive for its services.

Government Programs.

You may be eligible for a loan insured through the Federal Housing Administration ("FHA") or quaranteed by the Department of Veterans Affairs or similar programs operated by cities or states. These programs usually require a smaller downpayment. Ask lenders about these programs.

CLOs.

Computer loan origination systems, or CLOs, are computer terminals sometimes available in real estate offices or other locations to help you sort through the various types of loans offered by different lenders. The CLO operator may charge a fee for the services the CLO offers. This fee may be paid by you or by the lender that you select.

Types of Loans.

Loans can have a fixed interest rate or a variable interest rate. Fixed rate loans have the same principal and interest payments during the loan term. Variable rate loans can have any one of a number of "indexes" and "margins" which determine how and when the rate and payment amount change. If you apply for a variable rate loan, also known as an adjustable rate mortgage ("ARM"), a disclosure and booklet required by the Truth in Lending Act will further describe the ARM. Most loans can be repaid over a term of 30 years or less. Most loans have equal monthly payments. The amounts can change from time to time on an ARM depending on

changes in the interest rate. Some loans have short terms and a large final payment called a "balloon." You should shop for the type of home mortgage loan terms that best suit your needs.

Interest Rate, "Points" &

Often the price of a home mortgage loan is stated in terms of an interest rate, points, and other fees. A "point" is a fee that equals 1 percent of the loan amount. Points are usually paid to the lender, mortgage broker, or both, at the settlement or upon the completion of the escrow. Often, you can pay fewer points in exchange for a higher interest rate or more points for a lower rate. Ask your lender or mortgage broker about points and other fees.

A document called the Truth in Lending Disclosure Statement will show you the "Annual Percentage Rate" ("APR") and other payment information for the loan you have applied for The APR takes into account not only the interest rate, but also the points, mortgage broker fees and certain other fees that you have to pay. Ask for the APR before you apply to help you shop for the loan that is best for you. Also ask if your loan will have a charge or a fee for paying all or part of the loan before payment is due ("prepayment penalty"). You may be able to negotiate the terms of the prepayment penalty.

Lender-Required Settlement Costs.

Your lender may require you to obtain certain settlement services, such as a new survey. mortgage insurance or title insurance. It may also order and charge you for other settlementrelated services, such as the appraisal or credit report. A lender may also charge other fees, such as fees for loan process ing, document preparation, underwriting, flood certification or an application fee. You may wish to ask for an estimate of fees and settlement costs before choosing a lender. Some lenders offer "no cost" or "no point" loans but normally cover these fees or costs by charging a higher interest rate.

Comparing Loan Costs.

Comparing APRs may be an effective way to shop for a loan. However, you must compare similar loan products for the same loan amount. Before you decide on a loan, you should consider the up-front cash you will be required to pay for each of the two loans as well.

Another effective shopping technique is to compare identical loans with different un-front points and other fees. Your individual situation (how long you plan to stay in your house) and your tax situation (points can



usually be deducted for the tax year that you purchase a house) may affect your choice of loans.

Lock-ins.

"Locking in" your rate or points at the time of application or during the processing of your loan will keep the rate and/or points from changing until settlement or closing of the escrow process. Ask your lender if there is a fee to lock-in the rate and whether the fee reduces the amount you have to pay for points. Find out how long the lock-in is good, what happens if it expires, and whether the lockin fee is refundable if your application is rejected.

Tax and Insurance Payments.

Your monthly mortgage payment will be used to repay the money you borrowed plus interest. Part of your monthly payment may be deposited into an "escrow account" (also known as a "reserve" or "impound" account) so your lender or servicer can pay your real estate taxes, property insurance, mortgage insurance and/or flood insurance. Ask your lender or mortgage broker if you will be required to set up an escrow or impound account for taxes and insurance payments.

Transfer of Your Loan. While you may start the loan process with a lender or mortgage broker, you could find that after settlement another company may be collecting the payments on your loan. Collecting loan payments is often known as "servicing" the loan. Your

lender or broker will disclose whether it expects to service your loan or to transfer the servicing to someone else.

Mortgage Insurance.

Private mortgage insurance and government mortgage insurance protect the lender against default and enable the lender to make a loan which the lender considers a higher risk. Lenders often require mortgage insurance for loans where the downpayment is less than 20 percent of the sales price. You may be billed monthly, annually, by an initial lump sum, or some combination of these practices for your mortgage insurance premium. Ask your lender if mortgage insurance is required and how much it will cost. Mortgage insurance should not be confused with mortgage life, credit life or disability insurance, which are designed to pay off a mortgage in the event of the borrower's death or disability.

You may also be offered "lender paid" mortgage insurance ("LPMI"). Under LPMI plans, the lender purchases the mortgage insurance and pays the premiums to the insurer. The lender will increase your interest rate to pay for the premiums -- but LPMI may reduce your settlement costs. You cannot cancel LPMI or government mortgage insurance during the life of your loan. However, it may be possible to cancel private mortgage insurance at some point, such as when your loan balance is reduced to a certain amount. Before you commit to paying for mortgage insurance, find out the specific requirements for cancellation.

Flood Hazard Areas.

Most lenders will not lend you money to buy a home in a flood hazard area unless you pay for flood insurance. Some government loan programs will not allow you to purchase a home that is located in a flood hazard area. Your lender may charge you a fee to check for flood hazards. You should be notified if flood insurance is required. If a change in flood insurance maps brings your home within a flood hazard area after your loan is made, your lender or servicer may require you to buy flood insurance at that time.

Steps to buying a home

Buying your home is an exciting experience and it may be the largest financial investment you will ever make. Taking the time to learn about the steps involved in the buying process will help ensure that you purchase a quality home at a price you can afford. There are seven basic steps to buying a home:

Step 1. Prepare for home ownership

- Begin by seeking homebuyer education. You can contact The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to find an approved provider of homebuyer education in your area. Visit the HUD website or call 800-569-4287.
- Monitor your credit record. Get a free copy of your credit report and if necessary, take steps to improve your credit score. Generally, a higher credit score will qualify you for a lower interest rate.
- · Figure out what you can afford. It will save you time, energy, and money if you have a realistic picture of what you need and how much you can afford before you start shopping for a home.
- Choose the type of home that fits your lifestyle, in a location that has the amenities and community services that you want.
- Know your rights. You have the right to equal housing opportunities; disclosure of settlement costs; and protection from predatory lending practices. Take the time to know your rights before you start shopping for a home and a loan.

Step 2. Shop for a Loan

- Comparison shop. Gather all the information you need to complete the mortgage loan application. Then compare the different types of mortgages that each lender offers and the tradeoffs associated with each option. You may want to create a comparison chart to record and compare the terms of different loans and lenders.
- You can avoid paying for private mortgage insurance if you have a down payment that equals at least 20 percent of the purchase price.
- · Learn about home buying programs in your state that can lower your costs and mortgage payment.
- Get pre-qualified for a loan. When you are ready to make an offer, you will be in a better position to have your offer accepted if you are prequalified or preapproved for a loan.

Step 3. Shop for a home

. Know your housing priorities, including the type of structure, size, location, and community services that are important to you.

- Decide whether you want to use the services of a realtor. Realtors are familiar with the housing market and can assist you in finding the house that meets your needs. The seller generally pays the realtor's commission to help sell the property, which means that the realtor will try to get the best sales price and terms for the seller. To get the best outcome for yourself, you may want to hire your own realtor to represent your interests as the buyer.
- Know housing market trends before you start looking for a home. In a buyer's market, there are a lot of homes for sale, with relatively few buyers, so sellers have to offer potential buyers additional incentives. In a seller's market, there are a lot of buyers and relatively few homes, so sellers are likely to drive a hard bargain, and the home you want may be sold before you have a chance to make the offer.

Step 4. Make an offer

- Make an offer that is realistic. Offers are usually conditional on the home inspection (see step 5), appraisal, having a clear title, and final approval of the loan.
- Provide an earnest money deposit. The earnest money deposit lets the seller know that you are serious about wanting to purchase the home. In most cases, if you retract your offer, the seller keeps
- Get pre-approved for a loan to give yourself a stronger negotiating position.
- Negotiate the deal. When you make an offer, the interested seller usually will negotiate back and forth with you until you reach a joint agreement. Every point in the contract is negotiable, but it is usually best to know common practices and accepted standards in the negotiation of the contract before you start the process.

Step 5. Get a home inspection

- · A home inspection report provides an in-depth and impartial evaluation of any problems with the property. Your realtor and lender will have suggestions regarding who to use. The charge for the inspection will be added to your closing costs unless the seller has agreed to pay for the report.
- When you make a written offer on a home, you need to insist that the contract state that the offer is contingent on a home inspection conducted by a qualified inspector.
- If you are satisfied with the results of the inspection. then your offer can proceed, but be sure to negotiate and include, in writing, any financial adjustments, repairs or replacements that

the seller agrees to make as a result of issues identified in the inspection report.

Step 6. Get homeowners insurance

- · Learn what is covered by homeowner's insurance and what type of policy to purchase.
- Shop for a policy. Remember to consider flood and earthquake insurance if appropriate.
- Know how to read the policy and file a claim.

Step 7. Close the deal

- The final step in the home buying process is called the "closing" or "settlement." The closing usually takes place using the services of a settlement agent who oversees the transfer of the property from the seller to the buver.
- Prior to closing, you need to secure the services of a title company. The title company provides you with title insurance and often serves as the settlement agent. Title insurance protects you and the lender from claims by others against your new home.
- The settlement agent will set up escrow to manage the transfer of the property. All documents, deeds, titles, funds and conditions of the sale are collected in escrow and monitored by the settlement agent. When all of the conditions specified in escrow agreement have been met, you and the seller will be instructed to make an appointment to sign the paperwork that will finalize the closing.
- Before you go to the closing, understand the Real Estate Settlement Procedures Act (RESPA) and the protections that it offers you. Lenders are required to give you paperwork that outlines the costs you will incur in receiving the loan. These documents include the charges you will likely pay at closing and an estimate of your monthly mortgage payments, a Settlement Statement that details all closing costs, and a Truth-in-Lending Statement that outlines all of the specifics of the loan.
- Prepare ahead for closing day. At closing, you will sign numerous papers that make the sale final. Make sure that you have a good idea of what the settlement costs should be so that you can check the paperwork for errors before you sign. You will be required to bring picture ID and a cashier's check to cover the closing costs.
- The transaction is recorded with the county within a day or two of closing. After the recording, you will be given the keys to your new


What is the first step in buying a home once you've found a house that you want to buy?

A home buyer makes an offer on a house, generally by submitting a purchase and sale agreement through a real estate sales professional, who is required by law to give it to the seller.

The elements that potential home buyers should consider in preparing their offer include the market value of the home, any special circumstances surrounding the sale of the home, how much they can afford to pay,

and the condition of the home.

Make sure that the offer price also reflects any needed repairs to the house and any special contingencies, such as results of a home inspection and obtaining



Who is responsible for repairs during a home sale?

Many questions arise during the home-buying process. Buyers looking at homes that require a good deal of TLC may wonder who is responsible for the home's repairs, particularly if such repairs are needed to secure a certificate of occupancy. Depending on the situation, there is no clear-cut answer.

There is no perfect home, and things that are acceptable to the current owner may not be acceptable to the buyer who is looking to become the next owner. The home-buying process is typically a careful cooperation between buyer and seller to find a middle ground. The buyer may have to make some concessions, as will the seller. Ultimately, it is this cooperation that often determines if the sale goes through or is terminated.

Before any negotiations can begin regarding repairs, it is adviseable for a buyer to have an independent inspector come out and look over the home and property. Most real estate agents will suggest this be done as a first priority — even before a contract is entered on the home. An inspection will unveil any potential problems in a home and indicate things that the buyer may not be aware of, including items that do not meet with code or could be unsafe. An inspector also may point out problems that could cause a mortgage lender to give pause. This may mean the lender will deem problems unsafe and refuse to fund the mortgage until repairs are made.

A copy of this inspection report should be sent to the home seller to review with his or her attorney and real estate agent. The buyer working with his own real estate attorney and agent can petition for certain repairs to be made. Many sellers will make such repairs to ensure the purchase goes through, or they will accept a lower purchase price to compensate for the needed repairs, which the buyer will then make. Buyers might want to hire a good real estate attorney to write clauses into the contract to protect their interests. This allows the buyer to forfeit the sale and walk away from the

contract should an issue arise.

The rules often change when buying a home that is a short sale or in foreclosure. A home that is in distress is typically in this situation because the current owners cannot afford to pay their mortgage, and thusly, are not able to afford repairs. According to Think Glink, a money-management Website, buyers may try to negotiate repairs with the seller, but they shouldn't assume that sellers (or lenders in the event of a bank-owned home) are responsible for the repairs. Generally speaking, most short sales and foreclosures are sold "as is" and may even specify that repairs and requirements for the certificate of occupancy are the buyer's responsibility. A buyer also can ask to have the home price reduced to cover the repairs. But foreclosures are often already deeply

Buyers should know that, for a home that is not in foreclosure, there are some repairs that should ultimately be the responsibility of the seller. If these repairs are not made, a buyer should think strongly about walking away from the deal, according to Why6Percent.com, a real estate marketing site. Such repairs include:

- · lender-required repairs that could impact home safety
- · leaky pipes
- water penetration issues, including a bad roof
- unsafe decking or handrails
- · wet basements or crawl spaces
- insecure foundations or obvious structural damage
- poorly functioning sewer lines or septic system

It is always adviseable for buyers to speak with a reliable real estate attorney and a trusted real estate agent to guide them through the process of buying a home. These people can help buyers navigate the important decisions that can affect the home they'll be living in for the next several years.



Home buyers may be able to negotiate that sellers repair major structural issues, such as a leaky roof. If not, negotiate a lower sale price.

Ten important questions to ask your home inspector

1. What does your inspection cover?

The inspector should ensure that their inspection and inspection report will meet all applicable requirements in your state if applicable and will comply with a well-recognized standard of practice and code of ethics. You should be able to request and see a copy of these items ahead of time and ask any questions you may have. If there are any areas you want to make sure are inspected, be sure to identify them upfront.

2. How long have you been practicing in the home inspection profession and how many inspections have you completed?

The inspector should be able to provide his or her history in the profession and perhaps even a few names as referrals. Newer inspectors can be very qualified, and many work with a partner or have access to more experienced inspectors to assist them in the inspection.

3. Are you specifically experienced in residential inspection?

Related experience in construction or engineering is helpful, but is no substitute for training and experience in the unique discipline of home inspection. If the inspection is for a commercial property, then this should be asked about as well.

4. Do you offer to do repairs or improvements based on the

Some inspector associations and state regulations allow the inspector to perform repair work on problems uncovered in the inspection. Other associations and regulations strictly forbid this as a conflict of interest.

5. How long will the inspection take?

The average on-site inspection time for a single inspector is two to three hours for a typical single-family house; anything significantly less may not be enough time to perform a thorough inspection. Additional inspectors may be brought in for very large properties

6. How much will it cost?

Costs vary dramatically, depending on the region, size and age of the house, scope of services and other factors. A typical range might be \$300-\$500, but consider the value of the home inspection in

terms of the investment being made. Cost does not necessarily reflect quality. HUD Does not regulate home inspection fees.

7. What type of inspection report do you provide and how long will it take to receive the report?

Ask to see samples and determine whether or not you can understand the inspector's reporting style and if the time parameters fulfill your needs. Most inspectors provide their full report within 24 hours of the inspection.

8. Will I be able to attend the inspection?

This is a valuable educational opportunity, and an inspector's refusal to allow this should raise a red flag. Never pass up this opportunity to see your prospective home through the eyes of

9. Do you maintain membership in a professional home inspector association?

There are many state and national associations for home inspectors. Request to see their membership ID, and perform whatever due diligence you deem appropriate.

10. Do you participate in continuing education programs to keep your expertise up to date?

One can never know it all, and the inspector's commitment to continuing education is a good measure of his or her professionalism and service to the consumer. This is especially important in cases where the home is much older or includes unique elements requiring additional or updated training.
